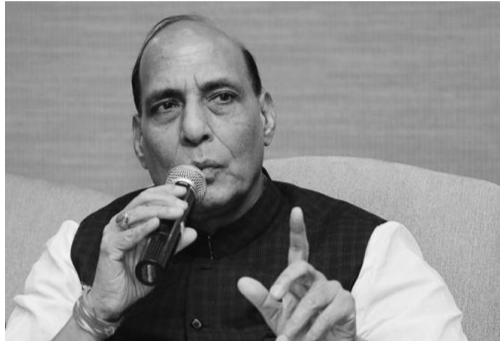

## Govt will do everything possible to prevent cross border terrorism: HM

New Delhi, July 31  
 Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh today asserted that the government will do everything possible to prevent cross border terrorism. Making a statement in the Lok Sabha on Monday's attack in Punjab, he said any effort by the enemies of our nation to undermine India's territorial integrity and security or imperil the safety and security of our citizens, will meet an effective and forceful response from our security forces. He said, the government has been and will remain resolute in this regard. Shri Singh made the statement amid din created by Congress members. The Home Minister assured the House that the government is firm to root out terrorism from



India. Giving details of the attack in Punjab, he said, preliminary analyses of GPS data indicates that the terrorists had infiltrated from Pakistan through the area near Tash in Gurdaspur district, where the Ravi river enters Pakistan. The Minister said, it is also suspected that the same terrorists had

planted five IEDs (Improvised Explosive Devices) on the railway track near Talwandi village between Dinanagar and Jhakoladi which were subsequently defused by the bomb disposal squad. Mr Singh also criticised the UPA government policy in tackling terror.

### Efforts on to include more hospitals under this scheme

Port Blair, July 31  
 The A&N Administration is making arrangements for bringing more hospitals like Dr. Agarwal's Eye Hospital Ltd, Chennai (Single Speciality) & Kaurvey Hospital, Chennai-(Multi Speciality Hospital), for a tie up with these hospitals under ANISHI Scheme. Efforts are also being made for empanelment of other multi-specialty hospitals located in Chennai or cities/towns around Chennai city. The Health Insurance Scheme named Andaman & Nicobar Islands Scheme for Health Insurance (ANISHI) which was launched here in January

this year for better treatment for the needy persons will provide coverage to those people who belong to BPL category of A&N Islands and pensioners settled in A&N Islands after retirement and their dependent family members & permanent residents with family income of less than Rs. 3 lakhs per annum. As per the referral system as specified under the scheme, the patient is to be referred by concerned specialist, thereafter they report with referral slip to the Nodal Cell (ANISHI), Directorate of Health Services along with Islanders ID/Voter card annual income certificate and ration card, as the case

may be. So far, four hospitals are empanelled under the ANISHI Scheme, namely, Medica Super Specialty Hospital, Kolkata-(Multi Speciality Hospital), JIPMER, Pondicherry-(Multi Speciality Hospital), Peerless Hospitex Hospital and Research Centre Ltd., Kolkata-4-(Multi Speciality Hospital) and Basavatarakan Indo-American, Cancer Hospital & Research Institute, Hyderabad-Single Speciality Hospital (Specialty in Cancer Care), a communication from the Director of Health Services said here today.

## Tribal Affairs Ministry revises the Scheme for Development of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups

New Delhi, July 31  
 Ministry of Tribal Affairs has revised the Central Sector Scheme known as "Development of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs)", w.e.f. 1st April, 2015, under which the Ministry will provide 100% financial assistance through State Governments for activities including housing, land distribution and land development, agricultural development, animal husbandry, construction of link roads, installation of

non-conventional sources of energy or other innovative activity, for the comprehensive socio-economic development of PVTGs, based on Conservation-cum-Development (CCD) Plan prepared by the concerned State Governments on the basis of assessment of their requirements. Under the Scheme, priority is accorded for their protection and improvement in terms of the social indicators like livelihood, health, nutrition

and education, so as to decrease their vulnerability. At present there are 75 tribal groups identified and categorized as Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs), (earlier known as Primitive Tribal Groups) located in the States/UT of AP, Bihar, Jharkhand, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, MP, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra, Manipur, Odisha, Rajasthan, TN, Tripura, UP, Uttarakhand, West-Bengal and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

### ANIIMS issues instructions

#### for candidates

Port Blair, July 31  
 The Andaman Nicobar Islands Pre-Medical Entrance Test-2015 (ANIPMT) for candidates seeking admission in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Institute of Medical Science (ANIIMS) in the Islands will be held on August 2, 2015. Altogether, 900 candidates will take the ANIPMT-2015 exam which will be held in two centers i.e JNRM College and Kendriya Vidyalaya No.1 at Port Blair. As per the instructions issued by the Director ANIIMS Maj. Gen. R.P. Choubey, the candidates have

to report at Examination Centre sharp at 9 AM on 02 Aug 2015. The dress of the candidates should be light colour, half sleeves, no head cover, no big buttons, no large earring, headpins and broach. Candidates have been asked to co-operate while frisking at the entry gate. They also have been directed not to carry any valuables, as they will be asked to leave it outside at their own risk. Accordingly, bell at 9.30 am will signify the entry of the candidates in the allotted hall/room while bell at 9.45am will signify seating at

their respective desk in allotted hall/room. The exam will start sharp at 10 AM. Bell would be played at 11.30am (halfway and again 10 minutes before completion) and 12.50 pm. Candidates will be asked to stop writing at the final bell sharp at 1PM. Further, the candidates have been advised not to carry any stationary items like pen, pencil, textual materials (printed or hand written), bits of paper, watch, wallet, purse, belt, water bottles, calculators, electronic devices like cell phones, blue tooth, etc. (Contd. on last page)

 A State level media sensitization workshop for introduction of Pentavalent and Inactivated Poliovirus Vaccines (IPV) in Andaman & Nicobar Islands under routine immunization was organised at GB Pant auditorium here today. Briefing the media persons, the Director Health Services, (Dr. Smt. Shipra Paul informed that the Health Department under the guidance of the Health Ministry, Govt of India, is introducing these vaccines for

children. Pentavalent is a vaccine that contains five antigens (diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, hepatitis-B and Haemophilus influenzae type b). Three doses of pentavalent vaccine are to be provided at 6, 10 & 14 weeks of age, the DHS added.

**Beijing awarded 2022 Winter Olympics**

Kulalumpur, July 31  
Beijing was chosen by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to host the 2022 Winter Olympics on Friday, becoming the first city to be awarded both summer and winter Games. The Chinese capital beat Almaty, Kazakhstan in a secret ballot of 85 IOC members, held at a convention centre in downtown Kuala Lumpur. The ballot was conducted twice, first electronically and then by paper after it was discovered the electronic system had malfunctioned. Despite concerns about a lack of natural snow in the city's distant mountains, and protests from human rights groups, Beijing had been the clear favourite to win the vote after it successfully hosted the 2008 Summer Olympics.

The high-powered Chinese delegation assured IOC members that Beijing was the safe choice because it had already proved it could stage the Games and said it would take winter sports into the backyard of the world's most populated country. The bid team from Almaty tugged at the IOC's heartstrings, urging the committee, which includes sports administrators, captains of industry and even royalty, to

resist the temptation to go back to China and instead send a positive message to smaller developing countries that they too could host the world's greatest sporting events. Kazakhstan Prime Minister Karim Massimov delivered a powerful, moving speech, but the IOC, grappling with the effects of a global economic crisis and facing dwindling interest from countries wanting to host the Olympics, opted for Beijing.

**BCCI to not allow WAGs on Sri Lanka tour, Ravi Shastri to join late**

New Delhi: Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) will not allow Indian cricketers to take their wives and girlfriends (WAGs) along during the Sri Lanka tour next month. "Most of the players on tour are just coming off a month-long break where they had enough time to spend with their families. And we've decided their wives will not be allowed on tour," a top BCCI official was quoted as saying by the Indian Express newspaper. Also team India director Ravi Shastri will not join the team till the eve of the 1st Test on August 2012. Shastri had already informed BCCI about his absence in advance as he had signed a contract with an English

television channel for the Ashes series as an analyst. "Shastri will join the team a bit late as he is presently a pundit on a post-match show on Sky Sports for the Ashes series. He had informed the BCCI about it and as we finalised the BCCI itinerary a bit late, he had already taken permission to skip the early part", an official told the newspaper. Since the Indian board is yet to appoint a head coach for the national side, support staff of Bharat Arun, Sanjay Bangar and R Sridhar will be handed the responsibility of team management till Shastri is back from England. Virat Kohli and team will play a three-day warm up match in Colombo before the first Test in Galle.

**Swimming stars battle for world titles with eyes on Rio Olympics**

Kazan, July 31  
With one eye on Rio de Janeiro, swimming's stars begin the battle on Sunday for world championship medals in Kazan to prove their form heading into the 2016 Olympics. As ever, the USA bring a star-studded team to the Tatarstan capital, 800 kilometres east of Moscow, with marquee names including Olympic champions Missy Franklin, Katie Ledecky, Ryan Lochte and Nathan Adrian. Treble world record-holder Ledecky is the only American to top the 2015 world rankings in her events, with the year's best times in the 400m, 800m and 1,500m freestyle. Ledecky was responsible for breaking two of the six world records which fell in the Barcelona pool when the world championships were held last two years ago. Franklin won six gold medals in Barcelona, but has something to prove in Kazan after

failing to win an event at a Santa Clara meet in June -- her only world championships tuneup. Likewise Lochte, who has five Olympic titles and 15 long course world championship victories, is eager to bounce back from a 2014 he called "probably my worst year of swimming". The 30-year-old will be swimming at his sixth world championships and is looking for a fourth straight win in the 200m individual medley, but is taking nothing for granted. "There's a bunch of other people out there," Lochte said. "Just because they're not there doesn't mean it should be a shoo-in for me." The Australian challenge will be led by two defending world champions in freestyler Cate Campbell and breaststroker Christian Sprenger, who will resume his battle with South Africa's Cameron van der Burgh over 50m and 100m.

**James Anderson ruled out of fourth Test with muscle injury**

New Delhi, July 31  
England have suffered a major blow ahead of the third day's play in the ongoing third Ashes Test match against Australia at Edgbaston. James Anderson has suffered a suspected torn muscle in-between his ribs. Reports suggest that the premium fast bowler will miss the remainder of the third Test, as well as the fourth Test, due to a side strain.

Recalling Dr. Kalam's warmth and dedicated service to the nation, Shivam said, "He was a very hardworking, kind hearted, simple and a great human being. He has been a focussed man and dedicated all his life for this country". Having met him, I feel he had tremendous love and affection for the children, a passion for teaching and a motivational factor for the youth to do something good for the country, added Shivam. "Although he is no more, his thoughts and inspiration will remain etched in memory and continue to inspire me lifelong". Shivam is a student of class eight of Navy Children School, Port Blair and he has a passion for singing and playing musical instruments.

The Advantage of pentavalent vaccine is that it reduces injection pricks to child from 6 injections to 3 injections. It also helps in additional protection against Haemophilus influenzae b which causes pneumonia and meningitis in children, thus addressing under - 5 morbidity and mortality. The second vaccine which is being introduced is the Inactivated Poliovirus Vaccine (IPV). This vaccine consists of killed Polio Virus Stains of all three types of Poliovirus i.e., Poliovirus 1,2 & 3. The IPV is not Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV), it is only a prerequisite to tOPV and bOPV. The IPV will be introduced pan India in one go in the last week of August. This vaccine will be administered to child at the age of 3½ months. Both the vaccine will be administered to those children who will get registered henceforth. Those children who are already in the mid way of the immunization programme will have to continue with the existing immunization schedule. Earlier, the Deputy Director Health, Dr. Avijit Roy, explained in details about the new initiative through a visual presentation and answered queries of the media persons.
