India opens doors of IITs for Nepal students

Kathmandu, Nov 4 India has announced that from next year, Nepalese students would be able to compete for seats in IITs. Announcing the new opportunity for the students of Nepal, President Shri Pranab Mukherjee said, they will be able to write entrance examinations of the prestigious Indian Institute of Technology, IIT in Kathmandu from next year to pursue graduate and post-graduate courses. Addressing a seminar jointly organised by India Foundation and Neeti Anusandhan Pratishthan Nepal in Kathmandu last night, the President said India and Nepal have enjoyed a long tradition of academic and student exchanges. He said that common cultural heritage is yet another dimension of India-Nepal bilateral relations. Shri Mukherjee called for enhancing air, rail and road



connectivity to facilitate tourism. He also emphasized that cooperation in water resources also has huge potential. Earlier, at a civic reception organised in Kathmandu, President Shri Pranab

Govt launches scheme to improve health facilities for pregnant women

New Delhi, Nov 4 Union Health Minister Shri J P Nadda today launched 'Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan' in New Delhi to improve health care facilities for pregnant women. Under the scheme, pregnant ladies will be given free health check-up and required treatment free of cost on 9th of every month. The scheme will be applicable for pregnant women in all Government hospitals across the

country. Speaking on the occasion, Shri Nadda urged doctors of private hospitals to visit government hospitals for routine check up of prospective mothers. He requested the media to publicize the initiative so that large number of women can get the benefits. On the occasion, the Health Minister launched a web portal and also a mobile app on the safe motherhood.

Govt committed to welfare of ex-servicemen

New Delhi, Nov 4 Defence Minister Shri Manohar Parrikar has said that the government is committed to the welfare of ex-servicemen and more than Rs 5,507 crore has been disbursed under the One Rank One Pension, OROP scheme. Giving the details of the OROP implementation so far, Shri Parrikar said there were 20 lakh 63 thousand 763 beneficiaries before July 2014. He said, 19 lakh 12 thousand 520 pensioners have been paid the first

instalment and 1 lakh 50 thousand 313 cases are pending verification and authentication of beneficiaries. Tweeting the details, Shri Parrikar said, more than Rs 3,886 crore had been disbursed as the first instalment. He said 11 lakh 33 thousand 100 people have received the second instalment of more than Rs 1,604 crore has been disbursed.

Railways set target of 100% de-carbonisation, 90% electrification in next 5 yrs

New Delhi, Nov 4 The Indian Railways has set a target to achieve 100 per cent de-carbonisation, with 90 per cent electrification in next five years. Addressing an International Conference on De-carbonization of Indian Railway-Mission Electrification, Railway Minister Shri Suresh Prabhu said, with the investment of Rs 25,000 crore,

electrification of nearly 25,000 kilometers will generate more employment for youth. He said, it will also promote local manufacturer and vendor to support the Make in India endeavor of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. Shri Prabhu said, electrification will reduce the fuel bill by Rs 10,000 crores annually as against the business as

usual approach. On the occasion, Shri Prabhu handed over the Letter of Intent to Railway PSUs RITES, IRCON and also Power Ministry PSU PGCIL to achieve the goal set in Mission Electrification. The Railway Minister also launched a mobile App RAILSaver for reduction in energy use by 15 to 20 per cent.

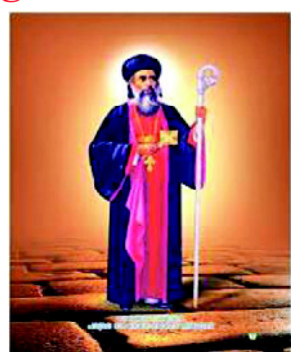
registered on the electoral roll as Overseas Indian electors despite there being 11.4 million NRIs across the world. An online competition is also being held as part of the initiative.

NGT asks for controlling pollution in national capital

New Delhi, Nov 4 The National Green Tribunal (NGT) today asked the Central Pollution Control Board and the Delhi Pollution Control Committee to take steps to control and curb the pollution in the national capital. The Tribunal also

summoned the Environment Secretaries of Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and Rajasthan over rise in pollution in the region and asked them to submit a report on burning of agricultural residues and pollution control efforts by next Tuesday.

UK announces new visa policy

London, Nov 4 UK has announced changes to its visa policy for non-EU nationals, which will affect a large number of Indians especially IT professionals. Under the new visa rules announced last evening by the Home Office, anyone applying after November 24 under the Tier 2 intra-company transfer (ICT) category would be required

to meet a higher salary threshold requirement of 30,000 pounds from the earlier 20,800 pounds. The ICT route is largely used by Indian IT companies in Britain and the UK's Migration Advisory Committee (MAC) had found earlier this year that Indian IT workers accounted for nearly 90 per cent of visas issued under this route.

The Paris Agreement to combat climate change agreed last year officially entered into force today, putting pressure on nearly 200 countries to start executing plans to slash their greenhouse gas emissions.

Additionally, the agreement aims to strengthen the ability of countries to deal with the

Rajkot to witness DRS system for first time in India – England Test series

Rajkot, Nov 4
The umpire Decision Review System (DRS), which BCCI was opposing for long, would be implemented here for the first time on a trial basis when India play their opening Test against England in the coming week. The first Test of the five-match series between India and England is starting from November 9 and Saurashtra Cricket Association (SCA) is hosting it at SCA stadium Khandheri. "Decision Review System (DRS) will be implemented during the Test match in Rajkot," Niranjan Shah, SCA honorary secretary was quoted as saying in an official press release



issued by the SCA. BCCI, after opposing DRS for such a long time has decided to use the system in upcoming Test series against England on trial basis. "Though it would be on trial basis, this will be first ever bilateral test with all components and technology of the system including the ball tracking system being used during the match as well as the series," Shah said. Shah claimed that Rajkot will become the first Test match centre to implement the DRS system for the first time in India. Team India is arriving here tomorrow while the visitors are expected to arrive in the city next day, Himanshu Shah, SCA media manager said.

Novak Djokovic and Andy Murray win, Marin Cilic books London spot

Paris, Nov 4
Novak Djokovic recovered from a slow start as he continued the bid to retain his world number one ranking with a 4-6 6-2 6-3 win over 14th-seeded Bulgarian Grigor Dimitrov in the Paris Masters third round on Thursday.



"No problem, thankfully. Just an awkward footing in that point but all is well," Djokovic told a news conference. Canadian fourth seed Milos Raonic beat Uruguay's Pablo Cuevas 4-6 6-1 6-2 and next faces local favourite Jo-Wilfried Tsonga. The Frenchman overcame a woeful start to down Japanese fifth seed Kei Nishikori 0-6 6-3 7-6 (3). Unseeded American Jack Sock followed up his second-round win against Austrian sixth seed Dominic Thiem with a 6-2 3-6 7-5 victory

against number 12 Richard Gasquet of France. After an early trade of breaks, Djokovic dropped serve again as Dimitrov moved 3-2 up with a backhand volley. A backhand winner down the line gave the Bulgarian the opening set but Djokovic reacted swiftly, opening a 3-0 lead in the second and levelling the match when his opponent served his sixth double fault. Brimming with confidence, the world number one went 3-0 ahead in the decider and did not look back.

Sourabh, who had won the Chinese Taipei Open recently, will next take on experienced World No. 13 Marc Zwiebler of Germany, while younger brother Sameer will face Ukraine's Artem Pochtarov in the next round. On 5 of last month, exactly a month ago, the threshold for entry into force of the Paris Agreement was achieved as 94 countries ratified it. Appropriate financial flows, a new technology framework and an enhanced capacity building framework will be put in place to achieve the ambitious goals of the agreement. It will also support action by developing countries and the most vulnerable countries, in line with their own national objectives. In 2018, Parties will take stock of the collective efforts in relation to progress towards the goal and to inform the preparation of Nationally determined contributions, NDCs. Meanwhile, delegates from around the world will gather in Morocco to begin this year's UN climate conference on Monday. They will discuss concrete rules to ensure emission cuts, including ways to verify whether nations have met their goals.
