SC asks all States, UTs to set up trauma centre in every district

New Delhi, Dec 1 The Supreme Court has issued a slew of directions on road safety and asked all States and the Union Territories to set up a trauma centre in every district of the country. It also asked to make safety norms part of school curriculum.

A bench headed by Justice M B Lokur asked the states, which have not formulated the Road Safety Policy, to frame it by January end next year and implement it with all

seriousness. The bench said State Governments and Union Territories should take up this recommendation at the earliest as treatment soon after a road accident is crucial for saving the life of the victim.

The bench also called for strict implementation of the Motor Vehicles (Driving) Regulations, 2017 issued by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways on June 23 this year. The

Power paucity in South Andaman Govt. establishments urged to minimize usage of power during peak hours

Port Blair, Dec. 1 The alternators of two DG sets at IPP have developed technical faults, due to which the sets have become non functional w.e.f Nov. 25, 2017. This has led to severe paucity of power demand of the order of 7-8 MW in Port Blair and

other areas of South Andaman. In view of this, the Electricity Department has prepared a detailed demand side management to ensure optimal utilization of the available power. The Department has appealed to all Govt. establishments/buildings

to switch of the Air Conditioners (AC) during peak hours from 5 pm to 11 pm. The AC, if used during day hours shall be set at 26 C and usage of ceiling fan has been advised for even distribution of cool air. The AC should be used

Administration revises scheme for distribution of fortified wheat flour in Isles PDS beneficiaries can lodge complaints over toll free no: 18003453197

Port Blair, Dec. 1

The A&N Administration has revised the scheme for distribution of fortified wheat flour/atta in this UT of Andaman and Nicobar Islands based on the consumption trend w.e.f 1st December, 2017. Taking into cognizance the revised policy framed by the Govt. of India, the wastage involved during handling/

conversion of wheat into wheat flour and the FPS Dealers commission as incorporated under the National Food Security Act, 2013 (NFSA) as well as transportation cost upto the FPS, is included in the end retail price. Since, the NFSA beneficiaries are under-privileged, the Administration has decided to cross subsidize

the expenditure involved during this process on to the Above Poverty Line (APL) beneficiaries. The wheat flour/atta shall now be issued in packed form of 920g, 1860g & 4600g as against the earlier packages of 1 kg, 2kg and 5 kg denominations respectively, as per the rate & quantity specified under-

Indian archers bag 3 gold, 4 silver & 2 bronze medals at Asian C'ships

Dhaka, Dec 1
Indian archers produced an impressive performance, grabbing three gold, four silver and two bronze medals at the Asian Championships in Dhaka yesterday. Two Indian boys and girls also booked quota places for the 2018 Youth Olympics. The tournament also serves as the precursor to 2018 Youth Olympics in Buenos Aires. 15-year-old Haryana girl Himani Kumari defeated her Mongolian opponent Bayasgalan Badamjuiani 7-1 in the recurve cadet bronze play-off to bag the quota. In an all-Indian cadet recurve final, 14-year-old Akash, also from



Haryana, defeated Dhiraj Bommadevara of Andhra Pradesh 6-4 to bag the boys quota for the Youth Olympics in Argentina. India also bagged two gold medals in the non-Olympic compound discipline. Abhishek Verma beat Korean rival Kim

Jongho to win the gold and prevent a clean sweep of individual crowns by Korea. Indian women's compound team of Jyothi Surekha Vennam, Trisha Deb and Parveena beat So Chaewon, Choi Bomin and Song Yun Soo 230-227 to win the gold medal.

India enter quarterfinal of WSF World men's team squash C'ship

Marseille, Dec 1
Mahesh Manganekar did the star turn as eighth seed India edged out seventh seed Germany 2-1 and moved to the quarterfinal of the WSF World men's team squash championship in Marseille, France.



Facing an unsure opponent in Valentin Rapp, Mahesh controlled the volleys and varied the drives to eventually carve out a comfortable 11-6, 11-7, 11-4 win yesterday in 31 minutes to bring joy to the Indian camp. After Vikram Singh had put India one up with his fluent 11-8, 11-1, 11-8 win over

Rudi Rohmuller, the focus shifted to the clash between the two number one players Saurav Ghosal and Simon Rosner. It was a close battle with fortunes oscillating either way.

Both players traded two games each and in the decisive fifth game, Ghosal looked a spent force. Rosner ran away with the game and the match 11-9, 4-11, 11-5, 6-11, 11-3 to restore parity.

HS Prannoy feels top-10 ranking would fetch good draw in big tournaments

Mumbai, Dec 1
India's number two men's singles player, H S Prannoy, feels a high ranking would help players avoid meeting top shuttlers in early rounds, while conceding that the primary focus should be on winning big events. "After a certain period it's not about rankings but about winning tournaments. But a lot



relies on rankings. If you need a good draw in major tournaments you need to be ranked in the top ten. Otherwise you will run into the top seed in the first or second round and that will dampen your spirits," said Prannoy here today.

Prannoy, who has reached the world no 10 rank for the first time in his career, spoke to reporters after being announced as member of debutants Ahmedabad Smash Masters in the third Premier Badminton League commencing on December 23.

minimal even during day hours. Further, the Govt. buildings must also ensure that LED lamps are used for lighting besides optimal utilization of light in office premises and unnecessary lighting may be switched off. The DSS, PMB, PBMC and Pradhans have been asked to avoid using high mast lights during peak hours. In case of operation of high mast light is essential for DSS/PMB, load of high mast should be put on standby DG sets as far as possible. Similarly, all Govt. buildings functioning from 8.30 am to 5 pm or beyond and are installed with standby DG sets, shall meet their own requirement by running the DG sets.

The Executive Engineer concerned shall form teams to ensure that the directions are being followed and personal monitoring for effective compliance. Surprise checks shall be carried out by the respective Executive Engineers to ensure its compliance. The effective demand side management will reduce the quantum of load shedding, a communication from the SE, Electricity Department said here.

maintain extremely accurate flying parameters. IAF is one of the few Air Forces in the world to demonstrate this capability and the Embraer AEW&C has also proved its prowess in the category. A mere 10 minute in-flight refuelling can generate additional four hours of flying endurance. The achievement has given a tremendous boost to Indian Air Force's operational capability.
