## PM Modi asks tax administrators to fix clear targets to improve country's tax administration

New Delhi, Sept 1

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has asked tax administrators to fix clear targets to improve the country's tax administration by 2022. He said, the government is working towards creation of an environment which shatters the confidence of the corrupt, and instills confidence among the honest taxpayers.

Inaugurating the Rajasva Gyan Sangam at New Delhi today, Shri Modi mentioned steps taken by the government including demonetization, and implementation of stringent laws against black money and benami property. He said, human interface must be kept to a minimum in the tax administration's dealings and asked for a push to e-assessment so that vested interests do not impede the due process of law.

Mentioning the benefits of the GST, Shri Modi said, besides economic integration and transparency in the system, over 17 lakh new traders have been brought into the indirect tax system within two months. He said, there is a need to work towards ensuring that all traders including even relatively smaller ones register with the GST system. He also expressed dismay at the huge pendency of tax-related cases in adjudication and appeal.

The Prime Minister said, big sums of money that is locked up in these cases, could have been used for the welfare of the poor. He also asked officers to come up with an action plan to eliminate pendency.

**Youth Sports Centre to come up at Alipur, Delhi: Sports Minister**

New Delhi, Sept 1 Minister of State (I/C) for Youth Affairs and Sports Shri Vijay Goel has announced that a new Youth Sports Centre to be built at Alipur, Delhi. Announcing this here today he said there is an aspiration amongst the youth of rural Delhi to have a State of the Art Youth Sports Centre at par with best facilities in the city since no such facility exists in rural Delhi. He said, the project has been envisioned so that maximum rural youth can avail the facility for their overall development and promotion of sports in rural areas of the capital. Shri Goel said the proposed Centre will come up on the NYKS land adjacent to Swami Shradhanand College of Delhi University. NYKS has a

land measuring about 11 acre out of which 8 acre will be utilized for the Sports Centre. Shri Goel said the complex will have State of the art sports facilities such as football ground, an Athletic track, as well as volley ball, kabaddi and kho-kho facilities besides a multipurpose indoor hall for training players in Boxing & wrestling. A modern gym will also be developed. SAI will create SAI training centre at this complex in the next three years. He said this will have a 200 bed Youth Hostel and facilities for providing training for Youth Leadership, Skill Development, Life Skills, National Integration, Cultural and Folk Art activities and will also have an Information facility for providing relevant information to the

youth about the Flagship Schemes of Govt. of India for their development and welfare. In a unique arrangement both Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS) and Sports Authority of India (SAI) will jointly create and run this unique Youth Sports Centre. This centre will provide for over all fitness and personality Development for youth, Career guidance as well as identification of sports talent for further grooming at National Level. The entire facility will be used for multiple purposes by both the organizations i.e. NYKS & SAI. Apart from the same, the facility will also be used for local community development. An amount of about Rs. 20 crore will be spent on the project.

**Sindhu, Saina, Srikanth felicitated by Sports Minister**

New Delhi, Sept 1 India's star shuttlers PV Sindhu, Saina Nehwal and Kidambi Srikanth were felicitated by Sports Minister Vijay Goel on Thursday for their fine show at the recently concluded Badminton World Championship held at Glasgow. Sindhu settled for silver after narrowly missing out to finish on top against Nozomi Okuhara of Japan in a nerve-wrecking one hour 50 minutes final at the Emirates Arena at Glasgow, UK, on Sunday. Saina bagged a hard earned bronze, going down to the 2016 Olympic bronze medalist in an intense 74-minute battle on Saturday. The Indonesian and Australian Open Champion Srikanth ran out of his winning streak in the quarter-finals, losing against top seed Son Wan Ho of South Korea in 48 minutes on Friday. Saina spoke on the development of badminton in the country and said: "Our sport is developing in the

country, it is getting popular. It is not difficult to produce champions due to the facilities." Srikanth thanked his coach Pulella Gopichand and said: "I want to thank Gopi sir, got to learn a lot from the quarter-final loss." Coaches Vimal Kumar and Gopichand were also felicitated

by the Sports Minister for playing a major role in development of the shuttlers. Sindhu and Gopichand also went to meet Vice President of India M Venkaiah Naidu, who extended his wishes and praised the shuttler for winning the silver medal in the World Championships.

**Bopanna, Mirza advance to second round in US Open**

New York, Sep 1 India's leading doubles players Rohan Bopanna and Sania Mirza began their US Open campaigns with victories in their respective events, albeit, in contrasting fashion here. Bopanna and Uruguay's Pablo Cuevas shrugged off a surprise first set lapse to regroup and beat American pair of Bradley Klahn and Scott Lipsky 1-6 6-3 6-4 in the opening round of the men's doubles event. In the second round they face the Italian team of Simone

Bolelli and Fabio Fognini. In the women's doubles, Mirza and her Chinese partner Shuai Peng overcame the challenge of Croatian team of Petra Martic and Donna Vekic in the opening round. It took the Indo-Chinese pair just 55 minutes to cross the first hurdle. Mirza and Peng broke their rivals four times but also dropped their serve once in the match. They next face Slovakia's Jana Cepelova and Magdalena Rybarikova.

New Delhi, Sept 1 Indian women's football team jumped four places to be ranked 56th in the recently-released FIFA rankings. India are now placed 13th in Asia, sandwiched between Iran and Hong Kong. "Development of women's football is one of our priorities

and it's heartening to see the women's team rise in FIFA rankings. Congratulations," AIFF general secretary Kushal Das said. National coach Maymol Rocky said, "We've seen successes as well as have faced quite a few tough competitions of late. The rise in FIFA Rankings

reflects our hard work which is being put in by the team relentlessly." "Bringing in new blood and creating competition for places in the team has been a process and I'm pleased we are moving in the right direction," she added. The next FIFA rankings will be published on December 15, 2017.

**Ronaldo scores 3 in Portugal win, passes Pele in goals table**

Porto, Sep 1 Cristiano Ronaldo scored a hat trick to move past Pele on the list of all-time international goalscorers as Portugal beat Faeroe Islands 5-1 to stay close to Switzerland at the top of Group B in World Cup European qualifying. Ronaldo netted with a neat volley from inside the area then added two other goals to surpass the Brazil great and move into second place on the list of Europe's all-time scorers with 78 goals. He's six behind Hungary great Ferenc Puskas. Pele scored 77 goals for Brazil. Switzerland stayed perfect in qualifying by defeating Andorra 3-0 in a match interrupted by poor pitch conditions under heavy rain in St. Gallen. The Swiss reached 21 points, three more than second-placed Portugal, and is guaranteed to finish first or second in the group. The winner automatically qualifies



for the 2018 World Cup in Russia, while the runner-up has to go through a playoff. Hungary stayed a distant third with 10 points after defeating last-

placed Latvia 3-1 at home. Ronaldo scored twice in the first half and once after the break to reach 14 goals in seven Group B matches.
