## PM Modi asks BJP MPs to highlight govt's achievements

New Delhi, May 3  
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has asked BJP MPs to campaign on the ongoing welfare schemes for people in view of his government completing two years of tenure at the Centre, later this month.

Minister of State for Parliamentary Affairs, Shri Rajeev Pratap Rudy quoted the Prime minister having said after BJP Parliamentary Party meeting in New Delhi today that Shri Modi said people should be aware of such schemes which are pro-common man initiatives. Shri Rudy said the Prime Minister maintained that the commitment that his government had made to the people, has been fulfilled. During the course



of two years, the government has launched schemes like Jan Dhan Yojana, MUDRA and Beti Bachao Beti Padaho to empower the people. The present government was sworn in on 26th of May 2014. The BJP Parliamentary Party's meeting was attended by the Union Ministers including Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Shri Venkaiah Naidu, Party President Shri Amit Shah and several BJP leaders.

## Draft cabinet note ready on Police modernisation: Home Minister

New Delhi, May 3  
Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh today said a draft cabinet note is ready on police modernisation. Replying to supplementaries in the Lok Sabha, Shri Singh said central assistance for better infrastructural facilities at police stations and strengthening of state government training institutions is provided to state police through the modernisation scheme. In reply to another question, Minister of

State for Home, Shri Haribhai Parathibhai Chaudhary said 109 central police personnel committed suicide in 2015. Shri Chaudhary said in most of the cases domestic and personal problems were the causes for suicide. He said the central government has been advising the state governments to improve the working conditions of their police personnel by undertaking necessary welfare measures.

## Centre proposes setting up of separate units to probe crime against women

New Delhi, May 3  
The Centre has proposed setting up of separate units to probe crime against women in 714 police districts in the country. This was stated by the Minister of State for Home Affairs, Shri Haribhai Parathibhai Chaudhary in a written reply in the Lok Sabha today. He said, the initiative will strengthen the investigative apparatus especially for the heinous crimes against women. The cost will be shared between the States and the Centre on

50:50 basis. The Minister said, the objective of setting up such units is to augment the investigative machinery of the States relating to the crime against women, especially rape, dowry death, acid attack, human trafficking and domestic violence cases involving brutalisation of women. He said, it will instill confidence and encourage women to come forward and lodge their complaint and to improve the gender ratio in the state police forces for effective implementation of the legislations relating to women. The Minister also informed that one hundred fifty such units have already been established. These units will also provide the additional functionalities of proactive policing, intelligence gathering, help in awareness generation and social participation in prevention of crime against women.

## ISI spying on Indian security forces with mobile Apps: Govt

New Delhi, May 3  
Government has said Pakistan intelligence agencies like ISI are spying on Indian Security Forces with the help of mobile Apps. In a written reply in the Lok Sabha today, Minister of State for Home, Shri Haribhai Parathibhai Chaudhary said these agencies are spying by sending malwares, which

damage the system in the mobile apps. These malwares are related to game, music, video and entertainment apps. Shri Chaudhary said the country's security forces have been sensitized about such dubious applications on smart phones. He said the government has also circulated computer security guidelines to all ministries to prevent such cyber attacks. The Minister also informed that Pakistan's spy agency was making efforts to trap ex-servicemen in the garb of providing job opportunities and financial aid for spying. He said seven ex-servicemen have been arrested for espionage activities for the neighbouring country since 2013 to till date.

## Aadhaar appeal grows, downloads go past 40 crore mark

New Delhi, May 3  
Increased acceptance of Aadhaar as a proof to validate credentials has led to a higher number of downloads of the unique ID, which has surpassed over 40 crore till date, the Unique Identification Authority of India said on Monday.



"As on date, Aadhaar downloads have crossed 40 crore. The reasons for popularity of download of Aadhaar through the website can be attributed to increased usage of Aadhaar as a proof of identity and address by service providers and the ease with which residents can download Aadhaar from the UIDAI website," UIDAI said in a statement. The number of people downloading Aadhaar on the UIDAI website is on the rise, with the number of average downloads per day at 6 lakh, it said. The total number of Aadhaar accounts generated as on May 2, 2016, stands at 100.93 crore. In terms of data and validity, e-Aadhaar is the same as its physical variant. The downloaded Aadhaar has also been notified as a valid proof of identity and address by the Reserve Bank of India. "Anyone who has misplaced his/her Aadhaar or is yet to receive Aadhaar card through post can

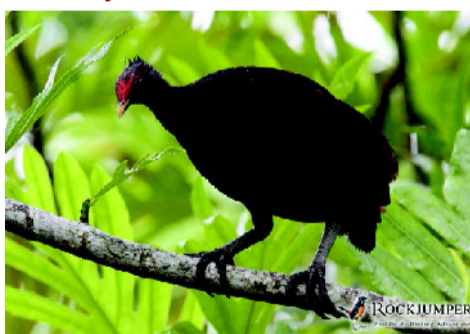
## National Action Plan to boost jobs opportunities for disabled people: Minister

New Delhi, May 3  
Minister of Social Justice and empowerment Shri Thaavar Chand Gehlot said that the National Action Plan for skill development of persons with disabilities (PwDs) has been announced on March 21st last year with a view to impart them skill training. Replying to a question in the Lok Sabha

today, Shri Gehlot said this was designed to enhance the scope of job opportunities for the disabled people in public and private sectors. The Minister informed the House that the National Handicapped Finance Development Corporation (NHFDC) and seven national institutes under his ministry are implementing skill development programmes for the disabled. Shri Gehlot informed the House that during 2015-16, over 17 thousand persons with disabilities were trained through NHFDC. Over ten thousand persons with disabilities have been trained under the skill development programme by the 7 national institutes.

## Restriction imposed on visiting Galathea Bay Wildlife Sanctuary & National Park

Port Blair, May 3  
It has been observed that a pair of Nicobar Megapode, a rare endemic bird of Great Nicobar Island, is in process of construction of a mound for egg laying in Galathea Bay Sanctuary. Many bird watchers, scientists, research fellows, tourists are found to be moving near the mound during the breeding season. Movement of such persons near to mound distracts the birds from nest preparation which



ultimately disturbs in egg laying. The Chief Wildlife Warden, Andaman & Nicobar Islands has desired that no person should visit Galathea Bay Wildlife Sanctuary and Galathea National Park till May 31, 2016 to avoid any kind of disturbance to the nests of Nicobar Megapode, a communication from the Asstt. Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) said.

# 58 weightlifters caught for doping last year: Sports minister

New Delhi, May 3  
A whopping 58 weightlifters were caught for doping last year, Sports Minister Shri Sarbananda Sonowal told the Lok Sabha in a written reply on Tuesday. Shri Sonowal was asked whether the Indian Weightlifting Association (Federation) and such other bodies have recently suspended weightlifters and other sportspersons for testing positive for banned performance-enhancing substances. "During the calendar year 2015, a total number of 58 weightlifters have been found guilty of Anti-Doping Rule violation and the disciplinary proceedings have been initiated against them," Shri Sonowal said. He also informed the House that two Indian weightlifters were caught for doping in the tests conducted by International Weightlifting Federation during the Commonwealth Senior, Junior and Youth Championships held in Pune in October last



year. The Sports Minister's revelations came just a few days after India has been placed at the third spot in worldwide dope violation in 2014 in a report published by World Anti-Doping Agency. Athletics and weightlifting are two sports most affected by

doping in the country for some time. Shri Sonowal said that National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA), established in 2009 with an aim to promote dope free sports in the country, regularly conducted testing in-competition and out-of-competition on athletes participating in various events in the country. **India to visit Zimbabwe for ODI, T20I series**  
Harare, May 3  
Ahead of their gruelling tour to the West Indies, the Indian team will travel to Zimbabwe for a short limited-overs series next month, Zimbabwe Cricket confirmed on Tuesday. The series comprising three One-Day Internationals (ODIs) and as many Twenty20 Internationals (T20Is) will be played at the Harare Sports Club. The six matches will be played over 12 days, starting with the ODIs to be played from June 11 to 15 and the T20Is from June 18 to 22.

## Virat Kohli recommended for Khel Ratna, Ajinkya Rahane for Arjuna Award

New Delhi, May 3  
The Indian Cricket Board has recommended Test captain Virat Kohli for the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna, the country's highest sporting honour, and Ajinkya Rahane for the Arjuna award this year. If Kohli wins, he would become only the third cricketer after the iconic Sachin Tendulkar and the country's most successful captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni to win India's highest sporting honour. BCCI sources confirmed the development. It is after a gap of four years that a cricketer has been recommended for the Khel Ratna. The prestigious Khel Ratna award carries a cash price of Rs. 7.5 lakh in addition to a citation, while the Arjuna awardee receives a cash prize of Rs. 5 lakh and a citation.



Kohli is enjoying a fine run of form in the ongoing Indian Premier League. He was also at the top of his game in the preceding ICC World T20, single-handedly guiding India to wins over Australia, Pakistan and Bangladesh. For his exploits, Kohli was named the World T20 Player of the Tournament and skipper of the World T20 team.

Rahane equalled the record of holding the highest number of catches in a Test innings during India's series win against Sri Lanka last year under Kohli's leadership. According to sources, Kohli is facing competition from squash champion Deepika Pallikal, golfer Anirban Lahiri, Asian Games gold medalist shooter Jitu Rai and runner Tintu Luka.

"The BCCI and the West Indies Cricket Board (WICB) have resolved outstanding issues arising out of the abandonment of the tour of the West Indies team to India in 2014," the BCCI said in a statement. "With this understanding, bilateral series as part of the Future Tours Programme will be resumed with the Indian cricket team touring the West Indies in July-August, 2016 for a four-match Test series." "BCCI is happy to resume their bilateral ties with WICB. We recognise that West Indies has a huge role to play in the development of cricket and we are happy to support their endeavours," BCCI secretary Anurag Thakur said. "This tour will further strengthen the bond between the Indian and the West Indian fans, who have over the years patronized this glorious game of cricket," he added.

## Sachin accepts IOA's invitation to become goodwill ambassador

New Delhi, May 3  
Cricket legend Sachin Tendulkar has accepted Indian Olympic Association's (IOA) invitation to become the country's goodwill ambassador for the upcoming Rio Olympics. Tendulkar is the third goodwill ambassador roped in by IOA after Bollywood actor Salman Khan and ace shooter Abhinav Bindra. The IOA on Tuesday confirmed that Tendulkar has accepted its offer after the national Olympic body had invited the batting legend to come on board on April 29. "Sachin Tendulkar has accepted our request to become goodwill ambassador of Indian contingent at the Olympics. We have received the official communication from him accepting our request," IOA Secretary General Rajiv Mehta said. "We are very happy to have an iconic sportsperson like Mr Tendulkar on board as goodwill ambassador. We are thankful to him. We hope his association and the association of other goodwill ambassadors will take Indian sport forward," he added.
