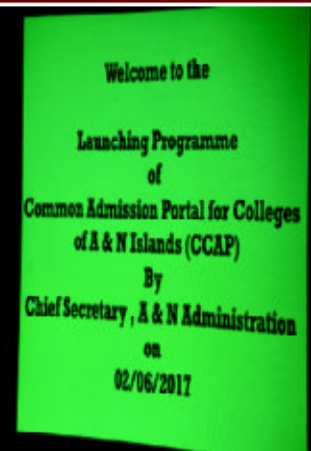

## Common College Admission Portal launched

### Student should be made aware of the portal: Chief Secretary

Port Blair, June 2

The Chief Secretary, A & N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar today launched the Common College Admission Portal (CCAP) in the conference hall of Secretariat. The programme was attended by the Secretary Education, Joint Secretary, Higher Education, the Principal/ Representative of various Colleges.



Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Secretary lauded the initiative made by Higher Education to simplify the admission processes by developing a Common Admission Portal. He emphasised that while undertaking the computerization process, effort should be made on Process Engineering to weed out redundant process so that the system becomes more efficient and effective.

The Chief Secretary suggested that the student should be made aware of the portal so that they can avail the facility from the nearest Common Service Centre or through Internet. He also advised that a Help Desk be created so that the students can share their grievances which can be addressed over phone which will ensure that the students are able to submit the forms without any problems. The Secretary

Education highlighted that the portal will reduce the consumption of paper substantially since the colleges will no longer print the Brochure and the Admission Form. The scrutiny of form shall also be done on electronic mode which will obviate the need of taking hardcopies.

## Indigenously developed nuclear-capable Prithvi-II missile successfully test-fired

Bhubaneswar, June 2

India today successfully test-fired its indigenously developed nuclear-capable Prithvi-II missile from a test range in Odisha as part of a user trial by the Army. The trial of the surface-to-surface missile, which has a strike range of 350 km, was carried out from a mobile launcher from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) at Chandipur near Balasore at around 9.50 AM. Official sources said, the trial of the missile was

successful and the mission objectives were met.

The Prithvi-II missile is capable of carrying 500 kg to 1,000 kg of warheads and is thrust by liquid propulsion twin engines. It uses advanced inertial guidance system with manoeuvring trajectory to hit its target with precision and accuracy.

The state-of-the-art missile was randomly chosen from the production stock and the entire launch activities were carried out by the specially formed strategic force command (SFC) and



monitored by the scientists of the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) as part of training exercise. The missile

trajectory was tracked by the DRDO radars, electro-optical tracking systems and telemetry stations located along the coast of Odisha.

It was launched in Chhattisgarh as part of the state's 16th foundation day celebrations. With this Chhattisgarh became the first state to implement the scheme.

**Key Facts**

- ◆ Under the scheme, solar powered irrigation pumps of 3HP and 5HP capacity will be distributed to the farmers. The beneficiaries would get the pumps at the subsidised price.
- ◆ It is mainly aimed to give priority to those areas where electricity has not reached, so that farmers can utilize them in irrigation and agriculture.
- ◆ Around 51,000 farmers would be benefitted in the state with the launch of the scheme by 2018.

Virender Sehwag has become the most notable applicant for the Indian cricket team's chief coach post, which would be technically vacant when Anil Kumble's term comes to an end after the Champions Trophy. The decision on whether Kumble would continue as coach would be made by the three-member Cricket Advisory Committee comprising Sachin Tendulkar, Sourav Ganguly and VVS Laxman. Reportedly, Virat Kohli had expressed reservations about Kumble as coach and communicated the same to the



BCCI's office bearers and the Committee of Administrators, after which the board chose to advertise for the position. While Kumble is an automatic entry into the process, the others in the fray are Australian Tom Moody and

Englishman Richard Pybus, who has coached Pakistan earlier. The two Indians among applicants are former fast bowler Dodda Ganesh and former India A coach Lalchand Rajput.

With the launch of portal, there will be financial savings for the parents and students as they will now only have to pay the charges for filling the form (Rs 10/-), uploading the documents (Rs 5/- for Black & White and Rs 10/- for Colour) and taking the printout (Rs 5/- per printout to the CSC and in the event the candidates are filling through internet no charges are required to be paid. As per the present practice, expenditure incurred ranged from Rs 150/- for Port Blair student to more than Rs 1000/- for Inter Island student for completing the formalities related to submission of Admission Form. The Secretary Education also stated that the portal will help to generate the data related to the preferences of the courses by the student which will help in future planning with regard to increasing the number of seats or addition of new courses.
