## MoU signed under PMAY

### Online submission of applications by urban poor for affordable houses from today

New Delhi, Nov 2

In a significant initiative, the Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation has enabled online submission of applications by the urban poor for affordable houses under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban) from tomorrow (Nov 3). A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in this regard was signed today by the Ministry of HUPA and Common Services Centre e-Governance Services India Limited of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, in the presence of respective Ministers Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu and Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad.

Out of the over two lakh Common Services Centre across the country, about 60,000 located in urban areas will enable online submission of applications from November 3, 2016 at a

nominal cost of Rs.25/- per application. As per the MoU, CSCs will also facilitate printing of the acknowledgement receipt with beneficiary photograph which helps applicants in tracking application status. Beneficiaries have to visit the nearest CSC for seeking assistance for seeking benefits of PMAY (Urban) online. In case the beneficiary does not have Aadhar Card, CSCs will

enable beneficiaries acquiring them. This process of applying online is e-KYC (Know Your Client) enabled which means applications are submitted after due verification. Minister of HUPA Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu said on the occasion that Digital India Mission is transforming the country and collaboration with CSC SPV will help in bringing more urban poor under the

ambit of PMAY (Urban) by addressing the difficulties associated in physical submission of applications to Urban Local Bodies, for want of adequate help and guidance. He said that while 13.70 lakh urban poor were sanctioned affordable houses during 2005-14, about 11 lakh houses have been already sanctioned for urban poor during the last one year and this will pick up further momentum

Islands personally took interest and even met the Minister of MoEF & CC for expediting this work. Dr MM Kutty, Additional Secretary, MoEF&CC has also played very active and supportive role in this regard.

It is to be mentioned here that officials of Forest Department, UT Administration, Engineers of APWD, Secretary, PWD, Chief Secretary, A&N Administration have been pursuing for this work for more than 5 years. The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has also been working on this issue and has met all concerned to get the desired result. The MP has expressed his pleasure on this achievement and has also expressed his gratitude, the release added.

### Candidate's election could be annulled for declaring false educational qualifications: SC

New Delhi, Nov 2

The Supreme Court has ruled that election of a candidate could be set aside for making false declaration on educational qualifications in the nomination paper. The ruling came yesterday when a bench of Justice A R Dave and Justice L Nageswara Rao quashed

the election of Manipur Congress MLA, Mairambam Prithviraj, for falsely declaring in his nomination papers that he had an MBA degree. The court held that the right to vote would be meaningless unless citizens were well-informed about the antecedents of candidates, including their educational

qualification. The apex court said, all information about a candidate contesting elections must be available in public domain as exposure to public scrutiny was one of the surest means to cleanse the democratic governing system and have competent legislators.

The Dy. ### Govt to set up feedback platform to assess call drops

New Delhi, Nov 2

Minister for Communications Shri Manoj Sinha has warned telecom operators of action, including penalty, for call drops, and said his ministry will soon set up a platform to enable consumers to offer direct feedback on call failures. He was talking to media after meeting with the heads of telecom operators in New Delhi yesterday. Shri Sinha expressed satisfaction at the progress made by companies in installing base stations for improving connectivity

but said that while TRAI report indicates an improvement in the overall situation, its circle-wise criteria of measuring call drops does not cover black spots where call failures occur. He said, the new platform will be ready in the next one month and it will be the right parameter to gauge the situation. On the telecom war between operators over points of interconnect, the Minister said, Government will ensure that the consumers are not effected. He said, Ministry has advised operators to get solution within the regulatory framework.

### Kerala declared third Open Defecation Free State

Thiruvananthapuram, Nov 2

The State of Kerala has become the third State overall and the largest State so far to be declared Open Defecation Free (ODF) under the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) (Gramin). The declaration was formally made by the Chief Minister of Kerala, Shri Pinarayi Vijayan, in a magnificent ceremony at the Central Stadium, Thiruvananthapuram yesterday. Shri Vijayan also distributed awards to and felicitated district collectors and other government officials who had been instrumental in

bringing about this landmark achievement for the State. With this, all 14 districts, 152 blocks, 940 Gram Panchayats and 2117 villages of the State have been declared free from open defecation. Kerala, with a rural population of approximately 3.5 crores, is also the largest State so far to have achieved the ODF Status, after Sikkim (6 lakhs) and Himachal Pradesh (70 lakhs).

**Delhi's Air Quality plunges to 'severe' category**

New Delhi, Nov 2  
Delhi's air quality has plunged to 'severe' category, which carries the risk of affecting people's respiratory system, as smoke from fireworks after Diwali festivities, blanketed the national capital. The Centre's System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research (SAFAR) recorded the level of respirable pollutants, PM 2.5 and PM 10, at 283 and 517 micrograms per cubic metre respectively, violating the safe limits by

multiple times. The prescribed standards of PM 2.5 and PM 10 are 60 and 100 respectively. Anything beyond that can harm the respiratory system as the ultra fine particulates can embed deep into the lungs and also enter the bloodstream. Pollution peaks in the national capital during Diwali as a hazardous mix of noxious gases and respirable pollutants. The pollutants hang very close to the surface due to low temperature and near-stagnant wind movement.

**Pak resorts to heavy shelling along LoC in Jammu**

Srinagar, Nov 2  
In Jammu and Kashmir, heavy mortar shelling by Pakistani forces has been started in Mendhar area of Poonch along the Line of Control in Jammu region. According to Defence sources, Pakistan's Army resorted to firing in Balakote and Manjakote sectors this afternoon. Army troops guarding the borderline retaliated the

firing and exchange of fire is still continuing. Pakistani shelling in Jammu region yesterday, left 8 civilians killed. At least 24 others were also injured in Pakistani shelling.
