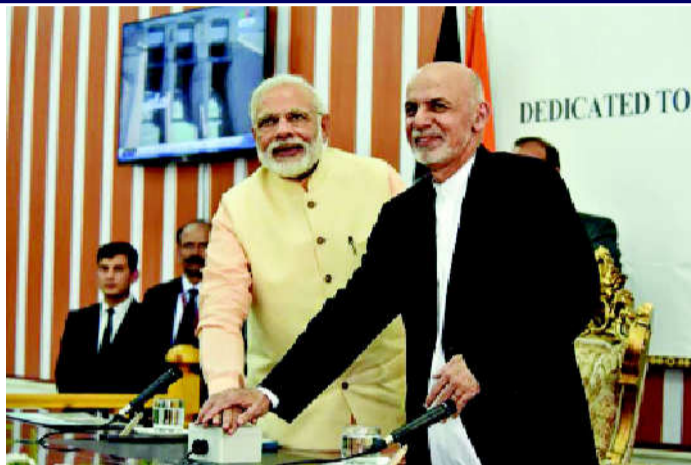

PM inaugurates Afghan-India Friendship Dam

WAPCOS executes landmark infrastructure project

Herat, June 4 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi jointly inaugurated the Afghan-India Friendship Dam (Salma Dam) with President of Afghanistan Dr. Ashraf Ghani at Chist-e-Sharif in Herat province in Western Afghanistan today. Afghan-India Friendship Dam is a Multipurpose project planned for generating 42 MW of power, irrigating 75000 hectares of land, water supply and other benefits to the people of Afghanistan. Salma Dam is a landmark infrastructure project undertaken by Government of India on river Hari Rud, in Herat province of Afghanistan. The project was executed and implemented by WAPCOS Ltd., a Government of India Undertaking under Ministry of Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejuvenation. The project is located 165 km east of Herat town and



connected with earthen road. Due to security reasons Indian engineers and technicians involved with the project have been reaching the site once in a month by helicopter service provided by Government of Afghanistan. All equipment and material were transported from India to

Bandar-e-Abbas port of Iran via sea and then along 1200 km by road from there to

Islam Kila border post at Iran-Afghanistan border and then further 300 km by

road from the border post to the site. Cement, steel reinforcement, explosives etc. were imported to Afghanistan from neighboring countries. The gross capacity of the Dam is 633 Million M3. The height of the Dam is 104.3 Mt, length 540 Mt and width at the bottom is 450 Mt. Rs.1775 crore project was funded by Government of India and took more than ten years to complete. The successful completion of the project represents culmination of years of hard work by 1,500 Indian and Afghan engineers and other professionals in very difficult conditions.

Govt to launch Shala Asmita Yojana to track educational journey of students

New Delhi, June 4 Human Resources Development Minister Smti Smriti Irani has said government will launch Shala Asmita Yojana this month. Briefing media in New Delhi yesterday on her Ministry's achievements of last two years, she said the Yojana aims at tracking the educational journey of close to 25 crore school

students from Class I to Class XII across 15 lakh schools in the country. Smti Irani said it would probably be the world's largest student tracking system. She said this will lead to better facilities for students. The Minister said 'Padhe Bharat Badhe Bharat' is leading to improvements in basic understanding of students of class one and

two. She said from this year scheme will extend to class three. Smti Irani said for the first time, all NCERT books have been made available free of cost on e-portal. On National Education Policy She said government has received suggestion from 1.1 lakh villages, 5 lakh blogspot, 20 states and others in framing policy.

Port Blair, June 4 Indian Coast Guard is the nodal agency for co-ordinating and conducting maritime search & rescue (SAR) missions in India. Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre (MRCC) Port Blair has been proactively coordinating and providing search & rescue coverage to all vessels including fishing boats and dinghies operating in the A&N Sea. To add to the welfare and

safety of fishing community of the Islands, Coast Guard has set up a dedicated toll Free Help Line No.1554 for intimation during any distress/assistance required at sea. Calls can be made even from mobile phones at sea to this number. This number is monitored 24x7 at MRCC Port Blair.

Since inception in the year 2008, MRCC Port Blair has coordinated rescue of 2772 precious



lives at sea. This year till date 21 lives has been saved by Coast Guard in

the waters adjoining A&N Islands including 2 medical evacuations. After the

World's Space Agencies unite to face the Climate Challenge

New Delhi, June 4 For the first time, under the impetus of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and the French Space Agency (CNES), space agencies of more than 60 countries agreed to engage their satellites, to coordinate their methods and their data to monitor human-induced greenhouse gas emissions. The COP21 climate conference held in Paris last

December acted as a wake-up call in this context. Without satellites, the reality of global warming would not have been recognised and the subsequent historic agreement at the United Nations headquarters in New York on April 22, 2016 would not have been signed. Out of the 50 essential climate variables being monitored today, 26 - including rising sea level,

sea ice extent and greenhouse gas concentrations in all layers of the atmosphere - can be measured only from space. The key to effectively implementing the Paris Agreement lies in the ability to verify that nations are fulfilling their commitments to curb greenhouse gas emissions. Only satellites can do that. TGCE to prepare panel of guest lecturers; applications invited

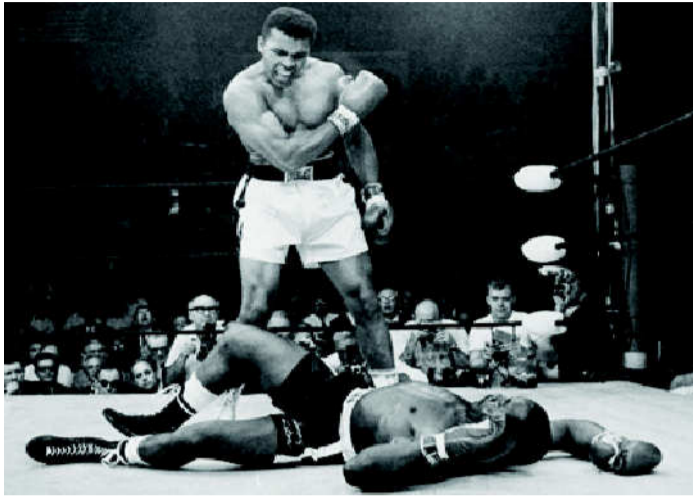

'The greatest of all time' Muhammad Ali no more



Washington, Jun 4
The former world heavyweight boxing champion, one of the world's best-known sportsmen, died at a hospital in the US city of Phoenix, Arizona, after being admitted on Thursday. He was suffering from a respiratory illness, a condition that was complicated by Parkinson's disease. Born Cassius Marcellus Clay, Ali shot to fame by winning light-heavyweight gold at the 1960 Rome Olympics. Nicknamed "The Greatest", the American beat Sonny Liston in 1964 to win his first world title and became the first boxer to capture a world heavyweight title on three separate occasions. He eventually

retired in 1981, having won 56 of his 61 fights. Crowned "Sportsman of the Century" by Sports Illustrated and "Sports Personality of the Century" by the BBC, Ali was noted for his pre- and post-fight talk and bold fight predictions just as much as his boxing skills inside the ring. But he was also a civil rights campaigner and poet who transcended the bounds of sport, race and nationality. Ali turned professional immediately after the Rome Olympics and rose through the heavyweight ranks, delighting crowds with his showboating, shuffling feet and lightning reflexes. British champion Henry Cooper came close to stopping

Clay, as he was still known, when they met in a non-title bout in London in 1963. Cooper floored the American with a left hook, but Clay picked himself up off the canvas and won the fight in the next round when a severe cut around Cooper's left eye forced the Englishman to retire. In February the following year, Clay stunned the boxing world by winning his first world heavyweight title at the age of 22. He predicted he would beat Liston, who had never lost, but few believed he could do it. Yet, after six stunning rounds, Liston quit on his stool, unable to cope with his brash, young opponent.

ISRO and CNES on April 3, 2016, the world's space agencies decided to establish "an independent, international system" to centralise data from their Earth-observing satellites through the 'New Delhi Declaration' that officially came into effect on May 16, 2016. The goal now will be to inter-calibrate these satellite data so that they can be combined and compared over time. In other words, it is to make the transition to closely coordinated and easily accessible 'big space data'. "It is overwhelming to see the unilateral support of all space agencies to use space inputs for monitoring climate change," said ISRO Chairman Shri A.S. Kiran Kumar. "Earth observation satellites provide a vital means of obtaining measurements of the climate system from a global perspective.
