Govt trying to revive historic maritime cultural economic ties with 39 countries

New Delhi, Aug 1
The Government today said that it is trying to revive historic maritime cultural economic ties with 39 countries including China, Cambodia, Sri Lanka, Pakistan and Saudi Arabia under project 'Mausam'.

Culture to be implemented by the Archaeological Survey of India as the nodal agency. IAF Dornier aircraft services on PB-C/Nicobar-C/Bay sector for Civilians from Aug 5

Port Blair, Aug 1

The Andaman & Nicobar Administration, with the support of Ministry of Defence and A & N Command has made arrangements for transportation of civilian passengers in Indian Air Force Dornier aircraft on sector Port Blair - Car Nicobar - Campbell Bay. Accordingly, IAF will operate weekly two flights

for the civilian passengers on every Monday and Friday from the Inter-Island helicopter terminal at Port Blair. The services will commence on 5th August, 2016.

As per the schedule, the IAF Dornier will depart from Port Blair at 8 am and reach Car Nicobar at 9 am. From Car Nicobar it will depart at 9.45 am and will reach Campbell Bay at

10.45 am. On its return flight the aircraft will depart from Campbell Bay at 11.30 am and reach Car Nicobar at 12.30 pm. Again from Car Nicobar it will depart at 1.15 pm and will reach Port Blair at 2.15 pm. The aircraft will carry 10 passengers and each passenger will be allowed to carry a maximum of 10 kgs registered baggage free of cost. (Contd. on last page)

Department of CS&CA suspends 5787 ration cards

Card holders asked to provide Aadhaar number by Aug 15

Port Blair, Aug 1

The Department of CS&CA started the exercise of seeding of Ration Cards with Aadhaar number of card holders from December 2015 onwards and the card holders were requested to submit their filled in performa to their respective FPS. Wide publicity was also given. However, as the response was not encouraging, the Department requested all concerned to furnish details of Aadhaar number by June 26, 2016 making it clear that the card holders will not be issued smart card in the event Aadhaar

number is not furnished. Despite this, information was not provided by many card holders. As such, again a notice given on July 4, 2016 regarding publication of list of those card holders who have not yet furnished their Aadhaar number as yet and opportunity was given to them for furnishing the same by July 16, 2016. Individual notices through the FPS concerned were also issued. The card holders were also sent SMS message through available phone no. for providing the Aadhaar number. The Department of Civil

Narsingh Yadav given clean chit from doping charges; may take part in Olympics

New Delhi, Aug 1
The National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) has given a clean chit to wrestler Narsingh Yadav from doping charges, thereby allowing him to participate in Rio Olympics. The 74kg freestyle wrestler, who bagged a bronze medal in last year's world championship to qualify for the Olympics, tested positive for a banned steroid in an out of competition test conducted by the NADA.

Ending the suspense of the last few days, NADA DG Naveen Agarwal read out a statement clearing Narsingh. "We kept in mind that in the past, till June 2, none of his samples were positive. It was inconceivable that one-time ingestion would be of benefit. Therefore the panel is of the view that the one-time ingestion was not intentional," Mr. Lehmann handed

Darren Lehmann will continue as head coach of Australia until October 2019, after receiving a two-year contract extension. The 46-year-old's contract was due to expire in June 2017, but has now been extended to cover home and away Ashes series and the 50-over World Cup in 2019. The extension was long rumoured with many in Australian cricket circles believing Justin Langer, Western Australia's coach, being the hot favourite to succeed Lehmann in 2019. Langer was Australia's interim coach in the Caribbean during the tri-series in June when Lehmann rested.

Novak Djokovic beats Kei Nishikori to claim Toronto title



Ontario, Aug 1
World number one Novak Djokovic defeated Japan's Kei Nishikori 6-3, 7-5 Sunday to win the Toronto hardcourt tournament and claim his 66th career singles title. The Serb top seed collected his seventh trophy of the season as he duplicated his win over Asia's top player three months ago in the Miami final. Djokovic improved to 10-2 in the series as he handed Nishikori a defeat

in just 81 minutes. Djokovic now leads the Masters 1000 winner list by two over Rafael Nadal (28). "I had to realize my level," Djokovic said. "I was not feeling that comfortable at the start of the week. "But I made progress and gained in confidence at the right time." Nishikori was run down in the first hour of play before staking a brief claim on the contest.
