Govt working on mission mode to reform education system: PM

New Delhi, Mar 4
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has said that Government is working on mission mode to reform education system in the country. He was addressing a youth convention at Tumakuru in Karnataka, via video conference today on 'Youth Power: A vision of New India.



The convention was organised to mark the Silver Jubilee Celebration of Ramakrishna Vivekananda Ashram at Tumakuru. He noted that India with largest young population needs world class infrastructure in the education sector. In order

to drive the country in this direction, RISE programme was launched by the Central Government with a funding of one lakh crore rupees to reform education system in the next four years. The Government, he stressed, has focussed on creating 20 world class

educational institutions in the country. Atal Innovation Mission, he said, is another programme that converts ideas of young minds into innovations. Atal Tinkering labs that will be 2400 in number across the country in various schools

will promote skill development and self-employment at a very young age among children. Government is also working towards creating conducive market for products introduced by young innovative minds. Mudra yojana, he added has created self employment to over three crore youths. Over one crore youths have benefitted from this programme in Karnataka alone. Assistance for fishermen under 'Blue Revolution' scheme

Subsidy for purchase of deep sea fishing vessel; last date April 30

Port Blair, March 4

The Govt. of India, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare has introduced a new programme 'Assistance for Deep Sea Fishing for Traditional Fishermen' under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme 'Blue Revolution'. The programme envisages subsidy @ 40% of the unit cost with a ceiling of Rs.32.00 lakh for general category beneficiary and @ 60% with a ceiling of Rs.48.00 lakh for Schedule Tribe / Women and their Cooperative Societies towards purchase / construction of new deep sea fishing vessel.

For availing the scheme, applicant should be a traditional / artisanal

fishermen and their Societies/ Associations / SHGs/FPPOs; the beneficiary/Society should possess valid Ownership Certificate, Registration Certificate under the Real Craft, Fishing License and Biometric/ Fishers ID Card.

The financial assistance shall be limited to only one vessel per individual beneficiary and a maximum of two vessels for society / association of Traditional Fishers and the Deep Sea Fishing Vessel

All new Govt. buildings to have rain water harvesting facilities

APWD to implement rain water harvesting schemes in major buildings in town

Port Blair, March 4

Water is one of the most precious resource of earth and vital for well being. Due to over utilization of ground water resources, Earth's natural ground water resources are fast depleting leading to water crisis in major cities such as recent crisis in South Africa. Though these Islands territory receives lot of rains to the extent of more than 3000 mm annually, but people here experience water crisis during peak summer. Due to rolling (sloppy) terrain and non-porous soil

condition, most of the rain water drain to sea and does not seep beneath thus ground water availability is very limited only at isolated locations such as at Calicut, Beodnabad, Neil & Havelock at South Andaman, and at Carnicobar, Katchal etc in Southern group of Islands. Consequently, most of the existing water supply depend on impounding reservoirs/dams constructed across major nullahs at favourable location for such structures and on check dam/weirs across perennial & semi-

perennial small streams. Further, due to its location near to equatorial region, a huge quantity of water is also lost due to high rate of evaporation in these Island territory. The only way to prevent water crisis from emerging is through conservation and use of rain water harvesting techniques, to reduce the burden and dependency on the existing system. In this connection, the Lt. Governor has directed to focus on Rain Water Harvesting in all buildings in A&N Islands.



Accordingly, all new Govt. buildings will be constructed with rain water harvesting facilities hence forth. Following the directions of the Lt. Governor, APWD has

proposed a plan to conserve Rain Water Harvesting Schemes in 17 existing major buildings in Port Blair including Raj Niwas in 2018.

Corporates are ready to invest in sports but NSFs need to assure them on transparency: Sports Minister

New Delhi, Mar 4

Sports Minister Col Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore says the corporate sector is very much willing to support development of sports and athletes in India but it needs to be given the assurance that the money is going in right hands. Col Rathore, the 2004 Olympics silver medallist in shooting, said the need of the hour is that the National Sports Federations (NSFs) bring about transparency in their functioning. "Corporate sector is eager to support sports but they should be given the assurance that their money is going in right hands. Transparency and accountability is the must," Col Rathore said.

"Raising funds should not be exclusive to us. We are always



there to help whenever needed but we want them to become financially independent. Corporates are ready to invest but they (NSFs) should ensure transparency and accountability," he added. When asked if it means that ministry is planning to cut off or reduce the grants given to NSFs, he replied in negative. "I never said that. They can

raise funds despite getting government grants. Both are not exclusive to each other. It's high time that they should take initiatives to raise money on their own. Sports like wrestling, hockey and badminton are generating money through various leagues but we are funding them," said the celebrated shooter.

Shahzar Rizvi shoots world-record gold in maiden World Cup

Mexico, Mar 4

Unheralded Indian shooter Shahzar Rizvi clinched the gold medal with a world record score in a memorable maiden ISSF World Cup appearance, while Jitu Rai and Mehuli Ghosh bagged a bronze each in Guadalajara, Mexico. The Meerut-based Rizvi shot a world record 242.3 in the 10m air pistol event's final to beat reigning Olympic champion Christian Reitz of Germany (239.7) for the top prize.

Pistol ace Rai won the bronze in the event with a score of 219, as three Indians made it to the finals of the season's first World Cup. Om Prakash Mitharval, the other Indian shooter in the event, finished at a creditable fourth position with a score of 198.4 points.

Mehuli, also a senior World Cup debutant, added to India's



medal tally as she shot a world junior record 228.4 to win bronze in the women's 10m air rifle event after three Indian shooters progressed to the final.

Anjum Moudgil finished at fourth position with 208.6 points, while Apurvi Chandela was seventh in the standings with 144.1 points.

India had a fruitful opening day in the competition as they won three medals - a gold and two bronze.

Shahzar finished second in the qualifying, behind Reitz, shooting 579 to the German's 588 after 60-shots.

Rai was one behind Shahzar with 578, while Om Prakash shot 576 to qualify in fourth place. While Jitu and Om Prakash maintained their positions at the end of the finals, Shahzar turned the tables on Reitz in style, staying ahead of the class German throughout the length of the 24-shot final.

New-look India target T20 success in Sri Lanka tri-series

Colombo, Mar 4

India's rising talent will be put to the test in this week's tri-nation Twenty20 series in Sri Lanka in the absence of some established stars. Rohit Sharma-led India enter the tournament against Sri Lanka and Bangladesh as favourites, but must cope without big-hitters Virat Kohli and Mahendra Singh Dhoni. Selectors opted to rest the star pair for the short-format series and instead experiment with fresh faces. Wicketkeeper-batsman Rishabh Pant, who has just two T20 international appearances, and rookie pacer Mohammed Siraj, 23, are being given the opportunity to gain international experience. Pant, 20, recently smashed the second-fastest T20 century off 32 balls for



Delhi against Himachal Pradesh - just two balls short of Chris Gayle's all-time quickest 100 off 30 balls in the 2013 Indian Premier League (IPL). And 26-year-old left-arm seamer Jaydev Unadkat, who has already taken seven wickets in six T20 international appearances, made headlines when he was bought for \$1.8 million by the Rajasthan Royals in January - the highest price

paid for an Indian player. India enjoyed one-day international and T20 series wins over South Africa earlier this month, but face a resurgent Sri Lanka in their opener on Tuesday. Sri Lanka will face a home crowd buoyed by their recent tour of Bangladesh where they thrashed the hosts in all three formats.

Dinesh Karthik to lead KKR in IPL 2018

New Delhi, Mar 4

India's wicket-keeper-batsman Dinesh Karthik has been appointed as the new captain of Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) for the 11th edition of the Indian Premier League (IPL). Meanwhile, Saurashtra player Robin Uthappa has been named as the vice-captain of the side.

The 32-year-old Karthik, who has played 152 games since the inception of the IPL, was bought for Rs 7.4 crore during the IPL mega-auction. Karthik will be taking over the captaincy from KKR's long-serving captain Gautam Gambhir, who had led the franchise to their two IPL titles in 2012 and 2014.

Misfiring India draw 1-1 against England in Azlan Shah Cup

New Delhi, Mar 4

India wasted chances galore to settle for a 1-1 draw against England in their second match at the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup hockey tournament on Sunday. It was India's first point in the tournament after having lost 2-3 to Olympic champions Argentina in their tournament opener yesterday at the Sultan Azlan Shah Stadium. Young Shilanand Larka (14th minute) scored his first international goal in the dying minutes of the first quarter to give India the lead, which the men in blue maintained till the 53rd minute, when Mark Gleghorne converted a penalty stroke. By virtue of this draw, last year's bronze medallist India are now placed fourth in the table in the six-team tournament. The Indians, who have fielded a young and inexperienced

team in the tournament under Sardar Singh's leadership, only had themselves to blame as they wasted as many as nine penalty corners besides a few great scoring chances from the field. India were slow to get off the blocks as England put pressure on the rival citadel with continuous raids upfront. But India took the lead against the run of play a minute before the first quarter when Shilanand pounced on a rebound after Talwinder Singh's initial shot was saved by England goalkeeper Harry Gibson. The Indians, however, were on top in the second quarter and earned as many as eight penalty corners with close succession, but the drag-flick battery of Varun Kumar and Amit Rohidas failed to breach the England defense led by goalkeeper George Pinner, who replaced Gibson.

Cristiano Ronaldo becomes fastest to 300 La Liga goals as Real Madrid win

Madrid, Mar 4

Cristiano Ronaldo became only the second player ever to score 300 goals in La Liga as his double fired Real Madrid to a 3-1 victory over 10-man Getafe on Saturday. Gareth Bale opened the scoring at the Santiago Bernabeu before Ronaldo followed Lionel Messi in hitting his 300th and 301st goals after just 286 matches in the Spanish top flight. Messi needed 334 to reach the same mark.

Getafe's Loic Remy was sent off in the 47th minute for a second yellow card but the visitors still threatened a



comeback at 2-0, when Francisco Portillo converted a penalty, awarded for a foul by Nacho on Jorge Molina. Ronaldo had the last word, however, and his contribution

is timely given Real now turn their attention to what could be a season-defining Champions League second leg with PSG on Tuesday, in which they lead 3-1.

In Phase-I, six Govt. buildings viz Deputy Commissioner (SA), Office Building, Superintendent of Police (SA), Office Building, Secretariat Building Complex, Govt. Senior Secondary School, Mohanpura, Chief Engineer's Office Complex, APWD and G.B.Pant Hospital Complex have been identified in Port Blair where rain water harvesting schemes will be completed by next six months. The water collected through rain water harvesting will be pumped and utilized for gardening, toilets and washrooms. The storage facility will cater for 2-5 weeks depending on space available and population catered for. This will reduce the requirement of water from Dhanikhari Dam especially during dry season which can then be utilized for giving more water to general public and areas which are facing short fall, an APWD communiqué said.

should be considered as an alternative for replacement of existing Bottom Trawler and the UT shall ensure disposal of the old Fishing boat (against which new one is replaced).

Further, the vessel should have onboard machineries / fishing equipments including Refrigerated Sea water Storage facilities for under taking Deep Sea Tuna Long Lining and Gill Netting. Onboard vessels communication systems, AIS and other navigational equipments for Safety Navigation are mandatory onboard the vessel.

For details, won can contact the Directorate of Fisheries, Port Blair and Zonal Fisheries Offices & Fisheries Sub - Stations located at various places in the Islands. Interested beneficiaries have been requested to submit their application in plain paper alongwith self contained DPR (two sets) to the Directorate of Fisheries or Zonal Fisheries Office, South Andaman, North & Middle Andaman and Nicobar for extending the subsidy under the programme. The applications should reach the Directorate of Fisheries before 30th April, 2018, a communication said.
