Trade between India and Vietnam is growing despite global slowdown: Prime Minister

New Delhi, Mar 3
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said India and Vietnam will work together for an open and prosperous Indopacific region where sovereignty and international law are respected and disputes are resolved through dialogue. In his press statement after holding delegation-level talks with President of Vietnam Mr Tran Dai Quang in New Delhi, Shri Modi said, both countries will work for strengthening Defence, Maritime and energy cooperation. He said Vietnam has played an important role under



'Act East' policy and bilateral trade between the two nations has grown from six billion dollars to 10

billion dollars despite the global slowdown. He said Vietnam President Mr Tran Dai Quang's visit will

strengthen bilateral relations between both the countries. Recalling his Vietnam visit, Prime Minister said both the countries are committed to further boost their relationship, which goes back to 2000 years old. Shri Modi said India and Vietnam inherited the legacy of Mahatma Gandhi and Ho Chi Min and both fought against colonialism. After the talks, India and Vietnam signed three agreements on Nuclear energy partnership, Agriculture and trade. Vietnam President Mr Tran Dai Quang in his press

statement said both the leaders discussed regional security, maritime and cyber security. He said Vietnam is committed to further its ties with India in different areas including energy and connectivity. External Affairs Ministry has said Prime Minister and Vietnamese President held fruitful talks and discussed steps to further strengthen comprehensive strategic partnership in defence and security, trade and investment, atomic energy, agriculture, science and technology, tourism, oil and gas, as well as regional and global issues.

Navjot Kaur clinches India's first gold in Asian Wrestling Championships



Kyrgyzstan, Mar 3
Navjot Kaur has scripted history by becoming the first Indian woman to win a Gold medal at the Senior Asian Wrestling Championships. She clinched the coveted yellow metal in the 65 kg

freestyle category at the tournament being held at Bishkek in Kyrgyzstan. Navjot defeated Japan's Miya Imai, 9-1 in a one-sided final bout yesterday to give India's its first Gold of the ongoing Championships. Rio

Olympics Bronze medalist Sakshi Malik won a bronze in the 62 kg division after getting the better of Kazakhstan's Ayaulym Kassymova, 10-7. The two medals took India's medals tally to six - 1 Gold, 1 Silver and 4 Bronze.

Shubhankar Sharma tied 2nd at WGC-Mexico Championship

Mexico, Mar 3
Rising Indian golfer Shubhankar Sharma grabbed the tied second place at the World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship opening round at Mexico City.



The tournament is featuring 45 of the world's top-five players this week. It was a dream debut for Sharma at the Championship as he fired a sizzling six-under 65. The 21-year-old is playing in the last group alongside Malaysia's Gavin Green and is now one shot behind leader Louis Oosthuizen.

The young Indian prospect arrived in Mexico City in top form, having won co-sanctioned Asian Tour and European Tour tournaments in South Africa and Malaysia over a span of two months. Sharma intends to keep his foot on the pedal despite being in his first WGC tournament.

Pankaj Advani-led India pip Pakistan to win Snooker Team World Cup



Doha, Mar 3
The Indian combine of Pankaj Advani and Manan Chandra staged a remarkable recovery to pip Pakistan in the final of the inaugural IBSF Snooker Team World Cup. After being 0-2 down in the best-of-five final played on Saturday night, India found themselves in a deeper hole at 0-30 down in the third frame.

Thanks to a well-crafted 39 break from Chandra and a classy clearance of the final colours by Advani, the Indian hopes were kept alive. In the fourth frame, even though Advani found himself in a spot of bother when trailing 1-20 against Babar Masih, he took charge of the proceedings and displayed his mastery once again by clearing the table with a 69 break.

This made India draw parity with Pakistan and it all boiled down to the final frame to determine the first winners of the inaugural event. Chandra and Muhammad Asif found themselves in a seesaw frame but it was the Indian who changed gears and did most of the scoring with every given opportunity. Eventually, Chandra only needed the green to be in the safe zone leaving his opponent requiring snookers. But with a long pot on the brown, the humbled Pakistani conceded the frame and match. The Indians made a shaky start in the final with Masih scoring a convincing 73-24 win over Chandra in the opener. Asif then went on to steal the second frame from Advani and win it on the black ball 61-56.

Indian Navy sailboat, INSV Tarini Arrives in Cape Town, South Africa

Cape Town, Mar 3
The Indian Navy's second ocean going sailboat, INSV Tarini entered Cape Town in South Africa yesterday, during it's maiden voyage to circumnavigate the globe. This is the first-ever Indian circumnavigation of the globe by an all-women crew. Defence Minister Smti Nirmala Sitharaman had flagged off INSV Tarini from Goa on 10th September last year. The vessel has covered 17500 Nautical miles from Goa till 19th January this year. Presently, the vessel has covered four of the five legs of the voyage and



entered the last port at Cape Town. It would return to Goa next month on completion of the voyage. The expedition titled Navika Sagar Parikrama, is in consonance with the national policy to empower women to attain their full potential. It also aims to showcase 'Nari Shakti' on the world platform and help in transforming societal attitudes and mindset towards women in India by raising visibility of their participation in challenging environs.

The Director, DHS, Dr. S.P.Burma highlighted about the impact of modern gadgets among the younger generation, especially with related to hearing impairment. He urged people to refrain from listening to high decibel music/sound beyond the threshold.

Dean, ANIIMS, Maj. Gen. Choubey stressed on the preventive aspects of hearing aliment and urged the students of ANIIMS to involve themselves more in public programmes. He also threw light on the various attribute leading to hearing loss.

In his address, the Joint Secretary, NPPCD, Dr. Ashok Subramaniam, through a power point presentation highlighted the statistics of hearing ailments across the globe and stated that by 2030, 630 million will have hearing impaired and by 2050, the number will rise to 900 million. He also threw light on the health infrastructure in Isles and the various IEC programmes carried out by the Health Department in different locations of the Islands.

Earlier, the HoD, Community Medicine, Prof. Jhanvi welcomed the gathering and highlighted about the significance of the day and urged people to take precautionary measures to prevent hearing loss.
