Govt should think of lessening burden of judiciary: PM

New Delhi, Oct 31 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said that government is the biggest litigant and it should think of lessening the burden of the judiciary by resolving disputes at administrative levels. Addressing the Golden Jubilee Celebrations of Delhi High Court, Shri Modi said, lawmakers should draft legislations in a manner where there is little scope for interpretation or

discrimination. He said, it will serve the interest of justice to the fullest extent. He also called for generating awareness about Alternate Dispute Resolution, ADR mechanism so that the burden on courts is minimised. He lauded the efforts of Delhi High Court in resolving large number of cases through ADR. He said, the judiciary should prepare a roadmap for next fifty years on the basis of

their experience of last 50 years of Delhi High Court. Remembering Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on his birth anniversary, Shri Modi said, instead of practicing law, the leader chose to fight for the cause of the nation. He said, the formation of All India Civil Service is one of Sardar Patel's biggest contribution to the nation. He welcomed the ongoing debates and discussions on the formation of All

India Judicial Service. Shri Modi said, the society's poor, downtrodden and deprived people must be brought into the judicial system. Acknowledging that it is a challenge, Shri Modi said, ways should be discovered to make it possible. He also spoke about taking the help of technology in making the system accessible and affordable for all. Chief

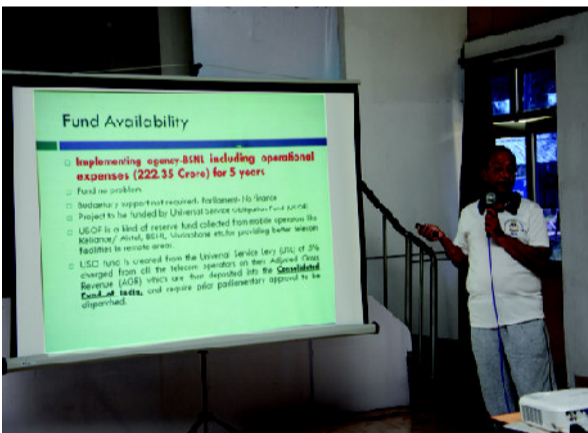
Awareness created on ill effects of tobacco products

India beat Pakistan 3-2, lifts Asian Champions Trophy

Kuantan, Malaysia, Oct 31
In Hockey, India has lifted the Men's Asian Champions Trophy. In a thrilling Final at Kuantan, Malaysia, India defeated arch-rivals and defending champions Pakistan, 3-2 to win the tournament for the second time. It had won the inaugural edition of the tournament in 2011. Rupinder Pal Singh, the tournament's leading goal scorer, took his tally to 11 when he opened the scoring. Afan Yousuf doubled the lead before Pakistan bounced back strongly with 2 goals. Nikkin Thimmaiah, then, broke the deadlock in the fourth and final quarter helping India to remain without a defeat in this competition. In the third-place match, hosts Malaysia defeated South Korea 3-1 in the penalty



shootout. The match went into shoot-out after both the teams were tied 1-1 at the end of regulation period. Over in the Women's section of the tournament, India came

back from a goal behind and defeated South Korea 2-1 in their second round-robin game. Rani and Deepika scored for India after Eeseul Baek had put the Koreans in front. India is

now at the top of the 5-nation table with 4 points. In the opener, the Indian eves were held by Japan, 2-2. Indian eves will play its next game against hosts Malaysia on Tuesday.

Bangladesh has defeated England by 108 runs in the Dhaka Test, to end the 2-match series all square. Resuming the third day at the overnight score of 152 for 3 in the second innings, the hosts were bundled out for 296 which gave England a target of 273. Chasing 273, the visitors got off to a flying start with a 100-run opening-wicket stand.

However, they suddenly lost way and from 100 for no loss, were skittled out for 164 with 2 days still to play. Spinner Mehedi Hasan Miraz, who took 6 wickets in the first innings, scapled another 6 in the second. Shakib Al Hasan bagged four. Miraz was adjudged man of the match as well as player of the series. England had won the first Test at Chittagong by 22 runs.
