PM to launch programme - '70 Saal Azadi - Zara Yaad Karo Kurbani' on Aug 9

PM advises IAS officers to remain sensitive to their circumstances

New Delhi, Aug 2

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will launch a mega programme- 70 Saal Azadi-Zara Yaad Karo Kurbani - on 9th of this month to celebrate the 70th Independence Day. The programme which will continue till 23rd August, is aimed at rekindling the spirit of patriotism among the people and recalling the sacrifices of freedom fighters.

Seventy five Union Ministers will visit 650 historically important places across the country including Jallianwala Bagh in Punjab, Cellular Jail in Andaman and Nicobar and Dandi in Gujarat to create patriotic fervour among the youth.

Briefing reporters in New Delhi

today, Information and Broadcasting Minister Shri M Venkaiah Naidu said, there are several unknown freedom fighters in different parts of the country who will be brought to the fore through the celebrations. He said the women Ministers will visit the border areas to tie Rakhi to the

soldiers. Shri Naidu said, several programmes including essay and debate competitions will be organised besides screening of patriotic videos and films at different places. He said, during their visits the Ministers will also highlight the good governance

and initiatives taken by the NDA government for the poor and marginalised sections of the society. He informed that BJP MPs will undertake Tiranga Yatra between 15th to 22nd August in their areas on bikes along with tricolour.

New Delhi, Aug 2

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today advised young IAS officers to remain sensitive to their circumstances and surroundings in order to be able to effectively connect with the people of India. Addressing IAS Officers of the 2014 batch who have been appointed as Assistant Secretaries to the Union Government, Shri Modi said, the officers have a great opportunity to enhance their skills and learning, far beyond what they had imbibed during their training so far. He urged them to use the next three months to add value their own skill-sets and also attempt to add value to the working of the Departments they had been attached with. He particularly mentioned the use of technology in governance and asked the young officers to work



towards technology upgradation in the working of Government. The Prime Minister urged the officers not to be overawed by hierarchy and to be frank and fearless in their interaction with senior officers during the next three months of their attachment as Assistant Secretaries. He mentioned that this is a new feature of IAS training begun with the 2013 batch and it ensures that IAS officers have a stint at the Centre right at the beginning of their career. Parliament passes Institutes of Technology (Amendment) Bill

New Delhi, Aug 2

Parliament has passed the Institutes of Technology (Amendment) Bill-2016 to set up six new Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) with Rajya Sabha approving it today. The new IITs will be established in Tirupati, Palakkad, Goa, Dharwad, Bhilai and Jammu. Besides the Indian School of Mines, Dhanbad has been brought within the ambit of the IIT Act.

Replying to a debate on the bill, Human Resource and Development Minister Shri Prakash Javadekar said the government is committed to maintain the autonomy of the IITs. He said these Institutes are being run by a board in which the

Ministry has no representatives. Shri Javadekar assured the House that IITs will remain the centre of excellence and there will be no budgetary constraints. Responding to members concerns regarding infrastructure and faculty problems, the Minister said the internal accrual of IITs are growing and within three years there will be no deficit in terms of infrastructure and other requirements. Shri Javadekar also said the vacancies in these institutes will be filled up soon. He also said the government is working on setting up of 20 world class institutes. Of them, ten will be in public sector and ten in private.

Results of ANIPMT- 2016 declared; U Rohit tops the list

Port Blair, Aug 2

The result of the ANIPMT-2016 entrance exam has been declared for admission of 85 students in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Institute of Medical Sciences (ANIIMS). At a press conference here this evening, the Director ANIIMS, Maj. Gen. R. P. Choubey declared the results of the ANIPMT before the mediapersons. Disclosing the names of the toppers category-wise, the Director informed that Shabnoor Bashir topped in Category-I with 83 marks, Ms Akanksha Kumari remained topper in Category-II with 136 marks, Ms. M. Naazima Bibi in



Category-III(A) with 126, Bakhtawar Singh Saini in Category-III (B) with 131 marks, U Rohit in category-IV with 155 marks and Abhiudey in category-V with 103 marks. The Director said that the number of students who qualified in the exams this year stood at 236 compared to 100 last year. The Director further stated that this entrance exam was for admission of 1st year student (second batch) to ANIIMS which came into being in the year 2015. The

Director said that altogether, 880 students applied, out of which 696 took the exam and there was no negative marking. He said the results declared today have been uploaded in the College website and also placed on the Notice Board. The Director said that these are provisional results as none of the student's documents have been verified yet. On August 3rd, a list of students will be displayed at 5 pm at Medical College Office building who will be asked to come with their documents for verification. The verification of documents will be taken up for three days i.e on August 4, 5 and 6 from 9AM onwards. The students who intend to re-verify the marks are at liberty to take up re-verification. The students can go through the prospectus for taking up re-verification of marks, he added.

The Director ANIIMS further informed that any observation of the students regarding the merit list can be clarified with him. (Results from page 2 onwards)

Govt introduces Transgender Person bill 2016 in Lok Sabha

New Delhi, Aug 2

Union Social Justice and Empowerment Minister Shri Thawar Chand Gehlot today introduced the Transgender Person (protection of rights) bill 2016 in Lok Sabha. Union Cabinet had, on Wednesday, approved the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Bill, 2016. The bill has provisions for stringent punishment, including imprisonment up to two years, for offences

against them. Under the bill, forcing a transgender to leave a village or residence, forcibly removing their clothes and parading them naked, or inciting them to beg or do similar forms of bonded labour, will be treated as atrocities and violence against them. According to the 2011 Census, India has 6 lakh people belonging to the transgender community.

One sentenced to life imprisonment for murdering wife

Selvaraj in Session Case No.03 of 2013 (S.T.No.43 of 2013) on July 28, 2016 for committing murder of his wife Smt. Sangeeta and the accused was sent to judicial custody for reflection of his mind for hearing of sentence to be imposed upon him on July 29, 2016. The accused A. Selvaraj was produced on judicial custody on July 29 before the Court and after hearing him, the Ld. Additional Sessions Judge,

Mr. Debasis Bandopadhyay has imposed sentence upon him to suffer rigorous imprisonment for life and to pay fine of Rs.10,000/- in default of payment of fine he has to

undergo rigorous imprisonment for further period of 2 years more for commission of offence U/s 302 IPC, a communication from the Public Prosecutor said here today.

years, necessitating measures to put it back on track, for which celebrations of this kind are essential.

Dr.T.L.Ratnakumari, Professor of Paediatrics, ANIIMS spoke on the overview of breast feeding practices elaborating all the valuable goodness of breast milk emphasizing that no excuse should lessen the importance of exclusive breast feeding for 6 months. This was followed by another talk elaborating this year's theme by Dr. B. Karthik Kumar, Senior Resident, Paediatrics. He clearly spelt out how practicing breast feeding can effectively help to reduce the wasteful spending on infant milk substitutes and how it impacts the economy of the nation, so much so that breast feeding is the key to attain the sustainable development goals, which is envisaged to be attained by 2030.
