President appoints 5 new Governors & 1 Lt Governor

Prof. Jagdish Mukhi to be Governor of Assam; Admiral (Retd) DK Joshi appointed Lieutenant Governor of A&N Islands

New Delhi, Oct 1

The President, Shri Ram Nath Kovind on Saturday appointed five Governors for the States of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Meghalaya and Tamil Nadu. New Lieutenant Governor for Andaman and Nicobar Islands was also appointed. A statement from the President's Office said the appointments will come into effect from the date the incumbents assume charge of the new posts.

Shri Banwarilal Purohit was appointed as the Governor of Tamil Nadu while Shri Satyapal Malik would be the new Governor of Bihar.

Prof. Jagdish Mukhi will take the place of Shri Purohit as the Assam Governor. Former Member of Bihar Legislative Council Shri Ganga Prasad has been appointed as the Governor of Meghalaya. Brig (Retd) BD Mishra will be the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, the release said.

Admiral (Retd) Devendra Kumar Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM, will be the Lt. Governor of Andaman and Nicobar Islands in place of Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, a press release issued by the President's Office said. Admiral (Retd.) Devendra Kumar Joshi was the Chief of Naval Staff between August 2012 and February 2014. An alumnus of the National

Defence Academy, he joined the executive branch of the Indian Navy in 1974. He is a Graduate of the US Naval War College, and an alumnus of Mumbai's College of Naval Warfare. He has been awarded the Param Vishist Seva Medal, Ati Vishist Seva Medal, Yudd Seva Medal, Nausena Medal and the Vishist Seva Medal. Admiral Joshi has also

served as Deputy Chief of the Naval Staff, Commander-in-Chief of the Andaman and Nicobar Island Command, and Chief of the Integrated Defence Staff to the Chairman of the Chiefs of Staff Committee. He was a Defence Adviser in the Indian High Commission in Singapore from 1996 to 1999. He also commanded the Vizag-based Eastern Fleet of the Navy.

Saina Nehwal, PV Sindhu, Kidambi Srikanth get direct entry into National Championship quarters



New Delhi, Oct 1
The Badminton Association of India (BAI) has decided that all players ranked in top 50 in the BWF World Rankings will get direct entry into quarter-finals of the upcoming National Championship, which for the first time will be Rs. 1 crore prize money event. This will effectively mean that country's top shuttlers like World Championship silver medallist PV Sindhu (world No 2), bronze medallist Saina Nehwal (world No 12) will only be seen in action from the last eight stage. Ditto for the likes of Kidambi Srikanth (No 8), HS Prannoy (no 15), B Sai

Praneeth (No 17), Sameer Verma (No 19) and Ajay Jayaram (No 20) in the men's section. BAI president Himanta Biswa Sarma said: "It will be mandatory for all the top ranked players to participate in the event. Those players who are in the world top-50, would get a direct entry into quarterfinals. However it will be limited to a maximum of eight slots out of a total of 16." Sarma also announced scholarships for the upcoming players, who are facing financial constraints. "Most of the times, good talented players drop out of the game due to financial constraints. Hence to support such players,

we will be providing a scholarship of Rs 25,000-50,000 per month for about 20 juniors to begin with, and take the number upto 100." Sarma also said that BAI will be dealing with any kind of age-fraud in a tough manner. "We want to erase this over-age issue by conducting the tests well before the season so that no one should undergo the mental trauma during a tournament or a camp. If a player is found overage, we will put him/her in the next category as we think the parents are the culprits rather than the players themselves," he concluded.

Chile team arrive in Kolkata for FIFA U-17 World Cup

Kolkata, Oct 1
A 21-member Chile national team arrived in Kolkata on Sunday to take part in the FIFA Under-17 World Cup, commencing on October 6 across six cities in India. Coached by former Argentine goalkeeper Hernan Caputo and his support staff, the Chile team touched down at the International Airport here this morning and checked into a plush hotel in the city. Chile are placed in Group F along with England, Iraq and Mexico and will play all of their

group matches at the revamped Salt Lake Stadium in Kolkata, which will also host the final on October 28. The Chileans, who left home late night on September 29, landed here around 8.20am. But despite the jet-lag they are scheduled to hit ground in the evening on Sunday. In their final build-up game, the La Roja U-17 team defeated Bolivia 2-0 on September 22 in Rancagua, at the same venue where they made the World Cup cut by finishing runners-up in the South

American U-17 Championship. This would be Chile's fourth appearance at a FIFA U-17 World Cup and their second in a row after hosting the tournament in 2015, where they made it to the last 16 stage. They had made their tournament debut in Japan in 1993, where they surprised everyone by finishing third, their best performance till date. Chile will open their campaign at the upcoming tournament against England on October 8.

Caroline Wozniacki seals spot in season-ending WTA Finals

Singapore, Oct 1
Former world number one Caroline Wozniacki became the sixth player to qualify for the season-ending WTA Finals in Singapore, the WTA said on Sunday. The Dane, who defended her Pan Pacific title in Tokyo last week and reached six other finals this year, joins Garbine Muguruza, Simona Halep, Karolina Pliskova, Elina Svitolina and Venus Williams in Singapore with two spots left. Wozniacki, who will make her fifth appearance at the October 22-29 event, reached the final in 2010 when Doha hosted the WTA Finals. "I'm very excited that I've qualified for the WTA Finals again," the 27-year-old



Wozniacki said in a statement. "I have such great memories of the tournament, especially from 2010, and I can't wait to get to back to Singapore and play my best tennis in front of the amazing fans there." The top eight singles players at the \$7 million prize money event will face off in a round-

robin format for the Billie Jean King Trophy. The eight best doubles teams will battle for the Martina Navratilova Trophy in a knockout format. Wozniacki, who has 26 career titles, is due to play local hope Wang Qiang in the first round of the China Open later on Sunday in Beijing.

Female assistant referee to be seen in U-17 World Cup for first time

New Delhi, Oct 1
The U-17 World Cup will set a record of sorts as it will see for the first time a female assistant referee in a FIFA men's competition this time. FIFA, the world governing body of football, said it's time for elite female support referees to be involved in a men's competition. The FIFA said, for the first-ever time, they have selected female referees for a men's tournament. FIFA's Head of Refereeing Massimo Busacca said, the results and improvements seen in the joint preparations have shown the time has come for

elite female referees to officiate in men's competitions together with their male colleagues. Seven female assistant referees from across the world, one from each continent, have been chosen by FIFA along with 70 male referees to officiate the 52 matches in the FIFA U-17 World Cup to be played in six Indian cities from October 6-28. Meanwhile, 16 AIFF match officials, comprising eight referees and eight assistant referees, have been given a lifetime opportunity to train with the 77 enlisted FIFA officials who will be in charge during the U-17 World Cup.



Aadhaar Enrolment Centre set up in 'Andaman Bazar'

Port Blair, Oct 1
The Department of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs has set up an Aadhaar Enrolment Centre in the 'Andaman Bazar', from Oct. 1 to 4 at ITF Ground, Port Blair. The main focus of this centre would be towards online enrolment of children in the age group 0-5 years through Child Enrolment Lite Client (Tab based enrolment). Other services

like enrolment of residents above 5 years, demographic corrections in Aadhaar database and biometric updation through offline mode will also be available at this centre. Therefore, all the residents who are yet to enroll for Aadhaar have been requested to come forward for registration. All those parents who

have kids below 5 years and yet to enroll for Aadhaar have been appealed to bring their kids at the centre for online enrolment in a hassle free manner. Electricity Dept clarifies about power cut

Port Blair, Oct 1
During day hours of 29.9.2017, power supply in many places in Port Blair and surrounding of South Andaman got interrupted due to failure of 33 kV HT Switchgear Panel in 10 MW Hiring Plant (HPP) at Phoenix Bay Power House Complex. The panel failed because of heavy rain & moistures causing short circuit & flashover and total grid failure. The repairing work was done temporarily on 29.9.2017 and normal power supply resumed. The permanent repair could not be carried out as complete shutdown

of 10 MW HPP was required to repair the damaged panel. On 30.9.2017, the 10 MW HPP was taken shutdown at 0520 hrs. and the damaged panel & cables were repaired. The plant was restarted at about 1130 hrs. on 30.9.2017 and normal power supply restored. Due to the above mentioned shutdown and repair works power supply was interrupted from 0520 hrs. to 1130 hrs. on 30.9.2017, in Port Blair and South Andaman area on one-hour rotational basis, an Electricity Dept communiqué said.

New Model Charkhas and semi automatic looms at the District Jail, Prothrapur. The programme is expected to be successful due to the possibility of less overhead expenses including labour charges involved in mass production of khadi fabrics at jail. Once the programme is implemented successfully and production starts, the ultimate produce of the District Jail could be extended marketing support through the departmental sales outlet of KG Bhavan, being the indigenous khadi products of A&N Islands, produced by the inmates. Accordingly, 2 Semi Automatic looms and five 8-spindle New Model Charkhas have been brought from M/s Ambar Utpadan and Research Centre, Rajkot, Gujarat (a KVIC certified institution) and are being installed at the District Jail, Prothrapur under the overall supervision of a Mechanic / Production In-charge from the said institute. The mechanic will also impart practical training regarding operation of the looms and Charkhas to the inmates of the District Jail, Prothrapur for a duration of 10 days, a communication said.
