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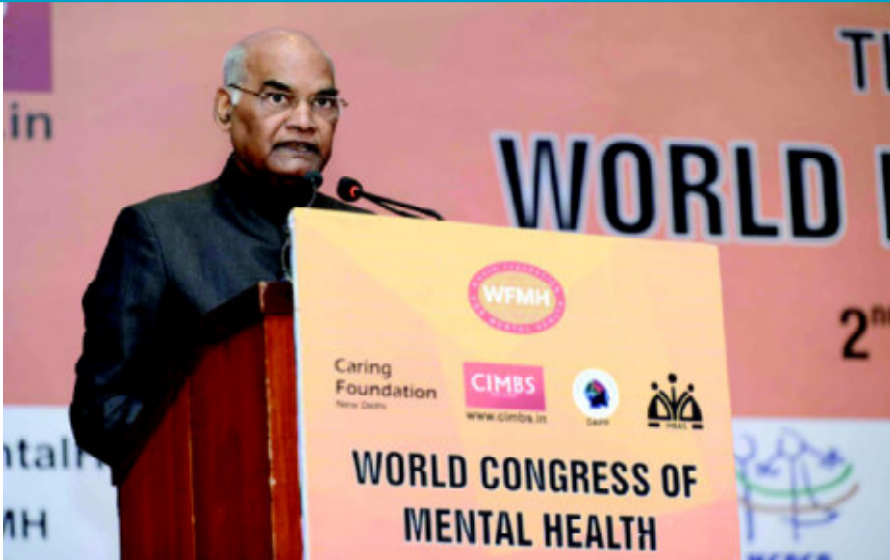

## President inaugurates 21<sup>st</sup> World Congress of mental health; calls for fighting stigma

New Delhi, Nov 2  
The President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind, inaugurated the 21st World Congress of Mental Health being organised by the World Federation for Mental Health in partnership with Caring Foundation and other institutions in New Delhi today. Speaking on the occasion, the President said that the World Congress of Mental Health is taking place in India for the first time, and it has come here at an appropriate moment. Mental health issues are acquiring a serious magnitude in our country. Our National Mental Health Survey 2016 found that close to 14 per cent of India's population required active mental health interventions.



The President noted that a young population, with 65 per cent of our people below the age of 35. And our society is rapidly urbanising. This leaves us staring at a possible mental health epidemic, he said. The President said that the biggest obstacle that

mental health patients have to encounter is stigma and denial. This leads to the issue being ignored or simply not discussed. We need to talk about mental health issues and treat ailments such as depression

## Registration of Real Estate Projects with ANRERA mandatory

### Awareness prog. for stakeholders on Nov 6

Port Blair, Nov 2

The Government of India has notified the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Real Estate (Regulation and Development) (General) Rules, 2016 vide No. 754 dated 31/10/2016 to carry out the provisions of Real Estate (Regulation & Development) Act, 2016. Under the Act, no Promoter shall advertise, market, book, sell or offer for sale or invite persons to purchase in any manner any plot, apartment or building, as the case may be, in any real estate project or part of it, without

registering the Real Estate Project with the Tamil Nadu Real Estate Regulatory Authority (TNRERA), which has been appointed by the Lt. Governor as Andaman & Nicobar Islands Real Estate Regulatory Authority (ANRERA). Registration of Real Estate Project with ANRERA is mandatory where the area of the project to be developed exceeds 500m<sup>2</sup> or where the number of dwelling units proposed to be developed exceeds 8. Also the Builders/

Developers while releasing advertisement in the media for their project will have to mention the Real Estate Regulatory Authority Registration Number as applicable without fail. For projects completed prior to notification of the Rules, the details of Completion Certificate/ Occupancy Certificate as applicable shall be mentioned. The Funding Institutions may also take note of the above direction. Similarly, property dealers, brokers, middle man, by whatever

name they be called, shall also have to register with ANRERA. Failing to register of project by the promoters or carrying out activities without registration as Real Estate Agent with ANRERA is an offence and shall be punishable with imprisonment or fine or both. **Narang wins silver in Commonwealth Shooting Championships**

Canberra, Nov 2  
Ace Indian shooter Gagan Narang made a stunning comeback to secure the silver medal in the 50m rifle prone event of the Commonwealth Shooting Championship here today.  
Annu Raj Singh, who also made a comeback in the Indian team, had a good outing as she cruised her way to win the bronze medal in the women's 50m pistol competition.  
The 2010 CWG gold medalist shot a total of 28 in the finals to finish third.  
London Olympics bronze medalist Narang, who is appearing in his first major tournament since the 2016 Rio Olympics, shot a total of 617.6 in the qualification to end fourth. In the finals, he shot 246.3 to end just 1.4 points adrift the



leader and settled for the second place.  
"It was a very windy day and I had to dig deep. It was a test of my patience as I had to release my shots at the right time," the 2010 CWG Gold medalist said. Narang knows that there is a lot of work to be done ahead of the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games. "It was a test event for the Commonwealth Games next year and one of the things to

test was the wind conditions and I did just that today. The final score still can be better and I know that I need to put in some more in that direction," he added.  
India won a gold each in the men's 10m air pistol and women's 10m air rifle events, respectively, yesterday. On the first day of competition, Heena Sidhu clinched a gold medal in women's 10m air pistol event.

**MC Mary Kom enters quarters of Asian boxing championships**

Hanoi, Nov 2  
MC Mary Kom advanced to the quarterfinals of the Asian Women's Boxing Championship after comfortably winning her opening-round bout in Vietnam on Thursday.  
The 34-year-old, who is a five-time world champion besides being an Olympic bronze-medallist, defeated local favourite Diem Thi Trinh Kieu in a split verdict in the opening round of the light flyweight (48kg) category.  
The four-time gold-medallist at this event is making a return to her preferred weight division after competing in the 51kg category, which was made an Olympic category before the 2012 Games.  
It was a sedate start to the proceedings as Mary Kom and her rival spent the better part



of the first three minutes getting a measure of each other. The pace picked up in the second round and the Indian veteran was on top with her clean straights. Mary Kom's reflexes were sharp and she kept maintaining the right distance to deny Kieu a clear shot at her.  
The local favourite, backed by a partisan crowd, gave a better account of herself in the final three minutes. But Mary Kom

also stepped it up with some telling combination blows to throw Kieu off-balance. Mary Kom will now be up against Chinese Taipei's Meng-Chieh Ping, who got the better of Thailand's Panpradab Plodsai in her opening bout. A total of 107 boxers from 20 countries are competing in the continental meet where India are placed third in the all-time medals' list with 19 gold, 21 silver and 20 bronze.

**Kidambi Srikanth rises to career-best number two in latest badminton rankings**

New Delhi, Oct 2  
India ace Kidambi Srikanth was rewarded for his sensational run this season as he grabbed a career-best ranking of World No. 2 after jumping two places in the latest BWF ranking released on Thursday.  
Srikanth, who reached five finals and clinched four titles this year so far, now has 73,403 points, 4527 point away from World Champion Viktor Axelsen of Denmark, who heads the ranking list.  
The 25-year-old from Guntur, who had clinched back-to-back titles at Indonesia and Australia and then at Denmark and France, will have a chance to topple the Dane shuttler with some good show in the upcoming events at China and Hong Kong.  
US Open Grand Prix Gold winner HS Prannoy, who had reached the semifinals at Paris, also improved a place to reach a career-best ranking of World



No. 11. Singapore Open champion B Sai Praneeth, however, dropped a place to be at the 16th spot, while Sameer Verma, who had skipped the events at Denmark and France due to fitness issues, is steady at the 18th place. In women's singles, P V Sindhu, who also reached the semifinals at France, was static at World No. 2, while former World No. 1 Saina Nehwal was also steady at the 11th spot. and stress as diseases that can be cured - not as guilty secrets that must be pushed under the carpet. A major gap in combating the mental health challenge is that of human resources. India is a country with 1.25 billion people but just 700,000 doctors - less than one million. In the field of mental health, the scarcity is even more acute. There are only about 5,000 psychiatrists and less than 2,000 clinical psychologists in our country. The President said that India's National Mental Health Programme is building 22 centres of excellence in the field of mental health. In parallel, the District Mental Health Programme has already covered 517 of the approximately 650 districts in India. It is taking the conversation about mental health to the grassroots of our society. The President expressed happiness that the World Congress will have sessions on yoga, meditation and traditional approaches to mental health. He stated that the example of yoga is very instructive. When people talk about yoga, they generally refer to its physiological benefits. However, the mental, psychological, and cognitive benefits of yoga are equally worthy of our study. He looked forward to feedback on the deliberations of the special session planned on the role of yoga in battling anxiety and depression - and in preventing the onset of mental health problems.
