Food processing is top priority in Govt's Make in India initiative: PM

New Delhi, Nov 3

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said food processing is a top priority in government's Make In India initiative and doing business in India is easier now. Inaugurating World Food India 2017 in New Delhi today, Shri Modi said India has huge global potential as it is one of the fastest growing economies in the world and GST has eliminated multiplicity of taxes. He said India has jumped 30 ranks this year in the World Bank Doing Business rankings. He pointed out that India was ranked number one in the world in 2016 in Greenfield investment. He said India is also rapidly progressing on the Global Innovation Index, Global Logistics Index and Global Competitiveness Index. The Prime Minister said there are opportunities in



post-harvest management, like primary processing and storage, cold chain and refrigerated transportation. He said there is also immense potential for food processing and value addition in areas such as organic and fortified foods. Shri Modi pointed out that private sector participation has been increasing in many segments of the value

chain. He said more investment is required in contract farming, raw material sourcing and creating agri linkages. He said it is a clear opportunity for global chains. The Prime Minister said food processing is a way of life in India and it has been practiced for ages. He said simple, home-based techniques, such as fermentation, have resulted in the creation of pickles, papads, chutneys and

murabbas. On the occasion, Shri Modi launched the 'Nivesh Bandhu' portal which will give details about investment opportunities in the country's food processing sector. He also released a commemorative postage stamp on Indian food.

technical education like engineering through distance learning programme. It affirmed findings of Punjab & Haryana High Court on the issue and set aside Odisha High Court verdict which allowed technical education

by correspondence. Two years ago, the Punjab and Haryana High Court ruled that a degree in 'computer science' obtained through distance mode could not be considered on par with one attained by attending regular classes.

India looks to wrap up series, New Zealand aims to fightback

Rajkot, Nov 3
India is poised for their third T20 International series triumph in five years but would be wary of a strong fightback from the usually plucky New Zealand when the two sides clash in the second game of the three-match series in Rajkot on Saturday. The comprehensive 53-run victory in the series opener at Delhi has put India firmly in the saddle for sweeping to a winning 2-0 lead at the Saurashtra Cricket Association Stadium in Kandhari. The resounding victory, riding on the exhilarating batting exploits of their top-order and, in particular, openers Shikhar Dhawan and Rohit Sharma, was the country's first-ever over the Kiwis in the shortest form of the game. The 2007 World T20 champions have produced impressive death bowling with Bhuvneshwar Kumar and Jasprit Bumrah leading the pace department, while the spinners also pitched in with some excellent bowling in the middle overs. Kohli has led the team from the front and is himself fast approaching the



2000-run landmark in T20Is. If the top batsmen fall cheaply, there are others spearheaded by former captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni to come to the home team's rescue. pistol final, Anuraj Singh won the bronze. Earlier, Indian pistol shooters had also pulled off a clean sweep in the 10m air pistol

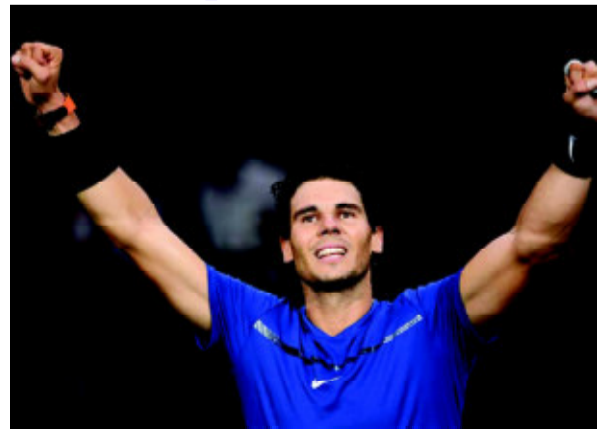
IAAF to introduce world rankings in 2018

London, Nov 3
International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) is to introduce a world rankings system in 2018 as part of a widespread effort to bring some sense and shape to its currently nebulous calendar, and continue to move away from the sport's scandal-hit past. The introduction of the rankings in partnership with All Athletics, announced on Friday, is part of a sweeping reform package that was voted in by the IAAF last December to change the way the sport's governing

body operates. The rankings will be a point-based system in which athletes collect points across different levels of meet throughout the season to determine qualification for premier competitions such as the Olympics and World Championships. It is also hoped that the introduction of the rankings will bring some focus to the Diamond League, where currently leading athletes often do not compete against each other, leaving fans feeling short-changed and often confused. International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) President Seb Coe has made no secret of his frustration with many aspects of the Diamond League's current format and is desperate to reform it. When it comes to major championships, athletes are currently selected by their national associations, if they achieve a qualification time or mark. "The IAAF World Rankings will drive and shape the global competition system including entry into the World Championships and Olympic Games," Coe said in a statement.

Nadal battles past Cuevas to reach Paris quarters

Paris, Nov 3
World number one Rafael Nadal overcame a second-set blip to reach the Paris Masters quarter-finals with a 6-3, 6-7 (5/7), 6-3 victory over Uruguayan Pablo Cuevas. The Spaniard, 31, had sealed the year-end number one spot for a fourth time on Wednesday, but he was made to work hard by an enterprising Cuevas. Nadal is looking for his maiden title on the Bercy hard courts, which would take him clear of Novak Djokovic with a record 31st Masters triumph. The 16-time Grand Slam champion will take on world number 77 Filip Krajinovic in the quarters, after the Serb beat Nicolas Mahut 6-2, 3-6, 6-1.



"You don't expect to win easy in big tournaments like these ones," said Nadal, who had his right knee strapped after the second set. "It's normal that at the end of the season after all the things that happened... All the matches I played with high intensity, it's normal that there are body issues a little bit. "So it's nothing strange. Something that's completely normal and accepted." Nadal started far stronger than he did in Wednesday's win over Hyeon Chung, breaking early on thanks to a couple of trademark forehands.

Women's Hockey Asia Cup India humble defending champs Japan 4-2, set up final date with China

New Delhi, Nov 3
Indian women's hockey eves are one match away from emulating their male counterparts in the Asia Cup. On Friday, the Rani Rampal-led outfit defeated defending champions and hosts Japan 4-2 in the second semi-final of the 2017 Women's Asia Cup in Kakamigahara, in the Gifu prefecture. Quick goals in the first quarter from Gurjit Kaur (7', 9') and Navjot Kaur (9') helped India take a three-goal lead, but Shisho Tsuji (17') and Yui Ishibashi (28') scored to reduce the gap and force a frenetic second half. India, however, killed off the contest with young forward Lalremsiami scoring the fourth goal in the 38th minute. India will take on China on Sunday's (November 5) final. Both the finalists are from Pool A, and in their previous meeting (on October 31), India beat China 4-1. In the first semi-final, China beat South Korea 3-2. China are two-time winners, having lifted the trophy in 1989 and 2009. In the final of 2009 edition, China beat India 5-3. This will be India's fourth Asia Cup final. They have won the title in 2004 and finished runners-up in 1999 and 2009.



India will enter the final as the favourites as they have defeated China in their pool meeting. Besides, India registered comfortable wins over Singapore 10-0 and Malaysia 2-0 in pool engagements, then defeated Kazakhstan 7-1 in the quarter-final yesterday.
