Voting for Vice Presidential election to take place today



New Delhi, Aug 4
Voting for Vice Presidential election will take place tomorrow (Aug 5). It will be held at the Parliament House complex between 10 AM and 5 PM. Members of Parliament will use special pens for marking their choice in the election. NDA candidate

Shri M Venkaiah Naidu is pitted against opposition parties nominee Shri Gopal Krishna Gandhi. The counting of votes will begin after polling and the results will be declared by 7 PM. The one who bags 50 per cent plus one vote of the total valid votes cast will win the poll.

The electoral college for Vice President consists of elected and nominated members of Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha. No whip can be issued by political parties as the election is through a secret ballot.

The term of the incumbent Shri Hamid Ansari is coming to an end on August 10.

Aadhaar made mandatory for registration of death from 1st October

New Delhi, Aug 4
Aadhaar number will be now required for the purpose of establishing the identity of the deceased for death registration from 1st October this year.

In a notification, Registrar General of India (RGI) said, the use of Aadhaar for the applicants of Death Certificate will result in ensuring accuracy of the details provided by the relatives and dependents. It will provide an effective method to prevent identity fraud and also help recording the identity of the deceased person. Besides, it will obviate the need for producing multiple documents to prove the identity of the



deceased person. The RGI has directed concerned departments of States and UTs to ensure compliance of the order and send a confirmation to this effect by 1st of September this year. The provisions will come into effect immediately for residents of all States except Jammu and Kashmir, Assam and Meghalaya for which a date will be notified

separately. An Applicant who is not aware of the Aadhaar number or EID of the deceased will be required to provide a certificate that the deceased person does not possess Aadhaar number and it should be duly informed and also prescribed that any false declaration given by the applicant in this regard will be treated as an offence.

India's foreign policy is now at its best: Minister

New Delhi, Aug 4
The government today said, India's foreign policy is at its best at this time and India has good relations with the US, Russia, Germany and France, Yemen, Saudi Arabia, Israel and Palestine. Replying to a short duration discussion on India's foreign policy and engagement with strategic partners in the Rajya Sabha, External Affairs Minister Smti Sushma Swaraj said, now world looks towards India with high regards. She said,

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has brought honour to the country at the global level and he has become a leader who shapes global agenda. Responding to members' concern on India-China stand off on Doklam, Smti Swaraj said, the issue can be resolved through dialogue and war is no solution. She said, India will continue to engage with Chinese side through diplomatic channels to find a mutually acceptable

Sri Lanka 50/2 against India at stumps on day 2

Colombo, Aug 4 India have set themselves up for another big win in the ongoing Three-Test series against Sri Lanka. After beating the hosts by 304 runs in the first match at Galle, the visitors were strongly placed in the second Test on Day Two today. Replaying to India's huge first innings score of 622 for nine declared, Sri Lanka were reeling at 50 for two at stumps, with Ravichandran Ashwin taking both the wickets. Kusal Mendis on 16 and skipper Dinesh Chandimal on 8 were at the crease. The batsmen out were Dimuth Karunaratne for 25 and Upul Tharanga for no score. The hosts face now a daunting task of saving the game and also the series with the pitch offering



plenty to the spinners. Earlier, resuming the day at their overnight 344 for three, India crossed the 600-run mark for the second game in a row. Overnight centurions Cheteshwar Pujara and Ajinkya Rahane could not add much to their individual scores. While Pujara was out for 133, Rahane returned to the pavilion for 132. But Ravichandran Ashwin's 54, Wriddhiman Saha's 67 and Ravindra Jadeja's unbeaten 70, helped India pile up a massive score. Ashwin, batting at number six, struck his 11th Test fifty on way to becoming the fourth Indian to complete a double of 200 wickets and 2000 runs. He also became the fourth quickest in Test history to get to the milestone in 51 Tests, after Ian Botham (England, 42 Tests), Kapil Dev (India, 50 Tests) and Imran Khan (Pakistan, 50 Tests).

Manju Kumari wins bronze medal at Jr World Wrestling C'ship

Tampere, Aug 4 India's Manju Kumari won the bronze medal with a 2-0 victory over Iлона Prokopeniuk of Ukraine in the Junior World Wrestling Championship in Tampere, Finland on Thursday. However, Divya Tomar (44kg), Nandini Salokhe (51kg) and Pooja Devi (67kg) failed to make it to the medal round. Manju, competing in 59kg, started her campaign off with a dominating 5-1 victory over Bulgaria's Aleksandrina Nikolaeva



Kashinova but was outclassed 0-10 by Japan's Yuzuru Kumano in her quarterfinal bout. However, with the Japanese girl advancing to the final, Manju got another life in the form of repechage and she did not waste the opportunity. In her repechage bout, Manju got the better of Tianna Grace Kennett of Canada 4-0 to storm into the bronze-medal play-offs.

Vijender looks to scale new heights, beat Zulpilkar

Mumbai, Aug 4 Indian boxing star Vijender Singh will look to clinch his second title and keep his unbeaten record intact when he takes on undefeated Chinese Zulpikaer Maimaitiali here tomorrow. The 31-year-old former Olympic bronze-medallist will be fighting his ninth professional fight tomorrow and on the line would be his WBO Asia Pacific super middleweight title. Maimaitiali's WBO Oriental super middleweight title would also be up for grabs in the double title fight.



"This is India versus China, I don't need anything and I am excited, I know the whole of India is with me," Vijender said at the weigh-in today.

Two more Indians enter semis of Asian Junior boxing

New Delhi, Aug 4 Two Indian boxers advanced to the semifinals to assure themselves of medals at the Asian Junior Championships in Puerto Princesa, Philippines today. Ankit Narwal (57kg) and Akshay Siwach (60kg) won their respective bouts to make the last-four stage.

While Ankit defeated Kazakhstan's Dimitry Barmine in split 3-2 verdict, Akshay got the better Chinese Taipei's Lin Yu. However, three others Indians fell by the wayside after losing their quarterfinal bouts. Selay Soy (46kg) went down to local favourite Dela Kenneth in a unanimous verdict. Aman Ghanghas (54kg) was beaten by Japan's Yura Kenshin 2-3, while Aakash Sai (66kg) lost to Kyrgyzstan's Dastan Onolbekov. Yesterday six Indian boxers had entered the semifinals and with today's two wins, the total number of medals assured for Indian stands at eight.

Yuki Bhambri enters Citi Open quarters in career-best show

New Delhi, Aug 4 Yuki Bhambri has extended his good run at the ATP Citi Open by entering the singles quarterfinals with a come-from-behind win over Argentina's Guido Pella in Washington DC, USA. Ranked 200, Bhambri eked out a 6-7(5), 6-3, 6-1 win over Pella, who is ranked exactly 100 places above the Indian in the ATP singles chart. It is for the first time that Bhambri has won three matches in the main draw of an ATP World Tour event. This will be only the second appearance for Bhambri in the singles quarterfinals of an ATP



World Tour event as he had reached the Chennai Open last-eight in 2014. However, he had won only two main draw matches at that time as it was an ATP 250 event with a draw of 32 singles players. The ATP 500 has 64 players in main draw and Bhambri has already assured himself of 90 points and a prize purse of \$44595. These points should help him get close to 150 or slightly better when the new rankings are issued on Monday.

Earth to warm 2 degrees Celsius by end of this century: Study

Washington, Aug 4 Our planet may see a temperature increase of 2 to 4.9 degrees Celsius by the end of this century, much higher than the target of 1.5 degrees set by the 2016 Paris Agreement. A study published in the journal Nature Climate Change says there is only a five per cent chance that the Earth will warm two degrees or less by the end

of this century. The study underlines that damages from heat extremes, drought, extreme weather and sea level rise will be much more severe if two degrees Celsius or higher temperature rise is allowed. Lead author of the study, Adrian Raftery, professor at University of Washington in the US said even the goal of two degrees is achievable only with major, sustained effort on all fronts over the next 80 years. The research focused on three quantities that underpin the scenarios for future emissions: total world population, gross domestic product per person and the amount of carbon emitted for each dollar of economic activity, known as carbon intensity.
