Achieving & sustaining high growth is main agenda of India: President

Wellington, Apr 30
President Shri Pranab Mukherjee has said that achieving and sustaining high growth is the main agenda of India. In an interview to The New Zealand Herald, Shri Mukherjee said, growing consistently at around eight per cent will help India double its GDP in nine years. He said, his government has launched a number of initiatives such as Make in India and improving ease of doing business which is boosting country's growth. He said India has adopted a comprehensive growth-promoting reform agenda to deal with the variety of challenges confronted by India. Talking about India-New Zealand relations, the



President said, people-to-people contacts have flourished since many years. He said connectivity remains an issue but will be addressed to an extent with the planned signing Air Service Agreement between the two countries. Asked what benefits would India get from increased ties or trade with New Zealand, Shri Mukherjee said, New Zealand has strong expertise in areas such as agriculture, food processing, high-end manufacturing which is of

interest to India. He said tourism and education sectors also have significant strengths which could benefit India. Terming poverty as the most important challenge before India, the President said his government is focusing on those who need the basic necessities of life most urgently. He said India has had significantly accomplishment in reducing poverty and employment generation is critical to achieve lasting reduction in poverty. Saying that India's vibrant democracy, youth and decentralized political system are the major assets, Shri Mukherjee said, it is India's democracy which allows such a large and diverse country to be managed and kept together. Counting tackling of corruption as one of the big achievement of India during the last two years, Shri Mukherjee said, government has transparently auctioned major public assets such as coal and spectrum.

This will help curb the duplicate PAN allotments. He said addition of mother's name in the PAN database will also help in identifying duplicate PAN cards.

New Delhi, Apr 30
The Centre has decided to raise the strength of the Border Security Force, BSF, by adding 29 additional battalions. The process of raising these battalions has been completed. The Central Reserve Police Force, CRPF, will also have 38 additional battalions in a phased manner.

Indian women recurve team have set up a gold medal clash with Chinese Taipei in the first stage of Archery World Cup. At the Yuanshen Stadium in Shanghai yesterday, the trio of Deepika Kumari, Laishram Bombayla Devi and Laxmirani Majhi shocked top seed Germany 5-3 in the semi-final. Seventh seed Chinese Taipei thrashed higher-ranked Russia 6-0 in the other semifinal. India also remained in



medal hunt in the men's team and mixed pair in the recurve section. The recurve men's team of Atanu Das, Jayanta Talukdar and Mangal Singh Champia were pipped by second-seed Netherlands 5-4 in the shoot off 28-30 in the semi-finals.

New Delhi, Apr 30
Celebrated shooter Abhinav Bindra has been roped in as goodwill ambassador of India's Olympic contingent alongside Bollywood star Salman Khan. India's first and only individual Olympic gold-medallist Bindra said he received IOA's invitation yesterday and immediately agreed for the role. Bindra said, while his focus would be to perform at Rio, he will be writing to all the Olympics-bound athletes to motivate them. The rifle shooter, who is also a former World Championships gold-medallist,



will be competing in the Rio Games. IOA has also approached Sachin Tendulkar and Oscar-winning music composer AR Rahman with a similar offer. Both Tendulkar and Rahman, however, are yet to respond to the IOA's offer.

abusive slogans and threatened the Medical Officer with intend to deter her from duty and put pressure on her to admit the above person. On the basis of the written complaint of the Medical Officer an NCFIR vide No.10/16 dated 24.04.2016 U/s 189/34 IPC has been chalked out at PS Kadamtala against all of them. Thereafter, on the same day in the evening at 1845 hrs again the above said group restrained the Pradhan, Gram Panchayat Kadamtala wrongfully and assaulted him while he was proceeding to market and threatened him to dire consequences. On the basis his complaint, a case vide crime no.16/16 dated 24.04.2016 U/s 147/149/341/506 IPC has been registered against 7 persons at PS Kadamtala. Thereafter, on apprehension of breach of peace and tranquility after their release, the above 7 persons were again arrested U/s 107/151 Cr. PC and produced before the SDM where they have executed bond for a period 1 year for maintaining good behavior, the release added. The SP, in the release, has further mentioned that most of the persons are suspects in the fire incident case and their ulterior motive is to malign the image of Pradhan and to distract the mind of Police from the investigation of the vehicle burnt case. The allegation leveled against Police is totally baseless, concocted and motivated, he added.
