Speaking at a banquet, hosted in his honour, by Governor General Sir Jerry Mateparae at Auckland last night, Shri Mukherjee said factoring the size of the economies of the two countries and the wide convergence of interests in many areas, trade and

He said New Zealand has made tremendous progress in many areas such as dairy development, food processing, information technology, clean energy, water, disaster management, biotechnology, healthcare and services and India would like to build

partnerships in these areas. Turning to Regional and global security challenges, the President said the UN system needs to be reformed so that it remains relevant and effective in addressing the challenges that confront the world today. He said India stands ready to shoulder greater responsibilities in the international arena. President Shri Mukherjee looked forward to enhanced cooperation between the two countries both in the regional and global context.

This has been made to enable the farmers aware of the quality and fertility of the soil in their farm lands and accordingly use exact quantity of fertilizers for better agriculture production. The Jt. Director

(Agri.), Shri R Y Singh, during an awareness-cum-people's education programme held in the Community hall, Wandoor recently, informed that the main objectives of issuance of Soil Health Cards is to provide information to the farmers about the fertility of their lands. For this, the farmers need to get the soil of their land tested, he said. The Jt. Director observed

that unbridled use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides have resulted in diminishing fertility of their lands. This also leads to environment pollution, Shri Singh said and urged the farmers to adopt organic farming, which he said will not only increase agriculture productivity but also improve the fertility of the land. Ballia (UP), May 1 The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, today launched the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana at Ballia. The scheme aims to provide cooking gas connections to five crore below-poverty-line beneficiaries over the next three years.

Noting that May 1st is observed as Labour Day, the Prime Minister said that in this century, the aim

of all workers across the world should be to unite the world. Reiterating that the Union Government's primary focus has been the welfare of the poor, the Prime Minister mentioned various steps for labour welfare taken by the Union Government over the last two years.

He mentioned the Shram Suidha Portal, and the Labour Identity Number given to Shramiks.

The Prime Minister recalled that Ballia is the land of the revolutionary Mangal Pandey, and said that while the development of Eastern Uttar Pradesh has suffered for decades, connectivity is now being strengthened in the region. He said the Union Government is allocating tremendous resources for the development of Uttar Pradesh. He mentioned the rapid progress that has

been made in rural electrification. He said the fruits of development must reach the eastern part of India, for us to gain strength in the fight against poverty. The Prime Minister emphasized that schemes must be designed keeping in mind the welfare of the poor, and not merely to derive electoral benefit. He said that the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana will

benefit the poor, especially the women.

Later, Shri Modi visited his parliamentary constituency Varanasi also. During his more than six hours stay there, he distributed 1,000 e-rickshaws and solar-powered e-boats to the beneficiaries. He also attended a cultural programme Sham-e-Banaras at Assi Ghat before leaving for Delhi.

New Delhi, May 1

The first phase of the single National Eligibility Entrance Test (NEET) for admissions to MBBS and BDS courses was held today. The Supreme Court had yesterday refused to accord an urgent hearing of a plea seeking modification of its earlier order with regard to NEET. A bench, headed by Chief Justice TS Thakur, said the matter had been heard by another bench and it is over for now.

The observation came when lawyers, representing some students, said the order on NEET needed to be modified as students who had prepared for the state-level entrance exams will find it difficult to prepare for NEET in such a short span of time.

The Supreme Court had, earlier, said the entrance test for admission to MBBS

India win one silver, two bronze in Archery World Cup

Sshaghai, May 1
Indian women's team settled for the silver after losing to Chinese Taipei in the final, while men's trio and mixed pair won their respective bronze playoffs in the first stage of Archery World Cup at the Yuanshen Stadium here on Sunday. Women's team comprising Deepika Kumari, Bombayla Devi Laishram and Laxmirani Majhi put up an inconsistent show that included an abysmal five in the crucial third set, to lose to the lower-ranked Chinese Taipei 2-6 in the recurve team final. Later, the third seeded Indian men's recurve team of Atanu Das, Jayanta Talukdar and Mangal Singh Champia brought smiles back to the Indian camp, hammering ninth seed British team 6-0 to bag the bronze medal. The mixed pair of Deepika and Atanu ended India's campaign on a high, getting the better of



much fancied Koreans 5-4 in a nerve-wracking shoot-off to end with another bronze. Trailing 2-4, the top seeded Indian pair bounced back to level 4-4 against the third seed Arem Jo and Seong Cheol Park to take the match to the shoot-off, which again was a tie (18-all) as both the teams scored 9-9. But since the Indian team was closest to centre in their second 9, it helped in edging out the Koreans. Earlier, the fourth seeded Indian women's team shot a poor six and eight to start

Taipei team shooting four 10s for a handsome 4-2 lead going into the decider. There was no end to India's misery, while Chinese Taipei put up another improved show in the final round to wrap the issue with a five-point win in the fourth set. Needing a win in the fourth set to take the match into shoot-off, the Indian trio shot a seven along with four 9s and a solitary perfect 10, which turned out to be insufficient against their rivals, who hit four 10s and two 9s for a total 58 out of a maximum 60 to win the set and the gold medal. Das, Talukdar and Champia, however, put up a commanding show to blank their English trio of Patrick Huston, Larry Godfrey and Kieran Slater. The Indians played the range with five perfect 10s and one eight to race to a 2-0 lead before wrapping the issue in three sets with consistent shootings in the second and third.

Srabani beats Dutee for 200m gold



New Delhi, May 1
Dutee Chand could not execute her threat of qualifying for the Olympics, and was beaten to the 200 metres gold by the seasoned Srabani Nanda in the 20th Federation Cup athletics championships that concluded at the Nehru Stadium here on Saturday. Srabani clocked 23.39 seconds as she pipped Dutee by two hundredths of a second. In fact, it was a photo finish as the public display screen continued to show the replays for long, without any announcement of the results. H.M. Jyothi won the bronze yet again, one hundredth of a

second behind the 19-year-old Dutee, who perhaps lacked the energy at the finish. Interestingly, Jyothi had lost the silver in 100 metres by similar margin. "In future, when we attempt qualification, I think we have to focus on one event. Dutee is young, and has a lot of scope to improve," said coach N. Ramesh, who has been training her. Without having to worry about meeting qualifying standards as she has already confirmed her ticket to Rio, Tintu Luka bettered the women's 800 metres meet record with a time of 2:1.84.

Perka Sporting Club lifts Dr. B. Srikanth Memorial T20 Cricket Tournament

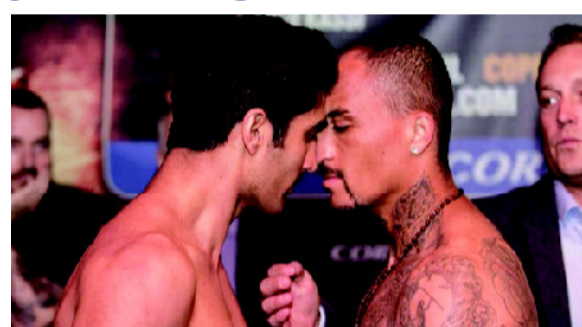


Car Nicobar, May 1

London, May 1
Indian boxing star Vijender Singh's power-packed punches went unchallenged yet again as he notched up his fifth successive knockout win by battering Frenchman Matiouze Royer here. Vijender was declared winner last night little over a minute into the fifth round of the six-round super middleweight contest, which was incidentally his longest bout so far. The 30-year-old was up against his most experienced rival till date in Royer, who came into the bout with an accumulated 250 rounds under his belt. But the Indian did not seem perturbed in the six-round contest and was once again looking to wrap it up early like his previous bouts. Vijender spent the first round getting a measure of his overtly cautious rival, who preferred to keep a



shell guard and hardly attempted a hit at his taller opponent. But that could not save him from a couple of telling body blows from Vijender, who was also impressive with his jabs. The Frenchman was reluctant to let go of the guard even in the second round and Vijender took it upon himself to go on the offensive. The Indian seemed set for an early finish when he had Royer cornered with a flurry of combination punches but the Frenchman did not give in despite being left with a

Indian Railways to plant 5 cr saplings on rail land before monsoon

New Delhi, May 1
In order to enhance the green cover along the rail tracks, Indian Railway has firmed up an ambitious proposal to plant five crore saplings ahead of the onset of monsoon on land owned by it. Railways has created a separate directorate to carry out environment-related activities in a focused manner. A senior official in the Environment Directorate of the Railway Ministry said, they are finalising the varieties of trees such as neem, pilkhan, jamun to be planted on rail land



including on both sides of the tracks. The saplings will be region-specific and vary from zone to zone. Railways will be joined by the Environment Ministry and state governments in the massive drive. Railway official said, his Ministry will sign an MoU with the Environment Ministry to carry out the plantation exercise. Besides, Railways will also rope in NGOs in the country-wide exercise. The official said, the tree plantation drive will serve dual purpose, an environment friendly exercise as well as preventing encroachment of rail land.

Scorpene class submarines Kalvari goes to sea for 1st time

Mumbai, May 1
The first of the Scorpene class submarines Kalvari went to sea for the first time today. The submarine sailed out about ten in the morning under its own propulsion for the first sea trial, off the Mumbai coast. According to an official release, during the sortie, it completed a number of preliminary tests on the propulsion system, Auxiliary Equipment and Systems, Navigation Aids, Communication Equipment and Steering gear. Various Standard Operating Procedures were also validated for this new class of submarines. The submarine, built at the Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd Mumbai, returned to harbour in the evening.

World's largest telescope may be setup in Ladakh

New Delhi, May 1
Hawaii's loss may turn out to be Ladakh's gain. After protests in Hawaii in the US against the proposed Thirty Metre Telescope (TMT) project, the largest to be built, alternative sites are being explored which includes Hanle in Ladakh. The project, aimed at exploring the universe, was to come up at Mauna Kea in Hawaii. But protests by the locals and indigenous population has stalled the project. However, given the importance of the project, in terms of finance and its

scientific value, the project partners are also looking at alternate sites, both in the northern and southern hemispheres. These include sites in Chile, Hanle, Ladakh and others which are all being evaluated for technical and logistical suitability. India is a 10 per cent partner in the TMT project, which includes China, Japan, Canada and the US. On the Indian side, the project is being handled by the Ministry of Science and Technology and Department of Atomic Energy. If the programme comes to India, it will open several doors. "The project is expected to improve employment opportunities for the local people besides development of the region. TMT being the largest optical and infrared telescope in the northern hemisphere will strengthen the domestic programme of the country in this field and lead to several discoveries, which will inspire future generations. The project will also help develop state-of-the-art high end technologies and expertise in the country," an official of Ministry of Science and Technology said.
