PM Modi-Angela Merkel to discuss steps to scale up Indo-German ties

New Delhi, Oct 4

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and German Chancellor Ms. Angela Merkel will hold wide-ranging talks in New Delhi tomorrow to significantly scale up bilateral relations in an array of key sectors with special focus on boosting trade, security and defence ties.

The talks are likely to focus on deepening bilateral engagement in defence, security, education, renewable energy, high technology, skill development, science and technology, railways, water and waste management, urban development and agriculture. India and Germany are strategic partners since 2001. Ms Merkel's three-day visit here comes around six months after Prime Minister Shri Modi's visit to Germany and there have been expectations of "path-breaking results" from the summit-level Inter-



Governmental Consultations (IGC) between the two leaders who have been pushing for unlocking the potential and taking the ties to higher trajectory. Prime Minister Shri Modi and Ms Merkel, accompanied by a large delegation of several Cabinet Ministers and top officials besides CEOs of several top German companies, are expected to delve deep on removing bottlenecks for expanding bilateral trade and investment.

The German Chancellor is expected to convey problems faced by German industries in proceeding with planned investments. Both the leaders are also likely to exchange views on regional and global issues of common concern such as climate change.

Germany is India's largest trading partner in the European Union and the seventh largest foreign investor in India. The overall exchange of goods and services (Contd. on last page)

PAN to be must for high cash spending: FM

New Delhi, Oct 4

The Government will soon make it mandatory to furnish PAN card details for cash transactions beyond a certain threshold to check generation of domestic black money, Union Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said.

In a Facebook post on Sunday, he said the monitoring regime of the Income Tax Department

has been strengthened. Its ability to detect large cash withdrawals, or large cash transactions which enter the system, is being strengthened. He added that the bulk of black money was within India itself. No society can indefinitely sustain a system where income earners consider tax evasion to be a way of life.

1st meeting of NSAC to be held in New Delhi today

The first meeting of the National Sagarmala Apex Committee (NSAC) will be held in New Delhi tomorrow. Sagarmala is an initiative that aims at promoting port-led development along India's 7,500 kilometer long coastline. An official release said, the agenda of meeting includes discussions on concept of Sagarmala, action taken on setting up of Sagarmala Institutional

Mechanism and role of the Centre as well as states in project identification and implementation. The prime objective of the Sagarmala project is to promote port-led direct and indirect development and to provide infrastructure to transport goods to and from ports quickly, efficiently and cost-effectively. The meeting will be chaired by Union Minister for Shipping and Road Transport Shri Nitin Gadkari.

DRDO sets up world's highest terrestrial research centre

New Delhi, Oct 4

Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has established the world's highest terrestrial research centre at Changla near Pengong lake in Ladakh. The centre will serve as a natural cold storage for preserving rare and endangered medical plants for generations to come.

The centre was inaugurated by

Director General, DRDO Dr S Christopher. Defence Institute of High Altitude Research (DIHAR), Leh, a constituent establishment of DRDO has established this Extreme Altitude Research Centre at Changla at 17,600 ft above mean sea level.

The centre will act as an important utility for research work in frontal areas of food and agriculture and bio-

medical sciences for well being of the soldiers deployed in high altitude cold desert. A large number of Life Sciences activities are proposed to be undertaken at this centre.

Demonstration on amphibious operations for school children planned

Port Blair, Oct. 4

As part of 15th Raising Day Celebrations, ANC is planning demonstration on amphibious operations for school children at Corbyn's Cove at 2 pm on October 11, 2015.

Ships, aircraft, army troops and marine Commandos will participate in this demonstration. The school children will be able to witness wide range of activities such as ships closing on to the beach, from which tracked vehicles with heavy armour will roll on to the

beach, with soldiers in combat dress with weapons.

The helicopters, hovering several meters above the ground, will show the soldiers slithering down speedily using special ropes. The marine Commandos in full combat gear will also be part of the demonstration, in which they will approach the beach in fast moving dinghies and take position for combat beach reconnaissance. Apart from these, military aircraft will also take part in the demonstration.

This demonstration is open for about 600 - 700 school children, only from Classes 8 to 12, accompanied by their escort teachers. The visitors are requested to arrive by 2 pm, not to miss out on any part of the demonstration. The Supreme Court of India constituted a committee under Justice Shri. K.S Radhakrishnan, to monitor and measure implementation of Road Safety laws in the country. The committee on the basis of detailed analysis of traffic accidents and fatalities, came to the conclusion that unless strong and urgent measures are taken to deal violators with over speeding, drunken driving, red light jumping,

violation of helmet laws and seat belt laws, use of mobile phones while driving, and over loading, the number of accidents and fatalities will continue to remain high.

Accordingly, the Transport Department here proposes to initiate a number of actions. These include 'suspension of the license for a period of not less than 3 months for driving at a speed exceeding the specified limit which would also include red light jumping; carrying overload in goods

Shashank Manohar elected unopposed as BCCI president

Mumbai, Oct 4
Shashank Manohar of the Vidarbha Cricket Association takes over as BCCI president after he was declared elected unopposed at a special general meeting at the Cricket Centre in Mumbai.



The meeting which saw Mr. Manohar elected unopposed as the BCCI President, lasted less than half an hour. He was the only candidate left in the fray for the election, in which the deadline for filing nomination ended last evening. The election was necessitated by the sudden demise of Jagmohan Dalmiya, who had a short term of seven months after his election in March this year. All the six units of East Zone unanimously proposed Mr. Manohar's candidature for the president's post, reflecting Mr. Srinivasan's diminishing hold in Board's power politics. A BCCI by-election needs only one proposer from the zone which is electing the president

and it was the East's turn this time. Mr. Manohar got the nod from all the six associations and was the lone nomination at the end of the 7 pm deadline yesterday. Interestingly, one of the proposers for Mr. Manohar was Dalmiya's son Avishek, who was representing his family club National Cricket Club (NCC) in the SGM. Mr. Srinivasan skipped the meeting and the Tamil Nadu Cricket Association was

represented by P.S. Raman. The others who proposed Mr. Manohar's name were Sourav Ganguly from Bengal, Sourav Dasgupta from Tripura, Gautam Roy from Assam, Ashirbad Behera of Odisha and Sanjay Singh of Jharkhand State Cricket Association (JSCA). Manohar has the responsibility to guide the BCCI to its stable self after a troubled era under Mr. Srinivasan, whose tenure was marred by acrimony within and outside the Board's portals.

India look to bounce back in second T20 against South Africa

Cuttack, Oct 4
Handed a defeat in the first Twenty20 International, a determined India will look to plug the loopholes in bowling and bounce back in a must-win second T20 of the three-match series against South Africa here on Monday. It's an unfamiliar situation for India to start a home series on a losing note, and the manner of the defeat in Dharamsala would put the hosts under tremendous pressure, especially the bowlers. Back after a break of three months, the onus would be on limited overs skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni

to bring the team out of the rut and ensure India get back to winning ways. Unlike Dharamsala, the conditions are expected to be ideal for Dhoni's men here and the third T20 in Kolkata as the surface is likely to be low and slow in nature with rains and thundershowers in past few days. In bigger picture ahead of the World Twenty20 in India next year, the match in Dharamsala can be a reality check for the hosts who have not played much T20s in recent past -- four compared to South Africa's 11 post World T20 in Bangladesh last year. Rafael Nadal to face Chinese Wu Di in Beijing

Beijing, Oct 4
Spanish tennis icon Rafael Nadal will meet Chinese world No.224 Wu Di in the first round of the China Open, which kicks off here early next week, and could face Frenchman Jo-Wilfried Tsonga a couple of rounds later. Also in Nadal's half of the draw, which was released on Saturday, are second seeded Czech Tomas Berdych, who will square off against Uruguay's Pablo Cuevas in the first round, Efe reported. Nadal, the third seed, arrives in the Chinese capital after losing on Friday to Serbian world No.1 Novak Djokovic in an exhibition match in Bangkok.

Jyoti Randhawa lone Indian to make cut at St. Andrews

St. Andrews, Oct 4
Jyoti Randhawa managed to make the three-round cut at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship despite a horrendous four-bogey streak in the middle of the third round at Carnoustie. Randhawa, who has been playing a limited schedule, made up just enough on the back nine with three birdies and squeezed inside the cutline. Randhawa had rounds of 70 (at Kingsbarns), 69 (at Old Course, St Andrews) and 71 at Carnoustie to total six-under 210 and be in tied-50th place after 54 holes. However, the other three Indians

-- Shiv Kapur (75 at Old Course, 70 at Kingsbarns and 70 at Carnoustie) at one-under 215; Jeev Milkha Singh (77 at St Andrews, 76 at Carnoustie and 73 at Kingsbarns) at 10-over and SSP Chawrasia (77 at Kingsbarns, 75 at Old Course, 75 at Carnoustie) at 11-over -- missed the cut. Meanwhile, Thorbjorn Olesen took a commanding three shot lead into the final round after posting a seven under par 65 yesterday. The two-time European Tour winner took advantage of ideal conditions at St Andrews, firing eight birdies and a solitary bogey to move to 17 under par.

Rashid Khan Finishes Tied Third in Taiwan Masters Golf

Mumbai, Oct 4
Rashid Khan's late charge after a very disappointing start put paid to his chances of a third Asian Tour title as he finished tied third at the Mercuries Taiwan Masters, even as Danny Chia ended a 13-year drought between his first and second Asian Tour titles. (Latest Sports News) Rashid, who held sole lead at the halfway stage, had seven bogeys, four of them on the front nine, and even three birdies between 12th and 16th failed to

get his challenge going. Rashid (76) ended at one-over 289. Veteran Malaysian Chia held on despite a nightmarish finish of four bogeys on back including three in a row from 15th to 17th to total three-under 285 win by two shots over Liang Wen-chong (76), who himself bogeyed the last three holes to total one-under 287. Interestingly, the 42-year-old Chia's only other title on Asian Tour also came in Taiwan at the Taiwan Open in 2002. He has two other wins on Asian Development Tour.

between the two countries was valued at around around 15.96 billion euros last year, a drop of 1.14 billion euros from the level of 16.10 billion euros registered in 2013. While India's exports to Germany rose marginally to 7.03 billion euros in 2014, its German imports dropped to 8.92 billion euros from 9.19 euros in the previous year. More than 1,600 Indo-German collaborations and around 600 Indo-German joint ventures are currently in operation. Ahead of Ms Merkel's visit, German Ambassador Martin Ney said the 3rd Inter-Governmental Consultations are expected to come out with "path-breaking results" and inking of "substantial" number of agreements between the two countries.

drink and drugs and using mobile phone while driving a vehicle. If a person driving a vehicle under the influence of drinks and drugs, the police may prosecute the offender and seek imprisonment as prescribed under Section 185 of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988 even for the first offence. In case where the law relating to the use of helmet is violated by either the main rider or the pillion rider, they would be subjected to Road Safety Education and Counselling for not less than 2 hours before imposition of fine as prescribed under the Act. Those who violate the seat belt law also be subject to Road Safety Education and Counselling before imposition of fine, a communication from the Licensing Authority, Directorate of Transport, A&N Administration said.
