Advance booking of ship tickets

Reservation can now be done seven days in advance in foreshore sector vessels

Port Blair, Mar 1 In order to facilitate the commuters with advance booking of ship tickets, the Directorate of Shipping Services has now decided to extend the benefit of advance reservation of Ship Tickets from 4 days to 07 days in advance, in respect of vessels plying in the Foreshore sectors namely Diglipur, Mayabunder, Rangat, Strait Island, Long Island, Havelock and Neil Island. After

implementation, the intending passengers will be able to purchase their tickets for the above journey, 7 days in advance from any STARS Ticketing counter of the Directorate of Shipping Services.

However, it may also be noted that, if the sailing schedule is cancelled due to inclement weather or technical / administrative reason, or due to unforeseeable and circumstances beyond the

control of the Directorate of Shipping Services, the tickets will be cancelled & fares will be refunded at actuals. The facility shall be implemented with immediate effect from March 7, 2016, a communication from the Dy. Director (SS) said.

The travel agent delegation urged the Lt Governor to continue the previous system wherein govt. servant can purchase air tickets from the private travel agents while availing LTC. The Lt Governor directed the Chief Secretary to take up the matter with the DOPT and request them to continue the previous rules and regulation of LTC travel for the next five years keeping in view the special issues pertaining to the islands. On the issue of unemployment of staff nurses, the Lt Governor



directed the Secretary (Health) to fill up 25 vacancies of the Staff Nurse by April end. He also directed Secretary (Finance) to put up monthly feedback. Shri Jolly also raised the issue of increasing the salary of Aaganwadi workers. The delegation thanked the Lt Governor for having increased the emoluments last August, but requested for another increase at par with some of the other states. The Lt Governor assured the delegation that their interest

is always uppermost in our minds and further increase will be examined as per availability of finances under non-plan.

The class 10th exam ends on March 26 with Bengali paper. All arrangements for smooth conduct of examinations in entire Islands have been put in place by the CBSE Cell of Directorate of Education. In AISSE (Class 10th) exam, altogether, 5579 students will take Board conducted Summative Assessment as regular candidates. Altogether,

43 Examination Centres have been identified to facilitate student of AISSE appearing from this UT including the Private Candidates. Last year, in AISSE-2015,

altogether, 5520 took exam in the Board conducted Summative Assessment while 421 appeared in schools conducted Summative Assessment.

Virat Kohli, Yuvraj Singh take India to Asia Cup final

Mirpur, Mar 1
Virat Kohli's unbeaten 56 off 47 deliveries, Yuvraj Singh's cameo of 35 off 18 balls and a clinical bowling performance helped India beat Sri Lanka by five wickets in match seven of Asia Cup 2016 played at Sher-e-Bangla Stadium in Dhaka on Tuesday.
With this win India have secured their place in the final of the tournament.
Chasing a modest target of 139 runs, India lost the openers cheaply but Kohli had a solid stand with Suresh Raina (25) and then Yuvraj to help India surpass Sri Lanka total in 19.2 overs.
In the second over of the innings, Nuwan Kulasekara gave the Lankans their first breakthrough when an angled delivery was too good for Shikhar Dhawan (1). Kulasekera then sent the dangerous looking Rohit Sharma back to the hut. Rohit scored 15 runs.
Raina then joined Kohli in the middle and the duo steadied the Indian



ship. The duo added 54-run stand for the third wicket. Raina scored 25 with the help of two fours before getting out to Dasun Shanaka. Earlier, defending champions Sri Lanka scored 138 for 9 in the allotted 20 overs. CK Kapugedera hit the highest of 30 while TAM Siriwardana contributed 22 for Sri Lanka.

Rahul Dravid appointed as Delhi Daredevils mentor

Rahul Dravid, former Indian captain, was appointed by Delhi Daredevils as their mentor, on Tuesday (March 1), for the upcoming ninth edition of the Indian Premier League (IPL). The Delhi-based franchise have also roped in Paddy Upton, former South Africa and India mental conditioning coach, as their head coach to replace Gary Kirsten at the helm. Kirsten's two-year stint as the head coach of the Delhi-based franchise

came to an end on December 7 after the team management announced the termination of their contract with the former India coach. "I am very excited by the challenge of taking Delhi Daredevils on to the next level. From what I have seen I have been impressed by the ambition and energy demonstrated by the team and I look forward to working with a group of players that I believe have what it takes to succeed," Dravid said. "Along with the rest of the support staff, I am fully aware of what this franchise means to its supporters and I intend to do everything possible to help build a team that the fans can be proud of." The Dravid-Upton duo has previously worked in similar capacity for the now-defunct Rajasthan Royals team. IPL 2016 is pencilled to begin on April 9, following the completion of the ICC World T20.

Govt backing use of farm land for medicinal plants to conserve endangered species

New Delhi, Mar 1
The Ministry of AYUSH is promoting large scale cultivation of medicinal plants on farmers' land to reduce the pressure on wild population of medicinal plants species under the National AYUSH Mission. The Ministry provides financial assistance in the form of subsidy at the rate of 30 per cent, 50 per cent and 75 per cent of cost of cultivation to farmers. This information was given by the Minister of AYUSH, Shri Shripad Yesso Naik in reply to a question in the Rajya Sabha today. As per Botanical Survey of India, out of 8,000 medicinal plants only 53 species are under threatened categories like Critically

Endangered, Endangered and Vulnerable. The Government is not neglecting the endangered species of plants and to look into all matters, the Government has already set up National Medicinal Plants Board (NMPB) under the Ministry in 2000. Since its inception NMPB is working towards conservation and development of medicinal plants.
Railways gives nod for high speed Talgo train trial on two routes
