Govt committed to promote Ayurveda, traditional systems of medicines: PM Modi

Kozikode, Feb 2
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said that the centre is fully committed to promotion of Ayurveda and traditional systems of medicines. Speaking at the Global Ayurveda Conference in Kozikode, He said, in India we have had a long great tradition of saints & hermits who evolved our own indigenous systems of healthcare.



He said, we need to look beyond providing healthcare and engage in the pursuit of good health, a combination of physical and mental well being.

The Prime Minister pointed out that escalating costs of treatment, side effects of

medicines have prompted experts to think of widening horizons to traditional systems. He also said that for quality control of AYUSH

drugs, steps are being taken to bring regulatory amendments for effective enforcement and strengthening.

He said, our efforts are to tap

real potential of Ayurveda, other AYUSH systems in imparting preventive, promotive, holistic healthcare to people. Stating that traditional medicine is affordable to many rural people, locally available to the communities, time-tested for its safety and efficacy, Shri Modi highlighted that above all it imbues the culture and eco-system of the communities within which it grows. He said, we will share the knowledge of our systems with the world and continue to enrich our traditions by learning from other systems.

The sacrifices made by the freedom fighters for the cause of the Motherland has made these Islands a place of pilgrimage and the Cellular Jail is the mute witness of the gory sufferings meted to the freedom fighters. Every Indian must visit the National Memorial Cellular Jail, at least once in his lifetime, to pay their obeisance to the heroes of our freedom struggle, said Yog Rishi, Swami Ramdevji, who arrived here today, while interacting with the media persons at Andaman Club this evening.

Addressing a press conference,

Swamiji, who was fascinated by the bounties of nature of these emerald Islands, said though he has travelled all over the country and worldwide, but never saw such pristine beauty. "I have been hearing about the Islands since childhood, then known as Kalapani. It is a dream come true for me to visit these Islands now", Swamiji said.

The Islands have immense scope for development. Tourism, which needs to be tapped in the right earnest, has greater potential to take these Islands to the world map. There should be special provisions for further development of tourism here so as to attract

more tourists from abroad, said Swamiji. Referring to Yog, Swamiji said yog is a way to attain scientific lifestyle. It rejuvenates body, mind and soul, he said, urging one and all to practice yog for attaining better health. About 'Achryakulam' to be set up in these Islands, Swamiji said that establishment of Achryakulam will be a real tribute to freedom fighters who were incarcerated in the Cellular Jail. 'Achryakulam' will be a combination of vedic and modern education, he added.

crowd gathered to receive him. Later, Swamiji also visited the National Memorial, Cellular Jail and laid a wreath at the Martyrs Column there to pay tributes.

Besides, Swamiji will conduct a special yog camp for students from 4 to 6 PM at Netaji Stadium on Feb 5. CBSE exams from 1st March 4920 pupils as regular candidates to appear in AISSCE-2016

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) examinations will commence from Mar 01st, 2016 in these Islands. The AISSCE (Class 12) will commence with English as first paper on 1st Mar and the students of AISSE (Class 10) will have Science subject on Mar 2nd, 2016. The class 12 exam ends on 12th April, 2016 with subject Home Science, while class 10 exam ends on 26th March, 2016 with subject Bengali. All arrangements are being made and monitored for smooth conduct of examinations, sources in the CBSE Cell of Directorate of Education informed.

The number of regular candidates likely to appear in AISSCE (Class 12) this year is 4920. While in AISSE (Class 10), 5579 students will take Board conducted summative Assessment as regular candidates. (Contd. on last page)



District Office, South Andaman conducts encroachment eviction drive

Port Blair, Feb 2

The District Office, South Andaman today removed encroachments from Calicut Village, School Line village, Brookshabad and Lambaline. In a press release received here today, the Additional District Magistrate has furnished the details of the encroachment eviction drive. Accordingly, a complaint was received regarding encroachments and selling of Government land at Calicut area by Eshajee Mohammed & T. Mohammed at survey No.26/P and 165/P measuring approximately 4000 Sq. Mtrs. After verifying the



facts, a case under section 447/34 IPC was registered against the accused in the Police Station Pahar Gaon on 29th January 2016. In this regard, a news item also appeared in a local daily on 1st February 2016 under the

heading "Massive govt. land in Calicut sold in plots to private persons, FIR registered".

By following the due procedure, Show Cause Notices were issued to the encroachers but they neither appeared nor the

encroachments were removed.

Taking prompt action, the competent Revenue Authority passed order to remove the encroachments immediately. Complying the order, the revenue officials along with Tehsildar, Port Blair and sufficient force of A&N Police & personnel from IRBN reached the spot and removed 6 permanent structures at Calicut Village. Similarly, 27 temporary encroachments from School line village, 6 from Brookshabad and 2 from Lambaline were also removed.

nature of the Islands. Acknowledging the need for marketing intervention, the Secretary said that the A&N Administration have taken steps for direct marketing channel wherein the ITF ground will be made open free of cost for direct marketing by the SHGs and farmers to sell their produce, 2 to 3 days a week. This will commence from next week onwards.

She also informed that the A&N Administration has already forwarded the inputs pertaining to Agriculture Produce Marketing Regulation Act to the Govt. of India. The A&N Administration has also conveyed its consent to be a part of the e-lab, where information pertaining to agriculture produce of A&N Islands can be accessed online through National Agricultural e-portal. She urged the participants to make best use of the training programme and share their inputs. She also asked the Agriculture and line departments to come up with strategies on marketing and assured that steps will be taken by the A&N Administration in implementing the strategies.

Speaking on the occasion, the resource person, Dr. B.K.Paty, Director (OSPM), MANAGE, Hyderabad said besides production, market planning and designing is very important for regulating price mechanism. He highlighted about issues related to marketing challenge and said that monopolistic tendency of market should be curbed. He also stressed on the need for high value based produce with proper branding for marketing, while grading and standardization of produce is equally important in international market, he added. He said that farmers need to be empowered by linking them to the market and advice the extension officers of Agriculture and its line departments to work in concerted effort and help farmers.

The inaugural session was followed by technical session wherein the resource persons Dr. B.K.Paty spoke on the topic 'linking farmers to market-the new paradigms', Smti. 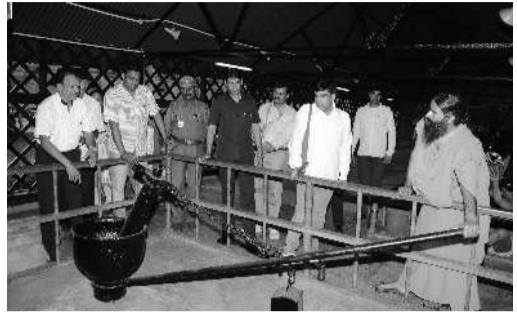
