



PM exhorts youth for innovation, experiment & entrepreneurship

New Delhi, July 31 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said, research and innovation are technology's soul and the government has taken many steps promoting innovation. Addressing 22nd edition of his 'Mann Ki Baat' on All India Radio, Shri Modi exhorted youth for innovation, experiment and entrepreneurship. He said, NITI Aayog is trying to promote Atal Innovation Mission in a big way. The Prime Minister said, Government has taken initiative of Atal Tinkering Labs for next generation innovators. Shri Modi said, schools which set up tinkering labs, will be given Rs.10 lakh each and another additional 10 lakh for maintenance. Saying incubation centre is directly related to innovation, Prime Minister laid emphasis on setting up new incubation centres. Shri Modi said, government has thought of



providing Rs. 10 crore to Atal Incubation Centres. He said, people should start finding out technological solutions to different problems. He urged the new generation to contribute more in research and innovation to build modern India which will be great tribute to late President Dr. A P J Abdul Kalam. Speaking on health issues, the Prime Minister asked people to prevent spread of dengue in this rainy season. He advised people not to take antibiotics without consulting

doctors. Shri Modi said, to reduce maternal mortality rate, government has launched a new campaign 'Pradhanmantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan'. He said state governments and centre are working closely to help the flood affected people. Prime Minister said, the CAMPA law passed by Parliament will provide 40 thousand crore rupees for the purpose of afforestation. Commending the efforts of states like Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh and Gujarat for their missions for afforestation, Prime

Minister urged people to make plantation a movement. Saying, the whole world is facing the problem of global warming and climate change, Shri Modi said, Indian epics like Bhagwad Gita and Mahabharat also mentions about the importance of plantation. Mentioning about Khandu Maruti Mahatre, a farmer from Pune, Shri Modi said, Mahatre distributed plants to his relatives and friends during his daughter's marriage. He reiterated that farmers should plant timbers near their ploughing fields. Speaking about his visit to South Africa and meeting the colleagues of Nelson Mandela, Shri Modi said, equality and equal opportunity is the biggest mantra for any society and Government. ISRO gearing up to launch INSAT-3DR by end of August

New Delhi, July 31 Scientists at the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) are gearing up for the launch of geostationary weather satellite INSAT-3DR sometime by the end of next month, a top official of the agency said on Sunday. "The GSLV (Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle) Mark II will carry the geostationary weather satellite INSAT-3DR. We are looking to launch it by end of next month," ISRO Satellite

Centre Director Mayilsami Annadurai told reporters on the sidelines of a function. The space agency had successfully launched INSAT-3D, a satellite aided search and rescue satellite, from French Guiana in 2013. ISRO made its last successful launch of 20 satellites, including its

Bhubaneswar, July 31 In Odisha, at least 40 people killed and around 35 injured due to lightning in different parts of the state. Of the 40 deceased, eight each are from Bhadrak and Balasore

New Delhi, July 31 Petrol price was on Sunday cut by Rs 1.42 a litre and diesel by Rs 2.01 per litre, the third reduction in rates this month on global cues. Petrol will cost Rs 61.09 a litre in Delhi from midnight

tonight as compared to Rs 62.51 a litre currently, said Indian Oil Corp, the nation's largest fuel retailer. Similarly, diesel will cost Rs 52.27 per litre as against Rs 54.28 currently.
