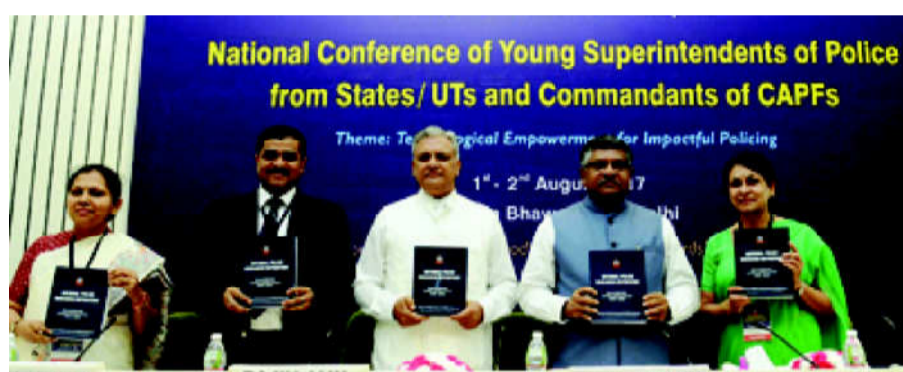
PM to inaugurate two-day 'Rajaswa Gyansangam' on Sept 1

Benefits under PMRPY scheme Establishments covered under EPF & Miscellaneous Provisions Act advised

Port Blair, Aug 1
In order to incentivize employment generation in formal sector, the Government of India has introduced Prime Minister Rojgar Protsahan Yojna (PMRPY). Under the Scheme, Government of India would pay 8.33% of the Employees' Pension Scheme contribution of the employer for the new employment. The salient features of the Schemes under the PMRPY include that, the Government of India would pay 8.33% of the EPS contribution of the employer for the new employment. Employees earning wages less than Rs. 15000/- per month under semi-skilled and unskilled category are

eligible. New employee means who has not been working in an EPFO registered establishment on a regular basis prior to 1st April, 2016. The scheme will be operational for a period of 3 years and employers will continue to get the 8.33% contribution paid by the government for the eligible new employees for the next 3 years, provided such employee continue to be employed with the same employer. Hence, all the establishments covered under Employees' Provident Fund & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 have been requested to avail the benefits under the PMRPY schemes. SC bans use of five metals in firecrackers

New Delhi, Aug 1
The Supreme Court today imposed a ban on the use of five harmful metals including lead and mercury in firecrackers as they cause enormous air pollution. A bench headed by Justice Madan B Lokur prohibited use of lithium, mercury, arsenic, antimony, lead metals which are used in the manufacturing of firecrackers.

The order came after the Central Pollution Control Board's (CPCB) Member Secretary told the top court that standards on air pollution caused by the

Health Ministry to launch Intensified Mission Indradhanush

New Delhi, Aug 1
Health Ministry will launch Intensified Mission Indradhanush to accelerate immunization coverage to meet its target of full immunization coverage by 2018.

The Ministry will give greater focus on urban areas and other pockets of low immunization coverage. According to the plan, States will conduct

Intensified Mission Indradhanush drives for 7 working days from 7th day of every month starting from 7th October this year for four consecutive months. A total of 118 districts, 17 urban areas and 52 districts of North East states will be targeted under Intensified Mission Indradhanush. The Ministry said, intensive

monitoring and strong accountability mechanism is being established at all levels with Cabinet Secretary at national level and the Chief Secretary at state level. Universal Immunization Programme of India prevents mortality and morbidity in children and pregnant women against 12 vaccine preventable diseases.

Kuala Lumpur, Aug 1
In football, a double strike from substitute Pyari Xaxa helped a dominant Indian women's team beat Malaysia 2-0 in an international friendly match in Kuala Lumpur yesterday. After a barren first half, Pyari scored in the 79th and the 86th minutes of the match played at the MP Selayang Stadium. India's dominance was complete throughout the match, except



for a brief spell in the second half. Malaysia did not have much to boast about in the match.

Abhijeet Gupta finishes second in Czech Open chess tournament

Czech Republic, Aug 1
Commonwealth Champion Abhijeet Gupta came up with a spirited effort to beat Florian Kaczur of Hungary and finish second in the Czech International Open Chess tournament at Pardubice in Czech Republic. After squandering his sole lead at 5.5/6, Gupta scored 1.5 points in the last three rounds to end with a tally of seven points out of a possible nine. However his superior tiebreak helped him win second place after a four-way tie was resolved. Gupta was beaten by fellow Indian

Grandmaster G N Gopal in the seventh round. Twenty-five year old Jan Krejci of Czech Republic won seven games in a row after starting with two draws to win the title by a one point margin. 20 year old International Master Sayantan Das, of Kolkata made a Grand Master norm by remaining undefeated in the Czech Open. The 2399 rated player clocked a rating performance of 2609, gaining 25.5 Elo in the process.

Nihal Sarin started as seed 43 and finished 13th scoring 6.5 points but missed the GM

norm. He suffered only one loss to G.N. Gopal in a battle for the Kerala supremacy. The other GM norm seeker, Abhimanyu Puranik remained undefeated but did not face the required GMs. FIDE Master Raunak Sadhwani played at 2498 and completed an International Master norm. Incredibly, the 12-year old from Nagpur also remained undefeated. He scored 3/5 against the five Grand Masters he faced. The other two IM norms were recorded by FM Nihal Sarin (6.5/9) and Harshit Raja (5.5/9).

Los Angeles, Aug 1
Los Angeles formally announced its bid for the 2028 Summer Olympics today after agreeing on a deal that paves the way for Paris to host in 2024. The Los Angeles Olympic and Paralympic bid committee in cooperation with the International Olympic Committee (IOC), announced it yesterday. The LA bid committee said in a statement that Los Angeles will host the Olympic Games and



Paralympic Games 2028. Los Angeles had been in a race with Paris to host the 2024 Games, with the winner to be named by the IOC on September 13 in Lima.

Jadeja maintains top position, Virat stays 5th in ICC Test Rankings

Dubai, Aug 1
Star spinner Ravindra Jadeja maintained pole position in the bowlers' list while India skipper Virat Kohli remained static at fifth place in the batting charts in the latest ICC Test Rankings released on Tuesday. In the batsmen's rankings, Cheteshwar Pujara is the top-ranked Indian at the fourth position while opener Shikhar Dhawan climbed 21 places to be ranked 39th. The batting list is being topped by Australia captain Steve Smith followed by England's Joe Root and New Zealand's Kane Williamson. In the bowlers' chart, Ravichandran Ashwin displaced Sri Lankan Rangana Herath to claim the second spot back. Herath is third in the rankings. Pacer Mohammed Shami gained a place to be 23rd. Jadeja and Ashwin also maintained second and third ranks respectively in the all-rounders' list. Bangladesh's Shakib Al Hasan is still perched at the top of the table. England all-rounder Ben Stokes moved up 12 places to joint-25th position in the rankings for batsmen and also gained two places to reach 19th position. His effort also saw him overtake South Africa's Vernon Philander to take fifth position in the list of all-rounders. In the latest rankings, which also take into account



performances in the first Test at Galle, in which India defeated Sri Lanka by 304 runs to take a 1-0 lead in the three-Test series, saw other England players make notable gains too. Jonny Bairstow has gained
