Tourism infrastructure at Long Island LG dedicates Eco-huts to people of Islands

Port Blair, Jan 5
The Lt. Governor, Lt Gen A K Singh (Retd), visited Long Island on Jan 4, 2016 and reviewed the progress of development works assigned to various Departments. The PCCF, Shri Omkar Singh, Secretary (GA), Shri Rakesh Bali and APCCF (P&D), Shri D.M. Shukla accompanied the Lt. Governor.



During the visit, the Lt. Governor inaugurated the eco-friendly tented accommodation "Eco-Surmai Reef", constructed by the Forest Department, set up for visitors and tourists. These six tented accommodations will be made available for the tourists. Apart from this, the Forest Rest House has also been refurbished. The Lt. Governor directed that the construction of remaining tented accommodations be done immediately and a wide publicity given, so that visitors could avail the facilities.

Colonoscopic correction of intestinal obstruction done at CSMH

Port Blair, Jan 5
A middle aged gentleman presented with large intestinal obstruction and on CT Scan, the cause of obstruction was found to be 'Intussusception' at Chakraborty Multi Specialty Hospital. It is a condition in which a part of Intestine gets sucked inside adjacent bowel lumen leading to progressive obstruction. If not treated timely, it may lead to gangrene of bowel. Usually it is treated by emergency surgery by opening up abdomen. However, Dr. Sudip Chakraborty did colonoscopy and found a large tumor in bowel which led to intussusception. By graded suction and bowel shortening, intussusception was corrected and Intestinal obstruction released, a communication from CSMH here said.

Islands' Jr. Scientist Girijith Majan creates history in National Children Science Congress

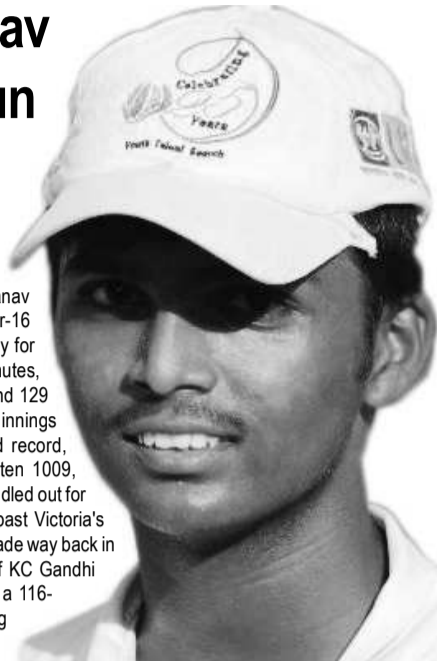
Port Blair, Jan 5

Unbelievable! Just 15, Pranav creates history with 1009-run knock in single innings

Mumbai, Jan 5
Pranav Dhanawade, who has broken a century-old cricketing record on Monday, became the first batsman to score 1000-plus runs in an innings in any form of cricket. Batting against Arya Gurukul School in a Bhandari Cup match, Pranav reached 1000 runs in just 323 balls on Tuesday. The tournament is an under-16 inter-school event organised by the Mumbai Cricket Association (MCA) mainly for the benefit of suburban schools. Pranav's epic knock, which lasted 395 minutes, included a staggering 59 sixes and 129 fours. His team soon declared the innings at 1465/3, which is also a world record, with Pranav remaining at unbeaten 1009, while the opposition side were bundled out for 31 on Monday. His school went past Victoria's 1107 against New South Wales made way back in 1926. The 15-year-old student of KC Gandhi High School, Kalyan has broken a 116-old cricketing record after amassing unbeaten 652 on Monday thus



taking over the mantle of 'highest individual score' (including minor cricket) from AEJ Collins. Collins had held the record since 1899 when he struck an unbeaten 628 for Clark House against North Town House in UK. In the course of his multiple record-breaking feat, Pranav also surpassed Prithvi Shaw's marathon 546 scored two years ago in a Harris Shield tie, an innings that had previously been the highest individual score in any form of cricket in India. New Zealand posted 294 for 5 batting first at the popular beachside resort venue with Gupthill making 102, before Sri Lanka were all out for 258 with 17 balls remaining.

long way in enhancing the preparedness level of the community as a whole.

The chief guest Smt.R. Menaka, Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman dwelt on different aspects of disasters and the importance of the CBDRM Programme. She also explained the role of a PRIs member in disaster management and the importance of Disaster Kit for each family in a disaster prone area.

Earlier, welcoming the gathering, Shri Ramesh Verma, Secretary (DM) spoke on the disaster preparedness efforts of the Administration and the role- PRIs and the community- can play in further strengthening the preparedness levels.

The PRIs were requested to participate enthusiastically in making the programme a success particularly in view of the fact that the islands are vulnerable to various kinds of threats/disasters.

Shri. Subeer Chander, Up-Adhyaksha, Zilla Parishad highlighted the role of the community as the first responders in the event of a disaster or disaster like situation. He welcomed the initiative and exhorted everyone to take opportunity to prepare the community through such CBDRM Programme.

Shri. Gyan Singh, Assistant Director (Logistics) described the salient features of the CBDRM programme as well as the expected outcomes and benefits of the programme. The inaugural session ended with vote of thanks proposed by Shri Sanjay Balan, Deputy Director, Disaster Management.

During the technical session, Ashok Kumar Sharma, Director (DM), A&N Administration highlighted the role of Directorate of Disaster Management and importance of CBDRM (to be implemented in 52 Tribal Village Council and 69 Gram Panchayats of A&N Islands) and its role in making community safer. The participants were also made aware about the Vulnerability profile of Andaman & Nicobar Islands and the preparedness level of A & N Administration.

Shri Janik Ram, Assistant Director (Admin.), described about the preparation of Panchayat Disaster Management Plan and about the constitution of village task force with their roles and responsibilities in CBDRM.

Shri Deen Mohammed, Safety Officer, Directorate of Disaster Management elaborated on Emergency Communication and Early Warning System of ANI and also on various communication elements that render an institution "well prepared" to manage events during a disaster.

Shri Mohit Kumar Bhagori, Inspector along with his NDRF Team presented different techniques and procedure of rescue operation during emergency in disasters including MFR (Medical First Responders) and SAR (Search & Rescue).

Shri Sadhukhan, Inspector, Fire Service along with his team explained and demonstrated various classes of fire and exhibited different types of fire extinguishers. He also made the participants aware on the precautions to taken during fire operation by any lay man. The technical session concluded with Shri. T.K.S Ajayan, Assistant Director (Operation) expressing his appreciation for enthusiastic participation of the PRIs and other stake holders in the workshop cum training. It was also informed that similar trainings shall now be undertaken in a phased manner for N & M Andaman and Nicobar districts too shortly.
