PM holds meeting on Pathankot, Afghanistan attacks

New Delhi, Jan 4
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today presided over a high-level meeting in New Delhi to discuss the ongoing operation at Pathankot air base to flush out holed up terrorists and the attack on Indian Consulate in Afghanistan.
Top security officials, including National Security Advisor Shri Ajit Doval have briefed Shri Modi on both the matters. Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley and Defence Minister Shri Manohar Parrikar who are members of the Cabinet Committee on Security, were also present in the meeting.
The Prime Minister had chaired a similar meeting last night of top officials, including Shri Doval and



Foreign Secretary Shri S Jaishankar soon after returning from his two-day visit to Karnataka. The operation against militants holed up at the air base entered the third day today after explosions and firing continued intermittently overnight.

Implementation of e-procurement software Vendors/bidders and Government order suppliers in A&N Islands advised

Port Blair, Jan 4
The Public Procurement Cell, Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India has issued instruction for implementation of e-procurement software in all Government Departments. The Ministry has informed that for procurement of all cases where the total cost exceeds Rs.10 lakh may be carried out through e-procurement solution. The limit has been revised to Rs.2 lakh and above on 21.01.2015.

Taking into consideration the poor internet connectivity in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, it was decided that the e-procurement solution should be hoisted in A&N State Data Center and the departments will access the same over intranet through leased line while the vendors would have the option to access the application either over internet or through Common

Service Center which is connected to SDC through leased line.

Accordingly M/s. KEONICS a PSU under Karnataka State Government was identified as the solution provider for implementing the e-procurement solution. Now M/s KOENICS has deployed the application in A&N State Data Center. It has been proposed to

Minimum wages across six schedules of employment in A & N Islands revised

Port Blair, Jan 4

The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands has revised the minimum wages across six schedules of employment including govt. offices/ departments/industrial establishments based on Variable Dearness Allowance pattern. The minimum rates of wages have now been increased by Rs.8/- per day across all the schedule of employment

including govt. offices/ industrial establishments. The revision of minimum wages shall be effective from Jan 1, 2016.

The current minimum rate of wages now stand at South Andaman/N&M Andaman District (un-skilled) is Rs.282 and in Nicobar District (un-skilled) is Rs.293/-.

The detailed rates for all schedules of employment including govt. offices/

industrial establishments are available on the website of A&N Administration www.and.nic.in as well as at labour.and.nic.in.

The endeavour of Labour Department is to ensure that minimum wages are paid to the workers and this is evident from the fact that 99% of the cases of non-payment or less payment are settled in favour of workers.

National Programme for Control of Blindness (NPCB) is introducing this Diabetic Retinopathy awareness and screening camp in the Islands to reduce blindness caused due to Diabetic Retinopathy, said the Director Health Services, Dr. (Smt) Shipra Paul while interacting with the media persons in the conference hall of the Directorate of Health Services here today. The DHS further said that



the Diabetic Retinopathy has now become a common disease and this awareness programme has been devised by the NPCB to target people suffering from diabetes.

Dr. (Smt) Anita Shah, Joint Secretary (NPCB)/ DD (Ophth), through a power point presentation gave an insight about Diabetic Retinopathy and said that it

is one of the leading causes of irreversible blindness. She further stated that the diabetic patients should come for eye check up so that this disease can be checked in its early stage. Lodha panel: Legalise betting, no Minister can hold BCCI post

New Delhi, Jan 04
With a strong recommendation to lawmakers to legalise betting in cricket for all except cricket players, officials and administrators, the Supreme Court appointed Justice R.M. Lodha Committee report said on Monday that government servants and ministers should be banned from holding posts in the BCCI.

The committee commended the "good work" done by the BCCI, including pension scheme for national players. Justice Lodha along with Justices Ashok Bhari and R.V. Raveendran said their objective handed down by the apex court was not to limit the autonomy of the BCCI.

"Our call was not restrict or limit the BCCI and its good work. But our year-long effort was to remove the ailing parts, revitalise the body so that it could run a marathon for the betterment of the game. Our job was to restore the pristine glory of the game of which 1.28 billion of the country is passionate for," Justice Lodha said at a press conference in Delhi.

Taking a realistic stand on betting, the very cause for the apex court setting up the panel, Justice Lodha said betting is a 400 billion dollars phenomenon practised across the globe and lawmakers in India should enact laws to legalise it.

But the committee said players, team and match officials and cricket administrators should not be allowed to indulge in betting.

No. 1-ranked Williams practiced on Monday ahead of her scheduled season-opener for the U.S. team against Elina Svitolina of Ukraine in the international mixed team competition at Perth Arena, but withdrew from the match citing knee inflammation. Vicky Duval filled in for Williams in the Group A match, losing 6-4, 6-1 to Svitolina in the first singles match and giving Ukraine a 1-0 lead in the best-of-three match round-robin encounter.

Somdev Devvarman beats James Ward, earns Chennai Open main draw

Somdev Devvarman joined compatriot Ramkumar Ramanathan in the singles main draw of the ATP Chennai Open with a come-from-behind victory over Briton James Ward in the final qualifying round, here on Sunday. Somdev, who struggled to go deep in the main draws on the ATP tour in 2015, got the better of Ward 2-6 7-5 6-4 in a two hours and three-minute battle. Ranked 177th, Somdev clawed his way back in the match after losing the first set, gathering strength and changing the tactics. They were neck-and-neck in the second set before Somdev capitalised on a break of serve

and never looked back. He raced to a 4-1 lead in the deciding third set and closed the match in his favour comfortably. N Sriiram Balaji made a stupendous effort and fight in his final qualifying round but that was not enough as he lost 6-7 (2) 6-7(0) to Ante Pavic. Later in the day, Saketh Myneni was also ousted from the qualifying event, losing his second round match 4-6 2-6 to fifth seed Thomas Fabbiano. Despite now having two platers in singles main draw, India's best hopes are in doubles with experienced Leander Paes, Rohan Bopanna and Mahesh Bhupathi, who is returning to Tour after a break, in the mix.

Australia has named a 13-man squad for the upcoming one-day series against India, with pacemen Joel Paris and Scott Boland set for their international debuts. Seamer Kane Richardson, who has eight ODI appearances, has also been included with Josh Hazlewood, the sole member of Australia's fast-bowling group from their successful World Cup campaign last year. Fellow test quick James Pattinson has been left out as has the injured Peter Siddle. No specialist spinner has been included in the squad which covers the first three games of the five-match series, in Perth, Brisbane and Melbourne. Steve Smith is captain, while batsmen Aaron Finch, Shaun Marsh and George Bailey have been called up, but test player Usman Khawaja has been left out, as have Shane Watson, Joe Burns and current Big Bash Twenty20 star Chris Lynn. Nai Manzil: India signs financing deal with World Bank for \$50mn for minority education

New Delhi, Jan 4
India today signed financing agreement of 50 million dollar with World Bank for Nai Manzil Education and Skills Training for Minorities. Finance Ministry in a release said, the agreement was signed between Joint Secretary, Department of Economic Affairs Shri Raj Kumar and World Bank's Operations Adviser in India Mr. Michael Haney. Of the total project cost of 100 million Dollar, 50 million will be available as IDA credit, and the balance will be funded from the Union

Budget. The project takes an integrated and holistic approach to address the high dropout and unemployment rate among minority youth. Minority BPL (below poverty line) youth in the age group of 17-35 years will be the main beneficiaries of the project. The funds will be disbursed on achievement of specific results such as number of student enrolled, number of students successfully completing education and skill components.

Diabetic Retinopathy...

Diabetic retinopathy, the most common diabetic eye disease, occurs when blood vessels in the retina change. Diabetic retinopathy usually affects both eyes. People who have diabetic retinopathy often don't notice changes in their vision in the disease's early stages. But as it progresses, diabetic retinopathy usually causes vision loss that in many cases cannot be reversed. Blurred vision, sudden loss of vision in one eye, seeing rings around lights and dark spots or flashing lights are the symptoms of Diabetic Retinopathy. However, if a person experience one or more of these symptoms, should contact ophthalmologist for a complete exam. To reduce risk of developing retinopathy, it is important to control ones blood sugar level, blood pressure and cholesterol level. Medical treatment for diabetics can help to stop or delay progression of the Diabetic Retinopathy, she added.
