Tejas induction: PM says matter of 'unparalleled pride'

New Delhi, July 1

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today hailed the induction of indigenously-built Light Combat Aircraft Tejas into the Air Force, terming it as a matter of "unparalleled pride and happiness" and a step which illustrates the skills and strengths of Indian scientists.

"Induction of indigenously made Tejas fighter jet into the Air Force fills our hearts with unparalleled pride & happiness," he tweeted. The first squadron of Tejas was inducted into IAF at Bengaluru earlier today, with two fighter planes joining the force, in a major milestone in the military aviation of the country.

"I laud HAL & ADA on the



induction of Tejas fighter jet. This illustrates our skills & strengths to enhance indigenous defence manufacturing," Shri Modi said in another tweet. State-run HAL handed over the first two Tejas aircraft to IAF, which makes up the first squadron named 'Flying Daggers', at a ceremony preceded by inter-faith prayers at the Aircraft System Testing

Establishment. The commissioning of the India-made fighter planes comes more than three decades after LCA went into development. The aircraft was named "Tejas" (meaning radiance in Sanskrit) by Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee as Prime Minister. The squadron will be based in Bengaluru for the first two years before it is moved to Sulur in Tamil Nadu.

New Delhi, July 1
Gurpreet Singh Sandhu on Thursday became the first Indian to play in the Europa League, when he started for Norwegian Tippeligaen club Stabaek FC in a qualifier against Welsh side Connah's Quay Nomads FC in an away match in Rhyll.

The 6 feet and four inch tall goalkeeper, however, could not play the entirety of the match as he was substituted by Sayouba Mande, after 28 minutes following a hand injury. The match at Belle Vue ended 0-0. "I am proud but also disappointed that it had to end due to an injury. But then again

"The BCCI always maintained that it will organise a day-night Test after experimenting in Duleep Trophy. You can't go ahead with a big game like that without testing the conditions, without getting feedback from all stakeholders including the players," BCCI Joint Secretary Amitabh Choudhary. The Duleep Trophy, to be played with pink ball and under lights, is

New Delhi, July 1
Veteran sprinter Sameer Mon has won gold in 100 metre at the 56th National Inter-state Senior Athletics Championships in Hyderabad. Representing Manipur, Sameer clocked 10.60 seconds to become the fastest athlete in the country. Karnataka athlete Reena George's switch-over from 400 metre to 100 metre proved successful as she won the women's 100 metre dash in 11.99 seconds. Khyati Vakharia of Karnataka cleared a season best 3.80 metre to win the women's pole vault. In women's 100 metre hurdles, M Sugina of Kerala clocked a



personal best of 14.17 secs to win gold. Tamil Nadu duo of B Dhanalakshmi and D Keerthana also delivered their bests to secure the next two spots. D Sreekanth, also of Kerala, took his first major title in men's 110 metre hurdles by clocking a personal best of 14.54 seconds.
