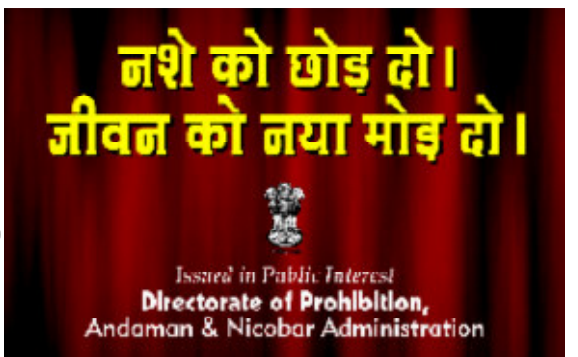

8th Meeting of A&N State Planning Board held

Action Plan 2017-18 for Rs 4263.28 crores approved

Vision 2030, strategy upto 2024 and 3 years Action Plan upto 2020 also passed

Port Blair, May 31

The 8th meeting of the Andaman & Nicobar State Planning Board (ANSPB) was held in the conference hall of Megapode Resort here today, under the chairmanship of the Lt. Governor, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, who is also the Chairman of A&N State Planning Board. During the meeting, the Vision-2030, 7-year Strategy upto 2024 and three year Action Plan 2017-2020 for sustainable and equitable development of Andaman and Nicobar Islands was approved. The meeting was attended among others, by the Member of Parliament, Shri. Bishnu Pada Ray, Chief Secretary, Shri. Anindo Majumdar, Adhyaksh Zilla Parishad (South Andaman), Shri. Jaydeep Kumar Dey, Adhyaksh (North & Middle Andaman), Shri. Saw Tathu, Chairperson (PBMC), Shri. B. Eswar Rao, Chairperson (Social Welfare Advisory Board), Dr. Poonam Arora, Principal Secretary (Planning-Member Secretary (ANSPB), Shri. Raajiv Yaduvanshi and senior officers of the Administration.

Addressing the gathering, the Lt. Governor said the feasibility of the proposals and plans formulated and presented by the respective Heads of Departments will be looked into for implementation. He also exhorted the Officers to work with honesty and utmost commitment in realizing the plans laid out by each Department. Expressing satisfaction over the development taking place in A&N Islands and in achieving the targets, the Lt. Governor remarked that A&N Islands have made remarkable progress in various sectors and is No. 1 in achieving the targets, for which, we should be proud of. He lauded the Officers of the Administration for their concerted efforts in this regard and hailed the level of awareness among the PRI representatives.

The Member of Parliament, Chairperson, DPC (South Andaman), Chairperson, DPC (North & Middle Andaman), Chairperson (PBMC), Chairperson (SWAB) and Chairperson, DPC (Nicobar) gave their valuable suggestions/views for inclusion in the document during the sectoral presentation. The suggestions include grant of fund for back log works of PRIs, starting of medical ship to cater to the needs of far flung needy patients, construction and maintenance of rural roads under PMGSY-II, establishment of Jal Board for better management of drinking water, construction of sea wall at different parts of the Islands, up-gradation of ports and jetties, improvement in level of education especially in Maths, English & Science as well as infrastructure up-gradation, prevention of banks erosion, compensation to PBMC on loss of octroi, shortage of staff in Zilla Parishad Offices, strengthening of CSCs, increase in the number of seats in the chartered flights, especially the chartered flight between Port Blair and Vizag.

Secretaries of major departments viz. Shipping, Port Management Board, Rural Development & Panchayat,



APWD, Power, Forest, Information Technology, Health, Education, Police, Tourism, Social Welfare, Civil Aviation & Transport, etc. gave Power Point presentation on the sectoral Vision, Strategy and Action Plan for their Departments.

Earlier, the Member Secretary welcomed the august body and briefed about the process of the making of the Vision, Strategy, Action Plan and financial outlays in his Power Point presentation. The Government of India has discontinued the system of Five Year Plans & Annual Plans and distinction of Plan and Non-Plan. The Government of India has adopted a new system i.e. Vision, Strategy and Action in view of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to be attained by 2030.

The NITI Aayog has advised the Administration to prepare Vision, Strategy, Action Plan for Andaman and Nicobar Islands with effect from 2017-18. The A & N Administration has taken proactive steps to introduce the new system of preparation of developmental plan in the Islands. Andaman and Nicobar Administration is following decentralized planning, thus the Administration has all the local bodies to participate in the exercise of formulation of the documents for bringing out a realistic development plan keeping in view the Prime Minister's vision of 'Sabka Saat Sabka Vikas'.

Gram Sabha, meeting of Panchayat Samitis, Zilla Parishads, Island Tribal Councils and Municipal Council were convened for prioritising the local requirement for inclusion in Vision, Strategy & Action Plan of local bodies and line departments. District level documents so prepared were placed before the District Planning Committees (DPCs) of their respective districts for deliberations and recommendations. The consolidation of the three district level documents has been placed before the A & N State Planning Board in

the meeting.

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration concluded the meeting by expressing with thanks to all members who participated in the meeting and for their valuable contributions for improving the documents. The Chief Secretary assured the board that the suggestions have been taken note off and will be examined & implemented in letter and spirit.

The Board under the chairmanship of the Lt. Governor has approved the Vision, Strategy and Action Plan with the suggestions offered by the members. Sectoral outlay of `4263.28 Crores for the 2017-18 as proposed in the Action Plan 2017-18 has also been approved by the Board.

Such presence of crocodiles in the flooded areas increases the chance of man-animal conflict. So, in order to avert such untoward incident in future, the general public have been requested to stay away from the flooded areas and not to set off their domestic animals on free grazing. The poultry/meat shop owners/ general public have also been requested not to dispose-off animal waste/ dead animals in the nallahs/ creeks as it would attract crocodiles and subsequently it may become permanent resident of the crocodiles.

'Super-Earth' found 21 light years away may host alien life

New York, May 31

Scientists have discovered a potentially habitable Earth-like planet, located just 21 light years away, that may host liquid water on its surface.

US Scientists found that the planet, with a mass between two and three times the Earth, resides at the edge of the habitable zone of its host star Gliese 625.

They said, the discovered planet is a relatively cool star, the planet is situated at the edge of its habitability zone, in which liquid water can exist on its surface.

Researchers said, this is the sixth super-Earth closest to our solar system in the habitability zone or in goldilocks zone of its star. Goldilocks zone refers distance of a planet from a star means the planet is neither too hot, nor too cold to support liquid water, which is a key ingredient for life.

Astronomers are searching for rocky planets like ours in the Goldilocks zones of other stars. Only few rocky planets have been discovered around nearby stars.

Workshop on Cyber Security & ISO 27001:2013 implementation held

Participants briefed about different cyber threats & its impact in today's digital world

Port Blair, May 31

Cyber Security is becoming increasingly important in today's networked world and is impacting every aspect of society including finance, healthcare, government, education, arts and entertainment. The Internet connects people, systems and galaxy of networks and an effort is required to protect digital systems from online threats as we defend our bodies from illness.

With an objective to bring awareness about the basic

principles of cyber security, inherent vulnerabilities and emerging threats associated with global Internet connectivity and information and communication technology, a workshop on Cyber Security and Implementation of ISO 27001:2013 was conducted by Department of IT and SOVTECH yesterday at the Conference Hall of Directorate of Industries here. About 47 Officials from 10 Departments of A & N Administration participated in the

workshop which was conducted in two sessions. Experts from Ernst & Young LLP facilitated the workshop and sensitized the participants about the current Cyber Security scenario and Implementation of Information Security Management System. Participants were briefed about different cyber threats and its impact in today's digital world. Emphasis was given on how the threats and attacks can impact at

individual, organisational and country level. The officials were also made aware of the counter measures and way forward to secure the cyber ecosystem. Information on different attacks such as social engineering, ransomware, industrial control systems and phishing were demonstrated through videos. The session was followed by question & answer session and assessment, a communication received here said.

BHIM (Bharat Interface for Money)

BHIM (Bharat Interface for Money) is a Mobile App developed by National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), based on the Unified Payment Interface (UPI). It was launched by Narendra Modi, the Prime Minister of India, at a Digi Dhan mela at Talkatora Stadium in New Delhi on 30 December 2016. It has been named after Dr. Bhimrao R. Ambedkar and is intended to facilitate e-payments directly through banks and as part of the 2016 Indian banknote demonetisation and drive towards cashless transactions.

This UPI app supports all Indian banks which use that platform, which is built over the Immediate Payment Service infrastructure and allows the user to instantly transfer money between the bank accounts of any two parties. It can be used on all mobile devices.

Benefits

BHIM allow users to send or receive money to other UPI payment addresses or scanning QR code or account number with IFSC code or MMID (Mobile Money Identifier) Code to users who do not have a UPI-based bank account. BHIM allows users to check current balance in their bank accounts and to choose which bank account to use for conducting transactions, although only one can be active at any time.

Users can create their own QR code for a fixed amount of money, which is helpful in merchant - seller - buyer transactions.[citation needed] They can



also have more than one payment address.

If the 12-digit Aadhaar is listed as a payment ID on the BHIM app will not require any biometric authentication or prior registration with the bank or Unified Payment Interface (UPI).

Version 1.3 allows the user to use mobile numbers from their contact book to send money and also save payment addresses for future use without needing to type the address again. User can also check the Previous Transaction History by Tapping Transaction Box. Here only the transaction through BHIM shown. At present, the upper limit per UPI transaction is Rs. 1 Lakh.

Kohli, Dhoni, Yuvraj, Raina in list of top 100 athletes



Mumbai, May 31
 India captain Virat Kohli, former skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni and stylish left-handed batsmen, Yuvraj Singh and Suresh Raina, have found places in this year's ESPN World Fame 100 list that made its debut last year.

While Kohli is placed in the 13th spot and Dhoni in the 15th, Yuvraj and Raina have been ranked 90th and 95th respectively, said a media release here on Wednesday. The list is ESPN's ranking of the 100 most famous active athletes in the world.

Heading the list is top Portuguese footballer Cristiano Ronaldo while NBA great LeBron James, another soccer star Lionel Messi and tennis ace Roger Federer are

the top four athletes, in that order. The others in the top ten are: Phil Mickelson, Neymar, Usain Bolt, Kevin Durant, Rafael Nadal and Tiger Woods.

The ranking is based on a formula devised by ESPN director of sports analytics Ben Alamar, which combines endorsements, social media reach and other data to create a comparative ranking system, the media release explained. In February, 28-year-old Kohli joined the likes of Bolt, Rickie Fowler and Thierry Henry as a Puma endorser and his eight-year deal with the shoe company is worth more than 100 crore rupees, the largest ever for an Indian athlete, the release said.

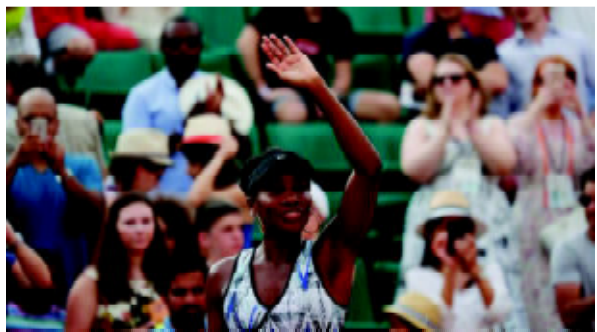

Venus Williams enters round three with straight sets win over Kurumi Nara

Paris, May 31
 With superstar sister Serena away pregnant, it was left to 36-year-old Venus to carry the standard for the Williams family at Roland Garros on Wednesday, with a second-round thumping of Japan's Kurumi Nara. Seeded 10th here, Williams ground her Japanese opponent into the red Parisian dust in a contest that at times almost veered into miss-match territory before ending 6-3 6-1.

Williams never appeared extended on the Philippe Chatrier court, but she nevertheless delivered a display of exquisite shot-making to a crowd denied a real contest. Punching her black and lime-green racquet through the ball, Williams cleaned the lines with her groundstrokes, sending Nara scampering all round the arena.

"You know, it's always a joy when you can control the match," she smiled afterwards. "That always feels good." The win makes her the oldest



woman to reach the third round at the French Open since Billie-Jean King in 1982.

Next up is either Dutch qualifier Richel Hogenkamp or Belgian Elise Mertens.

BCCI invites bid for IPL title sponsorship

New Delhi, May 31
 The Board of Control for Cricket in India has invited applications to tender process from parties to bid for the title sponsorship rights of its cash-cow, Indian Premier League, starting August 1 and ending on July 31, 2022. The ITT will be available at a cost of Rs. 3 lakh on non-refundable basis from June 1 to 21 at the BCCI headquarters here and the bids need to be submitted at 12 noon on June 27 at a place specified in the document or at any other place as decided and intimated

by the Board. As per the ITT, issued as a newspaper advertisement by BCCI, the Board reserves the right at its discretion to cancel or amend the entire bidding process at any stage. Chinese mobile firm Vivo had bagged the title sponsorship right of the T20 League for a two-year period (2016 nd 2017), reportedly at a cost of Rs 100 crore per year, an upward rise of Rs 20 crore annually from what beverage giant Pepsi had paid through an earlier agreement beginning 2013.
