Insolvency & Bankruptcy Code Amendment Bill passed

New Delhi, Jan 2 Parliament has passed the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (Amendment) Bill, 2017 with approval by Rajya Sabha today.

The Bill prohibits certain persons from submitting a resolution plan in case of defaults. **No charges on debit card transactions up to Rs. 2,000**

New Delhi, Jan 2 Customers will not have to pay any transaction charges for payments through debit card, BHIM app and other payment made for up to Rs 2,000.

Last month, Union Cabinet approved a proposal that government will bear the merchant discount rate (MDR) charges on transactions up to Rs 2,000 made through debit cards, BHIM UPI or Aadhaar-enabled payment systems to promote digital transactions.

Andaman Islands stands at No. 3 in the list of 20 must visit destinations in 2018. It rates Turkey's Turquoise Coast in No. 1 and Rwanda in No 2. Sea is a dreamy shade of turquoise.

Pure white sands fringe rainforest that is home to a rich profusion of wildlife. It all sounds suitably idyllic to be the Seychelles or Mauritius, but India's remote Andaman archipelago ticks even more boxes of blissed-out delight.

Swachh Survekshan-2018 launched Sanitation in all 4,041 cities & towns of the country to be assessed

New Delhi, Jan 2 Central Government has launched 'Swachh Survekshan-2018' to rank all the 4,041 cities and towns of the country based on infrastructure development for improved sanitation services and their sustainability, outcomes, citizen connect and visible impact on ground.

Minister of Housing & Urban Affairs Shri Narendra Singh Tomar launched the survey, the third in the series and released a comprehensive

Survey Tool Kit, explaining the methodology, weightages and new features and thrust areas that helps cities and towns prepare for the field survey over the next six months.

Shri Tomar said that this first Pan-India sanitation survey will assess sanitation levels in all the cities and towns of the country impacting the lives of about 40 crore urban people and is the largest of its kind in the world. He said the results of two previous such surveys announced in

2016 and 2017 have generated substantial excitement and enthusiasm among the cities and towns citizens besides promoting a healthy competition among all the stakeholders, leading to expanding the scope of the survey to all urban areas of the country. The Minister informed that the methodology and weightages for Swachh Surekshan-2018 have been modified to certain extent based on extensive consultations with city and state governments, experts and other stakeholders

and in line with the progress of Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban).

The Survey Methodology seeks to capture the efforts under and outcomes of Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban) as the cities move on from building toilets towards Solid Waste Management with emphasis on decentralized solutions, ensuring sustainability of improved sanitation infrastructure and services and enforcement.

The companies were given a six-month deadline to comply with the new rule. In a statement, the Ministry said the amendments were made to safeguard the interest of online consumers and for ease of doing business. The amendments came into force yesterday.

Mumbai, Jan 2
Mumbai batsman Prithvi Shaw will lead India at the Under-19 World Cup to be held in New Zealand from January 13. Punjab's Shubman Gill, who was the top scorer in the Youth ODI series in England earlier this year at an average of 92.66, has been named as Shaw's deputy. The 15-member squad also includes Haryana's Himanshu Rana and Assam's Riyan Parag along with five stand-by players, all of whom are set to participate in a preparatory camp in Bengaluru from December 8 to 22.

Seven of the 15 players in the squad have experience of playing Ranji Trophy. Shaw, who is Mumbai's second-highest scorer this season with 521 runs at 57.88, and Bengal's Ishan Porel, who has bagged 10 wickets in two matches have been permitted to play for their respective sides in the quarter-finals starting December 7, and will join the camp on December 12. India have won the Under-19 title thrice, a record they hold together with Australia. They made the final of the previous edition in Bangladesh but lost to West Indies by five wickets.

World number one Simona Halep swatted aside American Nicole Gibbs while Maria Sharapova was flawless in her straight sets victory over Romania's Mihaela Buzarnescu in the opening round of the Shenzhen Open today. Halep, who sealed a 6-4, 6-1 victory was at her aggressive best to set up a second-round clash with China's Duan Yingying who defeated Evgeniya Rodina 6-2, 7-5. Five-times major winner Sharapova hit 18 winners and needed an hour and 22 minutes to dispatch the



seasoned Buzarnescu 6-3, 6-0 for a winning start to the year. The Russian next faces 2017 runner-up Alison Riske, who upset China's fifth seed Wang Qiang yesterday. Unseeded Danka Kovinic ranked 123 in the world, stunned Greek seventh-seeded Maria Sakkari 4-6, 6-2, 6-3. Local hope Zhang Shuai powered past Russia's Anna Blinkova 6-3, 6-4 and was joined in the next round by Timea Babos who beat China's Wang Xiyu 6-1, 6-1.

The new system provides a more dynamic world ranking based on paddlers' performance and results during the entire year. In addition, the system also encourages players to participate in more events to help improve their individual rankings. G Sathiyian, who was nowhere near the top-100



bracket until a few months ago, is the leader today at world No. 49, thus pushing A Sharath Kamal to the second spot at No. 51, thanks to his brilliant performances at the top level competitions. Sathiyian and Sharath are followed by Soumyajit Ghosh (58), Harmeet Desai (60), Sanil Shetty (68) and Anthony Amalraj (87). methodology and its new features, Shri Durga Shanker Mishra, Secretary (Housing & Urban Affairs) stated that keeping in view the need for citizen involvement in assessing progress in sanitation and outcomes to be felt on ground, total weightage for Citizen feedback and Independent observation of sanitation have been increased by 10% over that of 2017 Survey. To encourage cities take up innovative sanitation practices and solutions, a new element of 'Innovation' has been introduced this year with a weightage of 5%. Stressing on the need for ensuring sustainability of improved sanitation levels and maintenance of the sanitation infrastructure being created, Shri Mishra said, the latest survey will assess availability of water connections to toilets, recovery of Operation & Maintenance costs of Community and Public toilets and SWM infrastructure through user charges, advertisement revenue, municipal taxes etc, liquid waste management through treatment and septage disposal, segregation of municipal waste at source, decentralized compost making by bulk generators etc. weightage for processing of solid waste has been increased by 5%. Focusing on enforcement, this survey will also quantify and reward the outcomes of Notifications issued by state and city governments regarding collection of user charges, sale and marketing of compost, linking of bio-metric attendance to payroll of sanitation staff, incentivizing performance further to GPS tracking of garbage collection vehicles, maintenance of public toilets through third party etc. Ensuring rigorous scrutiny of claims of cities about physical progress in improvement in sanitation infrastructure and service levels, huge negative marking in respect of all parameters in this regard has been introduced this time. Under this, if claims of city governments are found to be incorrect by independent assessors, they will get 33% negative marks besides zero marks in respect of such parameters. The 4,041 cities and towns to be covered under Swachh Survekshan-2018, results of which will be announced in March next year, include 500 with a population of one lakh and above each and state capitals and 3,541 with population below one lakh each. For these 3,541 towns, State and Zonal rankings will be announced besides national rankings for the other 500 cities and towns. Under this survey, cities will be ranked based on 71 sanitation related parameters with different weightages for a total of 4,000 marks. Total score has been doubled this time to avoid crowding of cities with very marginal differences in scores that happened in the previous survey.
