PM Modi outlines 10-point agenda for disaster risk reduction

New Delhi, Nov 3 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today sought greater cohesion in international response to disasters. Inaugurating the Asian Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction in New Delhi, Shri Modi outlined a ten-point agenda for renewing efforts towards disaster risk reduction. He said, all development sectors must imbibe the principles of disaster risk management and a network of universities should be developed to work on disaster issues. The Prime Minister called for greater involvement and leadership of women in disaster risk

from past disasters, the Prime Minister said, it now has a fully functional Indian Ocean Tsunami Warning System. Shri Modi said, countries have to wholeheartedly embrace the spirit of Sendai Framework which calls for an all-of-society approach to disaster risk management. Aim of the 3-day conference is to find ways for better management of disaster risk. The conference will come out with a declaration consolidating the political commitment of governments towards preventing and reducing risk as well as strengthening resilience by accelerating implementation.

GST Council decides on 4-tier tax structure of 5-28 pc

New Delhi, Nov 3 A 4-tier GST tax structure of 5, 12, 18 and 28 per cent, with lower rates for essential items and the highest for luxury and demerit goods that would also attract an additional cess, was decided by the all-powerful GST Council today. With a view to keeping inflation under check, essential items including food, which presently constitute roughly half of the consumer inflation basket, will be taxed at zero rate. The lowest rate of 5 per cent would be for common use items while there would be two standard rates of 12 and 18 per cent under the Goods and Services Tax (GST) regime targeted to be rolled out

from April 1, 2017. Announcing the decisions arrived at the first day of the two-day GST Council meeting, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said highest tax slab will be applicable to items which are currently taxed at 30-31 per cent (excise duty plus VAT). Luxury cars, tobacco and aerated drinks would also be levied with an additional cess on top of the highest tax rate. The collection from this cess as well as that of the clean energy cess would create a revenue pool which would be used for compensating states for any loss of revenue during the first five years of implementation of GST. The cess, he said, would be

lapsable after five years. Shri Jaitley said about Rs 50,000 crore would be needed to compensate states for loss of revenue from rollout of GST, which is to subsume a host of central and state taxes like excise duty, service tax and VAT, in the first year. The 4-tier tax structure agreed to has slight modification to the 6, 12, 18 and 26 per cent slab that were under discussion at the GST Council last month. The structure to be agreed is a compromise to accommodate demand for highest tax rate of 40 per cent by states like Kerala. While the Centre proposed to levy a 4 per cent GST on gold, a final decision was put off, Shri Jaitley said.

In a letter to all varsities, the UGC said, it has been noticed that some institutions or universities offering education through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode have issued the degrees, mark-sheets, diplomas, certificates etc to students without indicating the mode of delivery of the programme. The Commission, in its meeting held on September 2 has decided that all Universities should reflect the mode of delivery of programme on all the documents issued to students in order to erase ambiguities between conventional mode degrees with that of ODL mode degrees.

ICC terms Kumble's role in getting DRS nod for India-England series as instrumental

Kumble, in his capacity as chairman of ICC's Cricket Committee, had gone to MIT where the engineers worked on the upgraded technology of DRS, which largely helped him convince BCCI to come on board for the England series.

BCCI has opposed DRS in principle as senior cricketers, including limited overs skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni, found ball tracking technology not 'foolproof'. Allardice said that the upgraded system has certainly convinced the BCCI to use it in Test series.

Novak Djokovic, Andy Murray advance; Stanislas Wawrinka knocked out

Paris, Nov 3
 Novak Djokovic began his bid to hold on to his number one ranking with an easy win over Gilles Muller in the Paris Masters second round while Andy Murray struggled through and Stan Wawrinka faltered on Wednesday. Serb Djokovic, who could be dethroned from the top spot by Wimbledon champion Murray this week, broke Luxembourg Muller once in each set to secure a drama-free 6-3 6-4 victory. The 29-year-old will hold on to his ranking if he reaches the final in Paris. "I try to focus on playing match after match and putting quality and value into my game. I know that if that's the case, then I can challenge anybody on the world in any surface, in any conditions," Djokovic told a news

conference. It went less smoothly for Murray, who overcame a blip to down Spaniard Fernando Verdasco 6-3 6-7(5) 7-5 before U.S. Open champion Wawrinka was knocked out by German qualifier Jan-Lennard Struff 3-6 6-7(6) 7-6(1). A long season eventually took its toll on the world number three from Switzerland, who started

brightly but ran out of gas after being forced into a second-set tiebreak. Struff broke in the seventh game of the third set but Wawrinka broke back to send the match into a decisive tiebreak, which the German easily won. Murray strolled through the opening set but lost his focus in the second, netting a backhand to allow Verdasco to level the match.

Centre to set up \$2 bn clean energy equity fund for additional renewable energy

New Delhi, Nov 3
 The Centre, along with state-run power entities National Thermal Power Corporation Limited (NTPC), Rural Electrification Corporation (REC) and Power Finance Corporation Limited (PFC), will soon launch a 2 billion dollar clean energy equity fund to support the government's ambitious target of adding 175 GW renewable energy generation capacity by 2022. A senior official said, New and Renewable Energy Ministry has already processed the proposal and sent it to the

Finance Ministry to initiate a 2 billion dollar clean energy equity fund to push renewable energy capacity addition as envisaged by the central government. Ahead of the Paris climate talks in November last year, Power, Coal, New and Renewable Energy Minister Piyush Goyal had said that the central government is planning a 1 billion dollar private

equity fund for the renewable energy sector. "The government is also seeking to collect 4 billion dollar per year in the next 3-4 years for a clean energy fund," he had said. The official further said, initial seed funding will be done by the central government to set up this fund from the National Investment and Infrastructure Fund.
