Brisbane, Oct 31  
Heena Sidhu clinched the 10-metre air pistol gold medal to give India a perfect start at the Commonwealth Shooting Championships in Brisbane today.  
Sidhu shot a combined score of 626.2 to claim the top honours. This was Sidhu's second successive international gold after she along with Jitu Rai, claimed the top position in the 10-metre air pistol mixed team event in the ISSF World Cup Finals in Delhi earlier this month.  
Among other Indians, Deepak



Kumar won a bronze medal in the 10-metre air rifle event. medallist Gagan Narang finished fourth, while Ravikumar ended fifth.

**Bumrah hops to top in ICC T20 rankings**

New Delhi, Oct 31  
Indian fast bowler Jasprit Bumrah climbed to the number one spot in the latest ICC T20 rankings.  
Bumrah, who attained a career-best third position in ODI rankings on Monday, has regained the T20 top spot after Pakistan spinner Imad Wasim slipped one place below.  
Indian captain Virat Kohli, replaced AB de Villiers to claim the top ranking in ODIs yesterday. In the team rankings, New Zealand are the top-



ranked side in the shortest format with 125 points. India are placed fifth at 116 points. India will do Pakistan a huge favour if they defeat New Zealand in the upcoming series, as such a result will see their arch rivals top the standings.

**Asia Cup Hockey: India beat Malaysia 2-0**

Tokyo, Oct 31  
In women's Asia Cup Hockey, India defeated Malaysia 2-nil in its third and final match in Japan.

Earlier yesterday, Indian women had beaten China by 4-1. The team also beat Singapore by a huge margin of 10-1. Malaysia is in second place in the pool, while South Korea and Japan are leading
