## Prime Minister to embark on five nation tour today

New Delhi, June 3 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will embark tomorrow on a five nation tour to Afghanistan, Qatar, Switzerland, United States and Mexico. On the first leg of his visit, Shri Modi will visit Herat in Western part of Afghanistan tomorrow afternoon. There, he will inaugurate India-Afghan Friendship Dam earlier known as Salma Dam. He will also hold meetings

with Afghan leadership and discuss issues of mutual and regional interest. In the evening, the Prime Minister will arrive at Doha, the capital of Qatar. This is the highest-level visit from India to Qatar since the visit of the then Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh to Doha in 2008. During his visit to Switzerland, Shri Modi and the President of the Swiss

Confederation Mr Johann Schneider-Ammann will hold discussions on bilateral, regional and multilateral issues of mutual interest. In the United States, Shri Modi will address a Joint Meeting of the US Congress. The main objective of the forthcoming visit of Prime Minister would be to consolidate the progress made in diverse areas such

as economy, energy, environment, defence and security, and to intensify cooperation for the future. The Prime Minister will wind up his tour by visiting Mexico on 8th of this month and hold talks with leadership of that country. The bilateral relations between India and Mexico have witnessed renewed vigour and activity in the last two years.

### Chief Justice of Jharkhand High Court to visit Isles

Port Blair, June 3 The Chief Justice, High Court of Jharkhand, Mr. Justice Virender Singh will be arriving here tomorrow (June 4) on a week-long visit to the Islands. During his stay here, the Chief Justice will visit various places of historical importance and tourist interests in the Islands. On completion of the tour, Justice Singh will leave for mainland on June 11, 2016, an official communication said here today.

## PM stresses on mapping and identification of skills



New Delhi, June 3 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has stressed on the need for proper skill mapping and identification of the future requirements for skills, so that school-children and parents are well aware of the emerging trends in the job market. Chairing the first meeting of the Governing Council of the National Skill Development Mission in New Delhi yesterday, Shri Modi said, a similar exercise should also be done to map the

skilled manpower requirements at the global level, so that India can meet the global requirement of skilled workforce. The Prime Minister also emphasized the importance of imbuing safety norms and soft skills as integral parts of skill development. During the meeting it was decided that skill training will be scaled up to cover at least 1.5 crore people during 2016-2017. The Central Board for Skills Certification will be set up by September this year to

### Relationship with India is of incredible significance: US

Washington, June 3 The United States has said it views India as a vital partner in the region and the relationship between the two countries is of incredible significance to the world. US State Department Deputy Spokesman Mr Mark Toner said this days ahead of the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's visit to Washington. He said that United States is very much looking forward to Prime Minister Shri Modi's visit. Mr Toner said that the breadth of the US-Indian relationship is wide and it addresses security. He added that the United States is looking to build closer relationships across the board with India. Shri Modi is scheduled to arrive in Washington on June 6 on a three-day visit.

### Centre to complete remaining infrastructure works at border in next three years

New Delhi, June 3 The Centre has said that it will complete almost all the remaining infrastructure works at the border in next three years. Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh reviewed the Border Management at a meeting in New Delhi yesterday in which Minister of State for Home Shri Kiren Rijiju and senior officials of the Department of Border Management were present. An official release said, during the meeting it was informed that major



impediments hampering the development of border infrastructure have been resolved which will increase the pace of development of border infrastructure in coming years. Shri Singh directed the officials to complete the fencing along Indo-Bangladesh border in Assam.

### Registration must include woman's name under PMAY urban: Minister

New Delhi, June 3 Union Urban Development Minister, Shri M Venkaiah Naidu has said, it would be mandatory for houses built in urban areas under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, to be registered in the name of a woman alone or jointly with a man. Shri Naidu, who also holds the Housing and Urban

Poverty Alleviation portfolio, said in a tweet message, since construction of two crore houses for urban poor is being envisaged to address housing shortage, as many poor urban women stand to benefit under this scheme. Till last month, the government had approved a total investment of Rs.

43,922 crore for construction of 6,83,724 houses for urban poor under the scheme with central assistance commitment of Rs. 10,050 crore. Under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban) launched in June last year, two crore houses for urban poor is to be built by 2022.

### Universe expanding faster than expected

Washington, June 3 The universe is expanding faster than expected and scientists speculate the finding may be explained by a mysterious force called dark radiation. An international team of researchers of the Space Telescope Science Institute and The Johns Hopkins University have made the most accurate measurements so far of the universe's rate of expansion following the Big Bang 13.8 billion years ago. They discovered the universe is expanding 5 per cent to 9 per cent faster than expected. The findings, to be published in The Astrophysical Journal, have prompted a rethink of our understanding of the universe and in particular, the concepts of dark matter and dark energy.

New Delhi, June 3 The India Meteorological Department, IMD has maintained its earlier forecast of more than above rainfall this year in the country. Briefing reporters in New Delhi yesterday, Director General of IMD, Shri L S Rathore said, the monsoon seasonal rainfall is likely to be 106 per cent of the long period average. Shri Rathore said, the region-wise distribution of rainfall will also be good.

Port Blair, June 3 With the commencement of Andaman & Nicobar Islands Institute of Medical Sciences, Port Blair, several departments have been established under it and one such department is the Department of Forensic Medicine. Forensic Medicine Department with its intrinsic expertise is extending all the help and cooperation to the A & N Administration in providing justice and maintenance of law & order, there by promoting peace & prosperity in the society.

Increase in population has led to various social problems like increased alcohol abuse and crime rate, necessitating the availability of a well and smoothly functioning Criminal justice system, which in turn helps in maintaining the law and order in the society. Forensic

Medicine Department examines and opines on the medico legal cases brought to the Medical College by the police such as the victims of murder, accidents, suicidal deaths, sexual assault & other police cases where foul play is suspected. These cases are examined very systematically and diligently, all incriminating evidences are collected and all the findings are properly documented. Subsequently a proper report is prepared and a copy of it is handed over to the police, which is then, produced in the court as an evidence. Besides this report, various queries, whether a given case is a murder or not, whether it's a case of sexual assault or not, are also answered in a scientific manner, so as to help the police and the judiciary in proper delivery of justice. New Delhi, June 3  
India will begin their four-Test series against the West Indies on July 21 after playing a couple of warm-up matches in their 49-day tour of the Caribbean. India will arrive in St. Kitts on July 6 to play a two-day warm-up fixture at Warner Park on July 9 and 10. At the same venue, they will play a three-day game from July 14-16. The first Test will be played at Antigua starting from July 21 which will be followed by the second Test at Sabina Park, Jamaica, the BCCI said in a statement. The Indians will then travel to St. Lucia for the third Test, to be



played at the Darren Sammy Cricket Stadium from August 9. The final game of the series will be held at the Queen's Park Oval in Trinidad from Aug 18. The team will depart for home on August 23. Vijender, who switched from amateur to pro-boxing last year, took part in the London Games in 2012. The Haryana boxer has been unbeaten in his professional fights but still seeks Olympic glory. Since India currently does not have an AIBA recognised boxing federation and is run by an adhoc committee, Vijender is



still waiting to learn about the qualification process. AIBA's Olympic qualifier event for pro boxers will be held in Venezuela in July. This will be clashing with Vijender's WBO Asian title belt in Delhi. The 30-year-old former amateur world No. 1 in middleweight, Vijender may not be left with any time or chance to make the cut.

Professional boxers allowed competing at Rio 2016

New Delhi, June 3  
Professional boxers can compete at the upcoming 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, the sport's governing body ruled in a landmark decision on Wednesday. The revolutionary decision is however unlikely to see boxing's biggest names enter the Olympic ring in Rio. For most professionals, like former heavyweight champion Wladimir Klitschko, it is already too late to take part in a qualifying contest. The last tournament is in Venezuela in July. There is a rich history of fighters making their name at the Olympics before moving on to have groundbreaking professional careers, including Muhammad Ali, who won gold at the Rome Games in 1960, when he was still known by his birth name, Cassius Clay.

Economy can touch 8% growth with favourable monsoon: FinMin

New Delhi, June 3  
Finance Ministry has said that economy can touch 8 per cent growth level if the monsoon is favourable. Talking to reporters in New Delhi yesterday, Economic Affairs Secretary Shri Shaktikanta Das said, this year the projections for monsoon are good and he hoped that India will be able to reach 8 per cent growth in the current year. Shri Das said the fiscal deficit and the revenue deficit during 2015-16 were fully contained and targets were achieved. India's economy grew by 7.9 per cent in March quarter to consolidate its position as the fastest growing major economy, leaving behind China. The growth was 7.2 per cent in 2014-15. He said, the fiscal deficit during 2015-16 was contained at 3.9 per cent of the GDP, in line with the budget projections. Shri Das said, Revenue deficit showed significant improvement due to increase in capital expenditure of the government.

over the onerous task of conducting Medico Legal post mortem examinations since July 2015. With the expertise available at its command, department of Forensic Medicine is now handing over the post mortem reports in a properly printed performa in a day or two only.

Not only has the quality and timely reporting of PM reports has helped the Andaman Police, the Forensic Medicine department is also actively helping the Andaman Police in many other ways e.g. several expert opinions are given, that have helped in solving various types of cases. Besides, multiple training sessions have been conducted by the faculty of Forensic Medicine department of ANIIMS at Police training School, Prothrapur on a variety of topics, thus enabling the Andaman police to perform better. Capacity to preserve the dead bodies in cold storage facility of GB Pant Hospital Mortuary has been doubled. Post Mortem examination tables have been increased to 3. Separate AC room for conducting inquest is now a reality. Embalming of dead bodies is performed on an average of 6 bodies/month, with provision of necessary documents for air lifting.

The release added, over 223 kilometers fence has been constructed for sealing of Indo-Bangladesh Border and there are 122 locations where physical barrier is not present. It was decided that 100 locations covering 11.9 kilometers area will have fence and 22 locations in riverine areas will have non-physical barriers including technological barriers which will completely seal the border and it will be achieved by June, 2017. The Home Minister also directed for full use of technology to secure sensitive areas along the borders. This will involve networking of equipments including High Resolution Cameras, Radars, Unattended Ground Sensors, Optical Fibres and Infra Red Sensors.
