## PM releases National Disaster Management Plan



New Delhi, June 1  
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today released the National Disaster Management Plan (NDMP). This is the first ever National Disaster Management Plan prepared

in the country. It will focus on making India disaster resilient and significantly reduce the loss of lives and assets. The plan is based on the four priority themes of the Sendai Framework. These include understand-

ing disaster risk, improving the risk governance, investing in disaster risk reduction and disaster preparedness, early warning and building back better in the aftermath of a disaster. The plan covers all

phases of disaster management, prevention, mitigation, response and recovery. It provides for horizontal and vertical integration among all the agencies and departments of the Government.

Union Minister for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Shri Kalraj Mishra on Wednesday launched new schemes for the Coir Industry in New Delhi.

## National Award for Child Welfare; nominations invited

Port Blair, June 1  
The Directorate of Social Welfare has invited nominations from individuals and institutions for the National Award for Child Welfare for the year 2015 & 2016 which has been instituted by the Government of India, Ministry of Women & Child Development to give recognition to individuals and Institutions who have made outstanding contribution towards Child Welfare. The National Award for Child Welfare will be given to three individuals and five institutions who have worked for the welfare of children for some years. Paid Officers of the Institutions are not eligible for the award. The award carries a cash prize of Rs 3 Lakhs and a citation to

each institution and Rs 1 Lakh and a citation to each individual. The criteria for selection of institutions is that it should not be entirely Govt. funded. It could be Govt. aided or otherwise. The institution should have been in the field of Child Welfare for some years and should have, to their record, a good performance in the field. The branches of the institutions working independently will also qualify for selection of the Award. The selection of the award will be made solely

on the basis of quality of performance and the number of children served by the institution.

The individuals to be selected for the award should have worked for the cause of children for some years. Paid officers of the institution are not eligible for the selection. The sole basis of the selection will be the quality of work performed by the individual for the cause of children and its significance for the cause.

## Promoting 'gardening' in educational institutions in A&N Isles

### 20 schools to be selected in first phase

Port Blair, June 1  
With the objective of creating awareness and to encourage students (young generation) to adopt agricultural activities, the Scheme for "Promoting Gardening in Education Institutions" is being implemented by the Agriculture Department for the year 2016-17. In the first phase, 20 schools under the scheme will be selected.

Any School, having a minimum of 200 sq.m vacant land to take up vegetable cultivation can apply for this scheme. Technical guidance and Agriculture inputs worth Rs.10,000/- will be provided to each selected school by the Agriculture Department. Assistance will be provided for a period of one year to a particular school. The officials of Agriculture

Department will visit the school periodically and train the students in the agriculture activities. The scheme will not only encourage students in agriculture, but will also help in cultivating vegetables within the school premises for the use of the students, a communication from the Joint Director (Agri), HQ, Directorate of Agriculture said.

India to take on Pak in Champions Trophy opener next year

London, June 1  
Defending champions India have been seeded second and will take on arch-rivals Pakistan in their opening cricket match of next year's ICC Champions Trophy after the two countries were today placed in the same group for the event to be held in England.

The Asian powerhouses will go head to head at Edgbaston, Birmingham, on June 4. The 18-day tournament will run from June 1 to 18 and will also see matches played at the Cardiff Wales Stadium in Cardiff and The Oval in London.

A couple of days before the all-Asian clash, Australia and New Zealand will lock horns in a repeat of the World Cup 2015 final at Edgbaston.

Event host and 2004 and 2013 finalists England will take on Bangladesh in the tournament-opener at The Oval, which will

also be the venue for a battle between former champions Sri Lanka and South Africa on June 3.

India leads Group B, which also comprises third seeds South Africa, fifth seeds Sri Lanka and eighth seeds Pakistan.

The top two sides from each group will progress to the semifinals, which will be played at Cardiff and Edgbaston on June 14 and 15 respectively, with The Oval hosting the final.

South Africa won the inaugural event in Dhaka, Bangladesh in 1998 while India and Sri Lanka shared the trophy in 2002.

India 'A' to play one-day series, four-day games in Australia

Australia had announced that their A side and National Performance Squad would play a quadrangular one-day series against South Africa A and another international team. The CA on Wednesday confirmed that the fourth team is India A.

India A will compete in quadrangular series throughout August in Townsville and Mackay, followed by two four-day matches against Australia A in early September in Brisbane.

CA Executive General Manager — Team Performance Pat Howard said India A would add competitive edge to the series.

"This is an important series for developing and growing the depth of talent in our pathways. Players in the Australia A and National Performance Squad have been identified as having the potential to play for their country and the national selectors will be watching this series with interest. "India and South Africa are strong competitors with wide-ranging skills to challenge our players and build their experience against high-quality opposition," Howard said.

India to seek Olympic wildcard for Mary Kom

New Delhi, June 1

She couldn't make the cut through qualifiers but star woman boxer M.C. Mary Kom's Olympic dream is not quite over yet as India has decided to seek a wildcard entry for her in the Games scheduled from August 5 this year.

Mary Kom (51kg) had missed out on qualifying for the Olympics after bowing out in the second round of last month's World Championships — the second and final qualifying tournament for women for the Games. The 33-year-old was required to make at least the semifinals to be assured of an Olympic berth in the mega-event in Astana, Kazakhstan. "She has been a phenomenal athlete and looking at her overall contribution to the sport, we have decided to request for a wildcard for her. However, her application will be among the many that the International Boxing Association (AIBA) will examine before taking a final decision," Chairman of the ad-hoc committee currently running boxing in India, Kishen Narsi said.

Mary Kom, who is called 'Magnificent Mary' by AIBA, is a five-time world champion besides being a bronze-medallist from the London Olympics. The multiple-time Asian champion could not get an Olympic quota place in either of the two qualifying events for women boxers and is keeping her fingers crossed for a wildcard.

"Let's see how it goes," was Mary Kom's brief response on the latest efforts being made to secure what would be her second and final Olympic appearance. The wildcards are basically Tripartite Commission Invitation Places, which are made available to all the National Olympic Committees (NOCs) participating in the Olympics. In the three Olympic categories of 51kg, 60kg and 75kg in women's boxing, only one wildcard is available per division. The decision on beneficiaries of these lucky tickets is taken only at the end of all the Olympic qualifying events in a particular sport. In boxing, the Olympic qualifiers will draw to a close in the last week of this month with the AIBA world qualifiers for men in Azerbaijan. Only one Indian boxer — Shiva Thapa (56kg) — has so far qualified for the Olympic Games.

The Cabinet has given its approval for signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between India and Qatar for cooperation in skill development and recognition of qualifications.

It will facilitate workforce mobility, skill development and placement of youth in overseas jobs in Qatar. The Cabinet also gave its nod to signing of MoU between the two countries for strengthening cooperation in the field of tourism. It will create favourable conditions for long-term co-operation in the field of tourism for the mutual benefits. It also approved signing and ratification of agreement between India and Qatar on co-operation and mutual assistance in customs matters.
