## Strike balance between conservation needs, development requirements: President to Forest Officers

New Delhi, Aug 3  
A group of 89 Probationers of Indian Forest Service (2016 Batch) from Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy, Dehradun called on the President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind at Rashtrapati Bhavan today. Addressing the Forest Service Officers, the President said that they have chosen a very noble profession. Forests have always been special to Indian ethos and culture. Our civilisation has derived its intellectual and spiritual strength from forests. These forests, therefore, are not merely a resource but they also cover the cultural, spiritual and intellectual heritage of the country. The onus of



protecting this heritage is now on the Forest Service Officers. On them lies the responsibility of ensuring environmental security, accommodating the

sustainable development needs of the country. The President said that in the past few decades, the world has woken up to threats to the very survival

of humankind due to environmental degradation, depletion in forest cover and above all global warming leading to climate change. India has

## RBI asks banks to work towards account number portability

Mumbai, Aug 3  
Reserve Bank of India Deputy Governor Shri S S Mundra has asked banks to work towards account number portability, as it will be a far-reaching step towards enhancing competition and improving customer service. Speaking at the annual conference of banking ombudsmen in Mumbai recently, he said banks should look forward to providing more choices to the new generation of

customers who are more technology savvy. Shri Mundra said this will be further accentuated with the possibility of portability of accounts and urged the banks to work towards account number portability. Shri Mundra also referred to issue of the rising trend of loss of cheques from drop boxes and the lack of alacrity shown by banks in redressing such complaints. He asked the banks to look at the

possibility of setting up a common account and compensate the customers immediately from the pool, without waiting for recovery of the amount from insurance. Referring to the tenets of the Charter of 'Customer Rights', Shri Mundra asked the lenders and the Indian Banks' Association (IBA) to work towards evolving a common platform to provide a comparative and transparent view of various products and services.

## Rules amended for diversion of land

## Land Use Committee constituted with Chief Secretary as Chairman

Port Blair, Aug 3  
The Andaman and Nicobar Administration vide notification dated 26th July 2017 has amended the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Land Revenue and Land Reforms Rules 1968, and has brought some changes in it. According to a press release received here from the Sub Divisional Officer, South Andaman, the Land Use Committee has been constituted with Chief Secretary as Chairman,

Principal Chief Conservator of Forest, Principal Secretary/Secretary (Revenue), Secretary (Tourism), Secretary (UD), Deputy Commissioner of area concerned, Country and Town Planner as Members and the Deputy Secretary (Revenue) as Member Secretary. All the diversion cases above 500sqmts will be taken up by the said committee. From now on, the tenant should compulsorily

develop the land /project in full shape, as per the Detailed Project Report (DPR) submitted at the time of applying for diversion within a period of 03 years from the date of diversion. If the applicant fails to do so, then penalty (as notified separately) shall be imposed by the SDO immediately on the date of lapse of window period and recorded as encumbrance in the land records (ROR) till the tenant clears his dues. The penalty will

increase on year to year basis by 100%. The applicant shall not transfer the land within 10 years from the date of diversion. If the applicant wants to transfer the interest of the land without executing the project/plan within 10 years from the date of conversion then the advantage of land conversion shall not be transferable and the land shall be transferred on with its original land

## Orthopaedics Department expresses gratitude

Port Blair, Aug 3  
RK, a 31 year old worker, with the Forest Department at Diglipur, met with an accident when the motorcycle he was riding collided with a bus near Kalighat Power House at around 1:45 pm on 27.12.2016. His right lower limb was shattered with comminuted compound fractures of his thigh, leg and a crush injury that had fractured almost all the bones of his foot, he was also losing a lot of blood. With the help of the local public and the Forest Department officials, he was immediately shifted to Diglipur CHC. The Chief Medical Officer of the CHC Dr. Jaya Biswas and her team

attended to the patient. The patient was in hemorrhagic shock due to excessive loss of blood from his injuries. 2 units of blood were immediately transfused and the right lower limb was splinted after dressing the wounds. As the regular Helicopter was not available, with the help of the DFO (Diglipur), a Navy Helicopter was arranged, which airlifted the patient to Port Blair within a matter of 2 hours. The ANIIMS G.B.Pant Hospital Orthopaedics Department had been informed of the airlift. HOD Dr. Amit Ray and Dr. Sunil Baliga, Senior Resident in Orthopaedics were waiting

for RK who arrived at the hospital by 8PM. The team immediately started resuscitating and stabilizing the patient. RK was in a state of shock and his blood pressure was unrecordable. The multiple wounds in his right lower limb were thoroughly washed and sutured. The fractures in his lower limb were stabilized with POP slabs. The right foot was crushed and looked unsalvageable. Next morning, he underwent fixation of the femur (thigh bone) with an Intramedullary Interlocking Nail and debridement of the foot. The bones in the foot were

# Devendra Jhajharia, Sardar Singh recommended for Khel Ratna; Harmanpreet Kaur, Cheteshwar Pujara for Arjuna awards

New Delhi, Aug 3  
The award selection committee today, recommended names of Paralympian Devendra Jhajharia and former Hockey India captain Sardar Singh for Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna awards, while cricketers Cheteshwar Pujara, Harmanpreet Kaur were listed among 17 sportspersons for Arjuna awards.

Jhajharia had won a gold medal in men's javelin throw F46 category in the Rio Paralympics, becoming the most successful Indian para athlete ever. The 35-year-old, a left-hand amputee, is the only Indian para athlete to have won two gold medals in the Paralympics, the earlier one being the yellow metal he won in 2004 Athens.

Sardar, on the other hand, has been an ever-present pivot in Hockey India's recent



resurgence. He made his debut for India in the junior team during India's tour to Poland in 2003-04. In 2006, he graduated to the senior side making debut against Pakistan. Known for his high fitness levels not only in India but worldwide, Sardar was included in the 18-men FIH All Star team in 2010 and 2011.

He was the youngest player to captain the Indian team when he led the side at the 2008 Sultan Azlan Shah Cup. He has also received the Arjuna Award in 2012 and Padma Shri in 2015. The awards selection committee has listed 17 names for the Arjuna award. The list includes cricketer men's team Test regular Cheteshwar Pujara, women's team World

Cup star Harmanpreet Kaur, Paralympic medallists Mariyappan Thangavelu and Varun Bhati, golfer SSP Chawrasia and hockey player S V Sunil. The Sports Ministry, however, is yet to confirm the names. Last year, PV Sindhu, Sakshi Malik, Dipa Karmakar and Jitu Rai were honoured with the Khel Ratna awards. It was the first time the Khel Ratna was awarded to four sportspersons.

# Usain Bolt prepares for his final hurrah at World Athletics Championships



London, Aug 3  
Few men have captured the imagination in the history of sport the way Jamaican ace Usain Bolt has. And now the great track and field superstar is getting ready for his final hurrah as the World Athletics Championships kicks off in London on Friday.

In a career that has seen him win 11 gold medals at the championships, you know that whatever happens in London will only add to his legend and not give it any new meaning. He has also bagged eight Olympic gold medals in a career that is quite simply the best ever as far as sprinting is concerned. At the age of 30, one knows that Bolt is not the youngest man in the sport.

Whether he can do what he usually does at a big event, which is win three gold medals, depends on his level of fitness and more importantly his urge. He will of course start as the favourite in both the 100 m as well as the 200 m event. And then there is the 100 m relay in which the Jamaicans are usually the best.

So hold on these moments in your memory and see the great man for one last time. This is simply because he is like no other and to imagine that we have another like him will be quite simply asking for the sky.

Lokesh Rahul who returned to the playing eleven replacing Abhinav Mukund made a half century. He was run out for 57. Shikhar Dhawan fell for 35 and and



Skipper Virat Kohli was out for just 13. Team India is leading the 3-

match series, 1-0. They had won the first Test at Galle last week by 304 runs.

# Yuki Bhambri stuns French star Gael Monfils to reach pre-quarterfinals of Washington Open

Washington, Aug 3  
In Tennis, India's Yuki Bhambri has stunned world number 22 Gael Monfils of France to reach the pre-quarterfinals of the Washington Open in the United States. In a second round match last night, Bhambri, ranked 200, got the better of sixth seed and defending champion Monfils, 6-3, 4-6, 7-5 to make it to the Round-of-16. Bhambri will next meet Guido Pella of Argentina for a place in the quarterfinals. Pella had defeated Ramkumar Ramanathan in the opening round.



In the Doubles, Sania Mirza and Rohan Bopanna, with their team-mates, progressed to the quarterfinals. Sania and her Romanian partner Monica Niculescu are the top seeds in Women's Doubles, while Bopanna pairing with American Donald Young are unseeded in the Men's section.

tentatively fixed with multiple Kirschner-Wires. 5 days later, on 2.1.2017, the tibia was fixed with an Intramedullary Interlocking Nail under spinal anesthesia. The patient was then referred to Mainland on 5.1.2017 for further plastic surgery. RK's brother MK said "the doctors there were shocked to note that a person with such grievous injuries was so efficiently managed. In fact they also were astonished that the patient was referred to them as they had only very little to do to complete RK's treatment". He underwent plastic surgery to reconstruct his foot and only three toes were amputated due to gangrene. The patient returned to Port Blair on 8.2.2017. He was readmitted in ANIMS GB Pant Hospital for rehabilitation. He reported back to duty on 1.06.2017. It is improbable that anywhere in India, except for the A&N Islands, a patient with such grievous life threatening injuries, more than 300 kms away from the nearest Secondary Medical Center could have been managed without loss of life or limb or permanent disability. The Department of Orthopaedics, ANIMS GB Pant Hospital has expressed gratitude to Dr. Shipra Paul, Director of Health Services for coordinating the whole exercise, Dr. Jaya Biswas and her team at Diglipur CHC, the Indian Navy for airlifting our patient at such short notice and the Plastic Surgeon affiliated to the DHS, who reconstructed his right foot, a communication said.

the land mass should be under forest cover. The Forest Service Officers have to find ways and means to enrich the natural forests, and facilitate bringing non-forest areas under tree cover. They have joined a public service and are the nation's soldiers in an important area of environmental and ecological conservation. The President urged them to discharge their duties fairly, without fear, with honesty, and in such a way that their actions benefit the nation and common citizens as a whole. The President said that India is one of the fastest growing economies in the world and we have set ourselves stiff targets. The Forest Service Officers have to strike a balance between conservation needs and development requirements. Their job is not to pose problems but to provide solutions, he said.
