### Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakram

#### All expenses related to delivery in public institutions would be borne by Govt.

Port Blair, Mar 2

The Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakram (JSSK) has been implemented in the South Andaman District under National Health Mission with view to encourage all pregnant women to deliver in Public Health Facilities and fulfill the commitment of achieving cent percent institutional deliveries. It stipulates out that all expenses related to delivery in public institutions would be borne entirely by the

Government and no user charges would be levied.

Under this initiative, a pregnant women would be entitled to free transport from home to the health facility (health centre), and in case she is referred on account of complications is also entitled to drop back home after delivery.

Similarly all sick newborns accessing public health institutions for health care till 42 days after birth also be entitled for free

transportation, both ways and between facilities in case of a referral. In this connection, all beneficiaries may avail the services by calling toll free no 102 and in case of emergency

### PBMC sets deadline to achieve open defecation free status

#### Mass awareness & identification of open defecation pockets in progress

Port Blair, Mar 2

The Port Blair Municipal Council is mandated to implement Swachh Bharat Mission with a target of making Port Blair achieve open defecation free status by this year. The campaign was kicked off on Feb 13th February 2016 at Ward No.18 of Municipal Council which included mass awareness and identification of open defecation pockets in the said ward. The Swachhthta awareness team alongwith all Sanitary Inspectors conducted survey for identification of Open Defecation area.

The Municipal Council

organized Ward Sabha at 4 locations in ward no. 18 on Feb 20 which was attended by Joint Secretary, Councillor of Ward no. 18 alongwith other officials of Sanitary and Project Management Unit, for identifying the location of Community Toilet which is proposed to be constructed under Swachh Bharat Mission to make Port Blair City as Open Defecation Free (ODF) city.

Emphasis was laid on taking up individual household toilets by the citizens. The micro plan so evolved culminated in a decision making process of construction of seven

Community Toilets who had no access of individual household toilets.

Citizens were given 60 days time to construct / convert the existing insanitary toilet into sanitary toilet, subsequent to which the Sanitary Inspectors of Port Blair Municipal Council will penalize all defaulters after observing all formalities under the provisions of Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and their Rehabilitation Act 2013.

An earthquake with a magnitude of 7.9 on Richter scale occurred at a depth of 10 kms in the ocean part in the South West of Sumatra, Indonesia on Mar 2 at 1830 hours (IST). The epicentre of the quake was at 5.06 South Latitude and 94.17 East Longitude.

However, the earthquake was not felt in Campbell

Bay, Nicobar, Little Andaman & Mayabunder, a communication from State Control Room, Directorate of Disaster Management said.

Meanwhile, the Tsunami alert which was issued at Jakarta, Indonesia has been lifted. The US Geological Survey originally put the magnitude at 8.2, and then 8.1, before lowering it to 7.9.

On a roll with three back-to-back victories, India have finally decided to test their reserve bench against minnows United Arab Emirates (UAE) in the final league encounter of the Asia Cup on Thursday. Mahendra Singh Dhoni is not someone who believes in chopping and changing the side too often but after making it to the final with a five-wicket win over Sri Lanka, the India skipper said that the UAE match will be a platform to give opportunity to all those who have till now warmed the benches. It means that at least two or three amongst the quartet of Ajinkya Rahane, Harbhajan Singh, Pawan

Negi and Bhuvneshwar Kumar are likely to get a game. Bhuvneshwar Kumar, who has slipped off the radar a bit since the World Cup in Australia last year, may get a game in that case. Negi, who emerged as the most expensive Indian player during the recent IPL auction when he was bought by Delhi Daredevils for Rs 8.5 crore, has warmed the benches but he is someone, who can bowl wicket-to-wicket like his senior Jadeja. If Harbhajan gets a chance, he will have to accept that it will be a one-off game as per the current situation where Ashwin has literally cemented his place in the playing

XI. Yuvraj Singh, who looked in fine touch against Sri Lanka, would like to feast on an inexperienced bowling attack. Ditto for Suresh Raina, who has looked in all sorts of trouble against rising deliveries in these matches. Since both are certainlies in the playing XI, they would like to get big scores before the final. # French Open will be toughest Grand Slam to win: Sania Mirza

New Delhi, Mar 2  
Indian doubles specialist Sania Mirza on Wednesday admitted that winning French Open will be the "toughest" of the four Slam tournaments. Mirza and her Swiss partner Martina Hingis have won the last three Grand Slam tournaments, and will enter the Roland Garros event this May as the favourites. But the Indian ace is aware of the flaws in their clay court game. "I hope that the chances are bright, considering we won the last three grand slams. But it is going to be our toughest Grand Slam to win. It is not our favourite surface. But we are doing whatever we can and hopefully we can get that 'Santina' slam, so to say," she told

reporters.

The Indo-Swiss pair's 41-match winning streak came to a halt after top-ranked doubles team went down fighting in the quarterfinals of the Qatar Open last week to Russian duo of Elena Vesnina and Daria Kasatkina. Sania, who was speaking at an event organised by Telangana Tourism, said Hingis, who plays for Hyderabad in Vijay Amritraj-promoted Champions Tennis League, likes Hyderabad and Indian food very much, with biryani being her favourite.
