Accordingly the ballot papers will be published. The arrangements of the candidates on the ballot papers has been done as per the guidelines.

Accordingly, the list of validly nominated candidates have been prepared in Hindi

and English and the names have been arranged in Hindi alphabetical order. These names will appear in the same order in the list of contesting candidates and also in the ballot papers.

The arrangements of the names of the candidates has been determined in the alphabetical order, in the list of validly nominated candidates, the list of contesting candidates and also in ballot papers, on the basis of the first letter of his name irrespective of whether the name given was the proper name or surname. The initials, if any, prefixed to the name of the candidates has been ignored for the aforesaid purpose.

The Polling material required for North & Middle

Andaman has been transported to the District. The Printing for ballot papers for all the constituencies is under progress.

Meanwhile, the Director, Municipal & Panchayat Elections, A & N Islands has again cautioned all the Government Servants to not to involve in any activities of the political parties or others related to elections. If found, stringent action shall be initiated against them. Special teams have been constituted for the purpose.

90 percent seabirds have consumed plastic: Study

Melbourne, Sep 1
Nearly 90 percent of individual seabirds alive today have consumed some form of plastic and about 60 percent of them, including albatrosses, shearwaters and penguins, have plastic in their guts, estimates a new study.
"This is a huge amount and really points to the ubiquity of plastic pollution," said lead author Chris Wilcox, senior research scientist at Australia's Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO).
The analysis of studies published since the early 1960s showed that plastic is increasingly common in seabirds' stomachs. In 1960, plastic was found in the stomachs of less than 5 percent of seabirds; by 2010 that figure had risen to 80 percent.



Based on current trends, the scientists predict that plastic ingestion will affect 99 percent of the world's seabird species by 2050. The plethora of plastic comes from bags, bottle caps and plastic fibres from synthetic clothes that have washed out into the ocean from urban rivers, sewers and waste deposits. Birds mistake the brightly coloured items for food or

swallow them by accident, causing gut impaction, weight loss and sometimes death, the study said. "Improving waste management can reduce the threat plastic is posing to marine wildlife," Denise Hardesty, who also works at CSIRO, noted. The study was published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

UoH to patent tomato breed rich in vitamin B9

Hyderabad, Sept 1
Tomatoes could become a rich source of vitamin B9 or folate in the near future once efforts of the University of Hyderabad (UoH) to patent their latest research are successful. If all goes well, then the Repository of Tomato Genomics Resource (RGTR) in the UoH campus will patent a breed of tomato, which will be rich in vitamin B9. The patenting exercise comes after a good three years of research in the RGTR which is currently headed by the varsity's in-charge vice-chancellor Prof. R.P. Sharma. "Vitamin B9 is present in different plants and vegetables, but its presence is high in spinach, which is not consumed much by people in India. It is



important for pregnant women, as it helps the foetus develop properly," mentioned Prof. Sharma. But why were tomatoes chosen over other vegetables? "After potato, tomato is the second highest consumed vegetable, as it is used in several dishes in India. It is consumed commonly in households," said Prof. Sharma. He further stated that though tomatoes have vitamin B9 in them, it is not high. According to Prof. Sharma, the varsity is currently in the process of filing a patent for the RGTR's latest result.

Kolkata parks to have India's first carbon-neutral lighting

Kolkata, Sept 1
The City of Joy is poised to become the first city in the country to have its public parks illuminated by an automated carbon-neutral solar lighting system, reducing the carbon footprint and electricity bills. The new automated solar lighting system, first installed at Deshapriya Park on a trial basis, would now be extended to 28 other parks by the Kolkata Municipal Corporation, the custodian of the parks. "The unique part in this solar lighting system is that it is battery-less and connected with the power grid. An automatic control system has been put in place and the lights will be switched on automatically after evening and switched off in the morning," renewable energy expert S P Gon Chowdhury, who has devised the technology, said. The lights will also dim automatically after midnight when requirement is low.

KMC's Member Mayor-in-Council (Parks and Squares) Debasish Kumar said the project, funded by the West Bengal government, should be ready in less than a year's time. Explaining the concept of carbon-neutrality manager, thus named by Chowdhury, the expert said that the system would push solar energy generated during daytime back into the main electricity grid with the aid of a micro-converter. "No battery is therefore needed. The amount of solar electricity produced through the solar panels is recorded on an electric metre. It is carbon-neutral because it produces as much electricity as it consumes," the solar expert said, claiming that the carbon neutrality manager, developed by him, is a first in the world. The pilot project began earlier this year with Deshapriya Park where they have installed 50 solar electric posts having 180 Watt solar panels with LED lights.

Fossils show big bug ruled the seas 460 million years ago

Washington, Sept 1
Earth's first big predatory monster was a weird water bug, newly found fossils show. Almost half a billion years ago, Earth's dominant large predator was a sea scorpion that grew to 5 feet 7 inches, or 170 centimetres, with a dozen claw arms sprouting from its head, according to a new study. Scientists found signs of these new monsters deep in Iowa. Geologists at the Iowa Geological Survey found 150 pieces of fossils about 60 feet, or 18 meters, under the Upper Iowa River. Scientists at Yale University determined they were a new species from about 460 million years ago, when Iowa was under an ocean. "This is the first real big predator," lead author of the study, James Lamsdell said. "I wouldn't have wanted to be swimming with it. There's something about bugs.



When they're a certain size, they shouldn't be allowed to get bigger." This creature is named Pentecopterus decorahensis after an ancient Greek warship and is not a bug by science definitions, Dr. Lamsdell said. It's part of the eurypterid family. Those type of creatures "are really cool," said Joe Hannibal, curator of invertebrate paleontology at the Cleveland Museum of Natural History. Hannibal wasn't part of the study, but praised it for being well done,

adding "this species is not particularly bizarre for a eurypterid." Unlike modern land scorpions, this creature's tail didn't sting. It was used more for balance and in swimming, but half this creature's length was tail, Dr. Lamsdell said. There were larger sea scorpions halfway around the world at the same time but those were more bottom feeders instead of dominant predators, he said. "It was obviously a very aggressive animal," he said. "It was a big angry bug."

Cheaper, better LED technology on the way



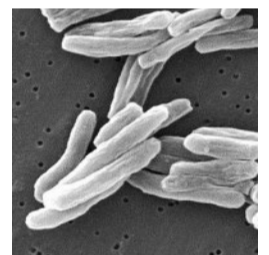
New York, Sept 1
Scientists including one of Indian origin have developed a new highly efficient and low cost light emitting diode that could help spur more widespread adoption of the LED technology. "It can potentially revolutionise lighting technology. In general, the cost of LED lighting has been a big concern thus far. Energy savings have not balanced out high costs. The new discovery could change that," explained

Zhibin Yu, assistant professor of industrial and manufacturing engineering at Florida State University. Yu developed this technology with a team that included post-doctoral researcher Junqiang Li and graduate students Sri Ganesh Bade and Xin Shan. Yu developed this new LED technology using a combination of organic and inorganic materials. The material, which dissolves and can be applied like paint, shines a blue, green or red

light and can be used to make a light bulb. But what makes it really special is that it's far simpler to manufacture than existing products in the market. Most LED materials require engineers to put four or five layers of material on top of each other to create the desired product or effect. Yu's material only requires one layer. "In the future to manufacture, it is a big challenge if you have to deal with multiple layers," he added. The research is crucial to the development of LED technology which is fast becoming an avenue to reduce the country's electricity consumption. LED lighting is already sold in stores, but widespread adoption has been slow because of the costs associated with the material and the quality.

Promise of a better anti-tuberculosis therapy

Bengaluru, Sept 1
Understanding stress and methods to relieve stress in microbes could eventually lead to effective drugs against mycobacteria - a family of bacteria that cause a range of infections and diseases including tuberculosis. Just as humans destress through music, food or holidays, the single-cell bacteria too destresses when it 'recognises' factors that cause it stress. Among the key proteins in action during times of stress is 'Rel' protein, which was studied in detail by Dipankar Chatterji and his group from the Molecular Biophysics Unit at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru. In a paper published recently in the Federation of European Biochemical Societies Journal, the team unravels the working of the Rel protein in



Mycobacterium smegmatis - a cousin of the harmful tuberculosis-causing strain. Currently, when faced with an atmosphere of antibiotics, pathogens such as mycobacteria produce 'alarmones' like guanosine tetraphosphate (ppGpp) and guanosine pentaphosphate (pppGpp). These compounds slow down the growth rate of the bacteria - in the same manner that the human body slows down all but its essential processes during cold or heat - and allows the bacteria to adapt to unfavourable conditions.

Having worked on the protein for over 15 years, Dr. Chatterji has identified a novel site in the Rel protein that binds to its product pppGpp. When the alarmone levels produced by the bacteria reach a threshold, pppGpp binds itself to Rel enzyme and shuts down the production of fresh alarmones. The identification of the binding site has tremendous value for anti-tuberculosis therapy, says Dr. Chatterji. By synthesising the exact residues in the enzyme that is used by pppGpp to bring alarmone synthesis to a halt, the stress response of the bacteria can be effectively halted. "In 2012, a drug against Rel was introduced, but it works only at very high concentrations. We think there is a tremendous opportunity to improve these drugs," he says.

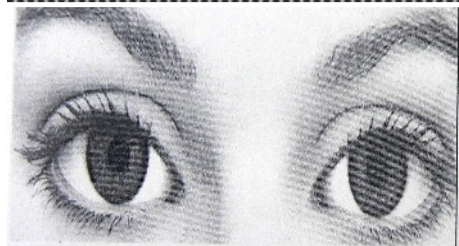

22-year wait ends as India create history on Lankan soil with series win

Colombo, Sept 1
India sealed the Test series with a 117-run victory win against hosts Sri Lanka, ending a winless run of 22 years in the island nation.

Indian bowlers could wind up the gritty Sri Lankan side with the second new ball after tea on the last day of the Test.

The visitors wrapped by the Sri Lankan innings on 268, but not before captain Angelo Mathews and debutant Kushal Perera gave the Indians a scare with a 135-run partnership. When Ashwin induced a false shot from Perera just before the second new ball was due, flood gates opened and the tail failed to wag for the hosts.

The 2-1 Test victory for India came after many twists and turns, where the young Indian side led by Virat Kohli on his first full tour as captain, had to master difficult conditions and tight situations. Cheteshwar Pujara was named the man of the Match and Ravichandran Ashwin, with highest number of wickets by any bowler, was the man of the



series. The three test match series in Sri Lanka was historic for a number of reasons. The first match at Galle saw the batting collapse of young Indian side in the fourth innings on Independence Day after being in total control for most of that match. The match will however be remembered for being the last Test of Kumara Sangakkara, the gentleman cricketer from Sri Lanka, and a role model for many around the world. The third match in Colombo began on an inauspicious note, with almost entire first day being wiped out by rain. But from the second day

on, a great battle for supremacy, and for the series, ensued. India were put in a dominant position by Chateshwar Pujara with an unbeaten knock of 145 in his comeback match. The visitors got a handsome first innings lead due to great bowling from all the bowlers, particularly by Ishant Sharma. Today, on the last day, Sri Lanka fought hard till tea, with captain Angelo Mathews leading from the front. However, wily Ashwin and fiery Sharma put paid to their heroics and India won a memorable series victory in Sri Lanka after a gap of 22 years.

Devendro Singh in Asian semis, qualifies for World Championships

Bangkok, Sept 1
Commonwealth Games silver-medallist L. Devendro Singh (49kg) assured himself of a medal and a place in the upcoming World Championships by storming into the Asian Championships semifinal here on Tuesday.

Devendro, a silver-medallist from the previous edition of the event, out-punched Cornelis Kwangu Langu of Indonesia 3-0 in his quarterfinal bout. He will square off against top-seeded Uzbek Hasanboy Dusmatov in the semifinals. Today's win assured Devendro of a place in the October World Championships -- the first qualifying event for next year's Rio Olympics.

"He boxed extremely well today. It was a very dominant performance and even though he faces a very tough opponent in the next round, he might just surprise everybody given the form that he is in," national coach Gurbax Singh Sandhu told PTI. The pint-sized dynamo was his

usual aggressive self, using his right uppercuts and hooks with precision in all three rounds. What stood out today was the Manipuri's control. Known to be a tempo boxer, Devendro's aggression wasn't completely no holds barred.

The nimble-footed pugilist used the uppercuts to break Langu's shell guard and did the scoring with hooks and jabs to advance in the Championship.

Serena Williams into U.S. Open second round

New York, Sept 1
Serena Williams was not tested one bit by a woman who appeared overwhelmed by her opponent, the occasion and, to make matters worse, an injured left foot. Williams moved a step closer to tennis' first calendar-year Grand Slam since 1988 without much of a workout, reaching the second round when 86-ranked Vitalia Diatchenko of Russia stopped playing while behind 6-0, 2-0.

Centre allocates Rs 410 crore for drought affected districts

New Delhi, Sep 1
Centre has allocated 410 crores rupees during the current year under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana to minimize the impact of drought and improving the ground water recharge in the country. The decision has been taken in view of gravity of perennial problem of longer dry spells resulting in drought and rapid depletion of ground water table. Of Rs 410 crore, 69 crores have been allocated for Rajasthan, over 64 crores Tamil Nadu, over 46 crores Punjab and around 41 crores Karnataka. About Rs 21 crore will go to Maharashtra and over Rs 17 crore to Bihar. 219 districts in the country

have been frequently affected by drought in the recent past and witnessing regular agrarian crisis. In view of this, the government for the first time identified the most vulnerable areas that require immediate attention for water conservation, harvesting and

ground water recharge. The government has decided to give special treatment to improve the condition of underground water, soil moisture and create micro water storages in these areas under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana.

India emerges as 8th largest tourism market for Australia

Melbourne, Sep 1
India has emerged as the 8th largest tourism market for Australia with over 2 lakh Indians visiting the country previous year. The total number of Indian visiting Australia this year was 2,07,000. In Melbourne, Australian Trade Minister Mr Andrew Robb said that

India was one of the fastest growing markets. Mr. Andrew said that the result demonstrates that tourism is one of its strengths. He said that tourism can be its fastest growing sector this decade if it continues to leverage on the 'clean, green and safe' brand to position itself for tourism.
