National Anthem must be played in movie theatres: SC

New Delhi, Nov 30

The Supreme Court today directed that the national anthem be played in cinema halls across the country before the screening of a film and people in cinema halls should stand up when the anthem is played and the National Flag be shown on the screen at the time.

It said, there should not be any dramatisation of the anthem and it should not be printed or displayed on undesirable objects. The court also said, a person cannot take commercial benefits by playing the anthem.

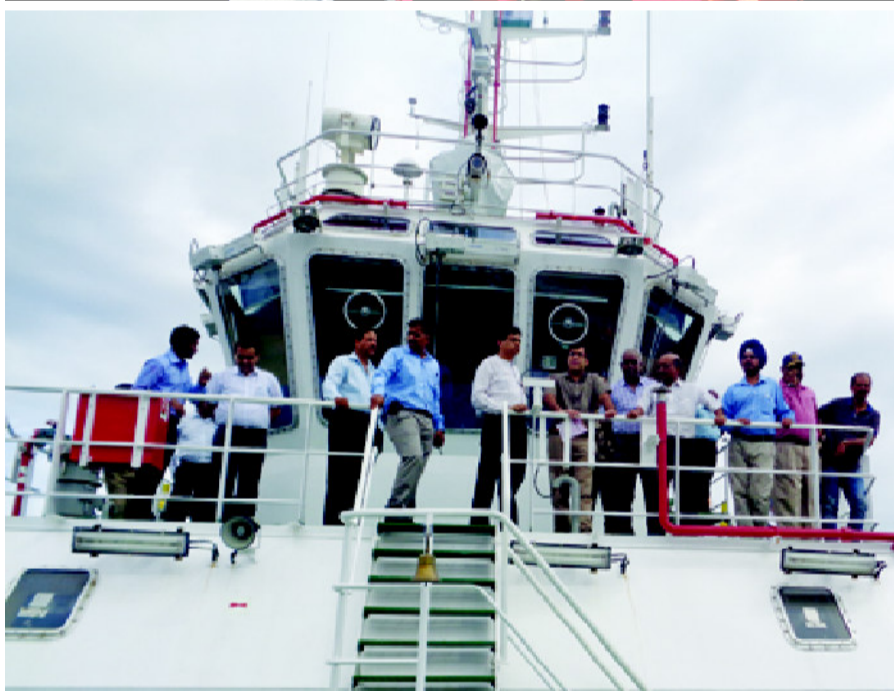
The apex court directed the Centre that the order should be given effect in a week's time and be circulated to all the States and Union Territories.

CS inaugurates newly acquired Tug MT Andaman

Port Blair, Nov. 30

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar and Chairman, Port Management Board inaugurated a newly acquired Tug- 'MT Andaman', at a simple function held at Phoenix Bay Jetty Stage-3 this morning. Shri Sanjeev Khirwar, Commissioner-cum-Secretary (Shipping), A & N Administration, Dr R D Tripathi, Chief Port Administrator, PMB, Comdt R K Vishwakarma, Harbour Master PMB also attended this ceremony.

This tug has been built at M/S TEBMA Shipyard Ltd. This is a highly manoeuvrable tug fitted with Steerable Rudder Propulsion (SRP) for efficiently performing harbour and towing operations. The tug is capable of delivering 35 tons of Bollard Pull and achieves a speed of 12 knots. The vessel is classed with Indian Registrar of Shipping (IRS) and is installed with FIFI as informed by Lt. Cdr. Mohan Kumar B, Assistant Harbour Master, Port Management Board. He further briefed that the vessel is a sea going and shall be able to cater the tug needs of vessels plying in the A & N Islands.

Employers asked to refrain from paying wages in cancelled currency

Port Blair, Nov. 30

The Government of India, in a historical move to fight corruption, black money, money laundering, financing of terrorists as well as counterfeit notes, has cancelled the legal tender character of the old high denomination bank notes of Rs.500 and Rs.1000 issued by RBI. Subsequently, the Government of India has also taken several measures to fully protect the interests of honest and

hard-working citizens of India and mitigate the hardships faced by the citizens. However, it has been observed that some contractors are paying in advance, wages to the workers in dominations of Rupees Five Hundred and One Thousand of cancelled currency.

In this regard the contractors and Employers of Shops & Commercial Establishments, Factories, Hotels, Restaurants and

other businesses have been advised to open bank accounts of their employees/workers immediately and remit salary into their bank accounts. The employers have also been asked

to refrain from paying salary/wages to workers in cancelled currency of old Rs.500 and Rs.1000 denomination. The workers have been advised to report any such incidence

Virat Kohli moves up to 3rd spot in latest ICC rankings for test batsmen

Dubai, Nov 30
In Cricket, Indian captain Virat Kohli has moved up to a career-best third place in the latest ICC Rankings for test batsmen following his useful contribution in India's eight-wicket win over England in the third Test at Mohali that helped the hosts have a 2-0 lead in the five-match cricket series. Virat Kohli had scored 62 and 6 not out to move to 833 points. Kohli, who is top-ranked in Twenty20 internationals and second in One-Day



Internationals, had started the Test series on 15th position. In the list of all-rounders, Ravindra Jadeja has jumped two placed to reach a career-

best fourth place after scoring an important 90 in his only innings at Mohali.

Saina, Kashyap, Praneeth advance at Macau Open

Macau, Nov 30
Indian star shuttler Saina Nehwal edged past Hanna Ramadini of Indonesia to advance to the second round of the \$120,000 Macau Open Grand Prix Gold tournament on Wednesday. Top seeded Nehwal defeated the Indonesian player 21-23, 21-14, 21-18 in a match which lasted around one hour. After going down in the first game, the Hyderabad shuttler bounced back in style to outplay her opponent in every department of the game. In men's singles category, B Sai Praneeth defeated Sun Feixiang of China 21-12, 21-15 in 40 minutes of play. His compatriot, Parupalli Kashyap also advanced into the second round of the

tournament. Kashyap, who is making a comeback after a long break, defeated Chun-Wei Chen of Chinese Taipei 21-19, 21-8 in a match which lasted for 33 minutes. In another match, Sameer Verma, who was in the spotlight after reaching the final at the recently concluded Hong Kong Open, was defeated by Muhammad Bayu Pangisthu of Indonesia 18-21, 13-21 in the opening round in 35 minutes of play. In the men's doubles category, Manu Attri and Sumeeth Reddy edged past Chan Alan Yun Lung and Li Kuen Hon of Hong Kong to advance. The Indian pair defeated the Hong Kong duo 21-11, 17-21, 21-9 in 40 minutes.

Kashmir's 7-year-old Hashim Mansoor wins gold at Asian Youth Karate Championship

New Delhi, Nov 30
While the unrest in Kashmir Valley has been troublesome for most of the locals, it proved to be a blessing in disguise for 7-year-old Hashim Mansoor, who has become a karate kid. His hard work finally paid off as he clinched a gold medal for India at the Asian Youth Karate Championship (AYKC).

A student in Class II at the Symbiosis School of Education, Hashim expressed his delight at winning the title for India. "I am thrilled to win gold for my country. Hashim had defeated competitors from Bhutan and

Malaysia in the first two rounds. In the final round, he defeated his Sri Lankan opponent to bag gold. He will now represent the country in the World Karate Championship in Europe in September 2017.

Two Bangladeshi cricketers fined by BCB for inviting female guests to hotel room

Dhaka, Nov 30
The Bangladesh Cricket Board has levied a record fine on two national team players for what it called "serious" breaches of discipline after they reportedly entertained female guests in their hotel rooms. Pace bowler Al-Amin Hossain and batsman Sabbir Rahman were both fined around \$15,000 for "serious off-field disciplinary breaches" during the ongoing Bangladesh Premier League (BPL)

Twenty20 tournament, said the BCB in a statement late Tuesday. It gave no details of the charges against the players, but the Prothom Alo daily reported online that they had taken female guests to their hotel rooms during the tour. "The players have been reminded of their responsibility as national cricketers and have been warned that any repetition of similar acts of indiscretion in the future will result in harsher penalty," the BCB said.

Boult set to return for ODI against Australia

Auckland, Nov 30
Trent Boult is expected to be fit for New Zealand's opening one-day international against Australia in Sydney on Sunday after the strike bowler missed the second test win over Pakistan due to knee discomfort. Boult sustained a knee injury on New Zealand's tour of India and he felt some discomfort when he slipped during the first test against Pakistan in Christchurch earlier this month. He was ruled out of the second match in Hamilton, which New Zealand won by 138 runs to clinch their first series win over Pakistan since 1985. Coach Mike Hesson said Boult was tracking "very well" for Sunday's opener in the Chappell-Hadlee series having passed a fitness test.

RBI restricts withdrawals from Jan Dhan accounts up to Rs 10,000

New Delhi, Nov 30
The Reserve Bank has placed a limit of 10,000 rupees on monthly withdrawals from Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan bank accounts and who want to withdraw more than 10,000 a month, will have to furnish appropriate documents to prove why they need the money. RBI, in a notification, said the move is with the objective of protecting innocent farmers and rural account holders of Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan

Yojana (PMJDY) from money launderers and legal consequences under the Benami Property Transaction and Money Laundering laws. The notification said, fully Know Your Customer (KYC) compliant account holders may be allowed to withdraw 10,000 rupees from their account in a month. The apex bank also said, limited or Non KYC compliant account holders may be allowed to withdraw 5,000 rupees per month.
