PM to leave on four African nations visit on July 7

New Delhi, Jul 2 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will be on a five day visit to Mozambique, South Africa, Tanzania and Kenya from 7th of this month. On 7th July, the Prime Minister will be in Mozambique where he will have bilateral discussions with President Mr Filipe Nyusi to strengthen bilateral ties and enhance development cooperation. From 8th-9th, in South Africa, Shri Modi will have meetings with President Mr. Jacob Zuma and other senior leaders across the political spectrum to further enhance India's



historical relations with that country. On 10th, in Tanzania, Shri Modi will meet President Mr John Pombe Joseph Magufuli to further enhance mutual cooperation and understanding on major issues of common interest. On the last leg of his tour on 11th of this month, the Prime Minister will be in Kenya and have bilateral discussions with President

Mr. Kenyatta. Shri Modi will also address students in the University of Nairobi during the visit. MEA spokesperson Shri Vikas Swarup said the visit of Shri Modi to the African nations reflects India's desire to further strengthen and reinvigorate bilateral ties with African partners which were renewed at the successful India Africa Forum Summit in October last year. The visit will provide opportunities to build on close contacts at the highest level and enhance mutual cooperation and understanding on major issues of common interests.

Govt. not to withhold appointment letters pending verification of character & antecedents of candidates

New Delhi, Jul 2

The Government has decided that the issue of appointment letters need not be withheld pending the verification of character and antecedents of the successful candidates. The appointing authorities will issue provisional appointment letters after obtaining the attestation form and self declaration from the candidate.

In the appointment letter, it will be clearly mentioned that in case character and antecedents of the candidate is found not verified or any false information is given by the candidate in his/her self-declaration, the provisional appointment will be cancelled forthwith and other criminal/legal action will also be taken, as a consequence. This decision aims to achieve

the Government's vision of 'Minimum Government and Maximum Governance' and deliver citizen-centric good governance. As per existing provisions, the appointing authorities undertake an exercise of verification of character and antecedents of the successful candidates before issuing the formal appointment order. The Government has decided that now the verification of

character and antecedents will be carried out, but the issue of appointment letters need not be withheld pending such verification. The necessary instructions in this regard have been issued to all Ministries/Departments and also brought to the notice of the State Governments / Administrators of Union Territories.

RT&H Minister kick-starts National Green Highways Mission

New Delhi, Jul 2 Road Transport and Highways Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari has launched the plantation drive on 1,500 kilometers of National Highways at a cost of about 300 crore rupees under the National Green Highways Mission in New Delhi. The launch was announced at a workshop yesterday organized by the National Green Highways Mission on the theme Green Highways Projects: Way Ahead. Speaking on the occasion, Shri Gadkari



said that the project has a huge potential to generate jobs and can prove to be a game-changer for

agriculture and rural economy. He said, green cover of one kilometer of highway will provide employment to ten people. He said, the project may be linked with the NREGA scheme. An official release said, under the Green Highways Project, the government has made it mandatory to set aside one per cent of the total project cost of any National Highway contract to a Green Fund corpus that will be used for plantation purpose.

Port Blair, July 2 Shri Keshab Barikdar of Citizens Forum on Human Rights and National Human Rights Committee of India, A&N Islands recently met the Lt Governor, Lt Gen AK Singh (Retd), at Raj Niwas and discussed various issues pertaining to the welfare of the people and the Islands. Issues such as proper implementation of Citizen Charter, non-issuance of Bar License, development of better relation between general public and Govt. employees and speedy justice to women suffering from domestic violence were discussed. Habitual offenders of illegal liquor sale sent to judicial custody

PC has been initiated. Such incidents hamper peaceful community living and are a menace to society at large. In the past 5 months 14 such offenders including women have been sent to Judicial Custody (for 5-7 days). Such habitual

offenders are also booked under different acts such as Excise. General public have been warned not to indulge in such illegal activities. If found indulging, the strictest action, will be initiated against them. If any person notices any such illegal sale of liquor in their localities, they are requested to pass on the necessary information to the nearest police station at the earliest, so that immediate action can be taken, a communication from the Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SA) said.

NASA's New Horizons mission to travel deeper into space

Washington, Jul 2

Following its historic first-ever flyby of Pluto, NASA's New Horizons mission will fly deeper into space towards an ancient object considered to be one of the early building blocks of the solar system. The spacecraft's planned rendezvous with the object located deeper in the Kuiper Belt, known as 2014 MU69, is 1st January of 2019. NASA's Director of Planetary Science Jim Green said, his team is excited to continue onward into the dark depths of the outer solar system to a science target that was not even discovered when the spacecraft was launched.

Sports Ministry grants recognition to Paralympic Committee of India

New Delhi, Jul 2
The Sports Ministry on Friday granted recognition to Paralympic Committee of India, giving a huge confidence boost to the several para-athletes who have qualified for Rio Paralympics.

The ministry's move comes less than a month after the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) announced temporary lifting of suspension imposed on the national body last year so that Indians can take part under the tri-colour in the showpiece event in September. PCI was



suspended in April last year due to internal conflicts between different groups and persons, which were undermining the development of Paralympic Movement in India.

Cricket will be part of 2024 Olympics if Rome wins bid: Italy board

Rome, Jul 2
Italian cricket board chief Simone Gambino has said that Cricket will be part of the 2024 Olympics if Rome wins the bid to host the mega event. Gambino's comments coincided with the ongoing ICC Annual Conference in

Edinburgh. Rome is bidding to host the 2024 Summer Games alongside Paris, Los Angeles and Budapest. The host city will have the opportunity to add five sports to the Olympics provided they fall under the regulations.

Cate Campbell Smashes 100m Freestyle Swimming Record Ahead of Rio Olympics

Brisbane, July 2
Australia's Cate Campbell smashed the long-standing women's 100m freestyle world record on Saturday at a meet in Brisbane in an ominous warning to her rivals ahead of the Rio Olympics.

The Australian Swim Team tweeted the world record, confirming the 52.06 seconds swim which eclipsed German Britta Steffen's old mark of 52.07 set in Rome in 2009 during the full-body supersuit era.

On receipt of information, two coast Guard ships and one helicopter, which were patrolling in the area, were diverted to search for the missing boat. At about 1145 hrs, Coast Guard ship KanaklataBarua located the boat approximately 10 nautical miles North of Port Blair. The crew informed that the boat was adrift since 4 am due to broken engine crank shaft. As there was no communication equipment on the boat, the crew could not communicate with boat owner and were helpless. Since repair of engine was not possible, the boat was towed to Port Blair harbour by Coast Guard ship and handed over off Ross Island to another boat arranged by the owner by 2.40 pm.

Coast Guard has reiterated that it is important for all fishermen to carry DAT and lifesaving equipment on their boats, so that they can inform Coast Guard authorities about any distress situation and can be saved. Fishermen can also inform about any distress situation to Coast Guard on toll free number 1554.
