Centre notifies rules for Real Estate Act in UTs including A&N Islands

New Delhi, Nov 1 The Centre has notified the rules for Real Estate Act that seeks to regulate the housing sector besides bringing transparency and ensuring timely completion of projects in five Union Territories. An official release said in New Delhi that the rules notified by the Housing Ministry will be applicable to Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Chandigarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Daman and Diu, and Lakshadweep. Ministry of Urban Development will come out with such rules for the National Capital Region of Delhi while the other States and UTs will come out with their own rules. The Act,

which is touted as a major reform measure to regulate the vast real estate sector, requires registration of all projects with state-level Real Estate Regulatory Authorities to ensure protection of the interests of both buyers and builders.



Govt. formulating national policy to reduce alcohol dependency

New Delhi, Nov 1 The Centre is working on formulation of a national policy to address the emerging challenge of alcohol dependency in the country, especially among youth. Official source said in New Delhi that the proposed policy is being developed by the Social

Justice Ministry specifically to tackle the problem of alcohol dependence, a psychiatric disorder in which an individual is physically or psychologically dependent upon drinking alcohol. The aim is to mobilise communities to adopt effective approaches

to prevent and reduce harmful use of alcohol, reduce the harm to public health and social consequences from alcohol intoxication, and consumption of illicit liquor. Alcohol is one of the largest risk factor for various disease, accounting for close to three million deaths.

Port Blair, Nov 1 The Election Commission of India has announced the schedule for Special Summary Revision of the Photo Electoral Roll w.r.t. Jan 1st, 2017 with a view to prepare an accurate and error free electoral roll besides registration of all eligible persons especially youth, females and other

marginalized sections of the society. The electors, whose date of birth is on or before 01/01/1999 and are not enrolled in the Electoral roll till date are eligible to file their claims for inclusion in the ongoing revision process with the qualifying date Jan 01st, 2017.

As per the schedule, the final electoral roll is to be published on 14th January, 2017 (Saturday). The Chief Electoral Officer, A&N Islands, Shri Udit Prakash Rai has requested all political parties and general public to inspect the electoral roll for filing claims and objections and for updating the electoral roll. In order to ensure

hassle free enrolment of the general public a Toll Free No. 1950 has been setup which will function on all working days from 9 am to 5 pm. They can also register their names online by logging on to ECI's website www.nvsp.in, the CEO said in his appeal.

India v England: Indian squad for England Tests to be picked today

Mumbai, Nov 1
Fit-again pacer Ishant Sharma is likely to make a comeback when the national selection committee meets on Wednesday to pick the Indian team for the upcoming Test series against England commencing on November 9. Although India trounced New Zealand 3-0 in the previous Test rubber, the selection panel, headed by MSK Prasad, will have quite a few things to consider before naming the team for what would be a five-match affair. Injury to opener KL Rahul in the opening Test at Kanpur and the indisposition of Ishant gave the selectors an opportunity to recall veteran opener Gautam Gambhir and offspinner Jayant Yadav for the second Test at Kolkata. Gambhir did not play at Eden Gardens but got a chance to renew his interrupted career after a two-year gap when Shikhar Dhawan suffered a finger injury at Kolkata and was ruled out of the third and final Test at Indore. Karun Nair was included in Dhawan's place in the squad but did not make the playing eleven. Yadav also did not figure in either match. The Indian squad is set to assemble in Rajkot, which is to host a first-ever Test, on November 5 evening, BCCI sources added. The other Tests are slated to be held in Vishakhapatnam (Nov 17-21), Mohali (Nov 26-30), Mumbai (Dec 8-12) and Chennai (Dec 16-20).

Team India, Ravichandran Ashwin continue to lead ICC Test rankings

Dubai, Nov 1
There was no change at the top of ICC Test rankings for teams and bowlers as India and its premier off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin held on to their numero uno spots respectively. India led the team's table with 115 points ahead of arch-rivals Pakistan (111) and Australia (108). England were at fourth place followed by South Africa, Sri Lanka, New Zealand, West Indies with Bangladesh and Zimbabwe completing the list. Ashwin maintained his position with 900 points, with South African pace spearhead Dale Steyn (878) and England's James Anderson (853) completing the top three. Ashwin's spin partner Ravindra Jadeja was at seventh place with 805 points. Ashwin was also leading the

all-rounders' table with 451 points, with Jadeja occupying the fifth position with 292 points. Ajinkya Rahane was the top-ranked Indian batsman at sixth with 825 points, while Cheteshwar Pujara and skipper Virat Kohli moved up a place each to 14th and 16th spots respectively. Australia captain Steve Smith is leading the table as the number-one ranked batsman, while South Africa's Hashim Amla is ranked third. England's

Joe Root has dropped out of the top three. He has slipped two places to fifth. Bangladesh teenage spin sensation Mehedi Hasan has rocketed into 33rd position in the MRF Tyres rankings for Test bowlers. Bangladesh's 108 runs victory in Mirpur has also earned the youngest of the 10 Test playing countries eight ranking points. This means it is now on 65 points, just two points behind eighth-ranked West Indies.

92-Year-Old Wins Gold At World Masters Athletic Championships

Perth, Nov 1
In a first, a 92-year-old Indian Navy veteran has won a gold medal in a 5,000-metres race walk at the World Masters Athletics Championships being held in Perth. Commodore V Sriramulu

(Retd), a veteran settled in Visakhapatnam, has won the Gold Medal in the Race Walk event in the age group of 90-95 years. He is also participating in two other race walks - one of 10 kms and another of 20 kms this week.

The claims and objection shall be disposed by 15th December 2016 (Thursday) by AEROS.

All political parties and general public are requested to inspect the electoral roll for filing claims and objections and for updating the electoral roll.
