



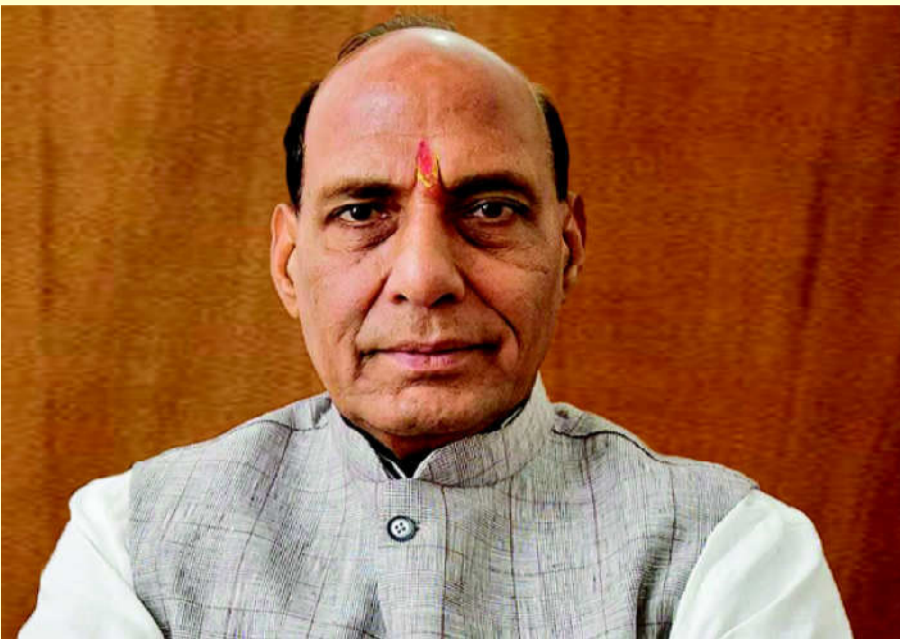

## Union Home Minister, Shri Rajnath Singh arriving on a three-day visit to Isles today



Port Blair, Apr 5

Rousing welcome awaits Hon'ble Union Home Minister of India, Shri Rajnath Singh, who is arriving on a three-day visit to the Islands tomorrow (Apr 6). Soon after arrival, the Union Home Minister will visit the National Memorial, Cellular Jail and lay wreath at the Martyr's Column there in the evening. Thereafter, the Home Minister will hold meeting with the Lt. Governor, Member of Parliament and Senior Officers of the A&N Administration at Raj Niwas.

According to an official communication, the Home Minister is scheduled to visit Guptapara Village to lay the foundation stone for the Solar Power Plant at 9.30 am on April 7, 2017. Thereafter, the Home Minister will depart for Car Nicobar by BSF Aircraft. At Carnicobar, the Home Minister will visit Mus Church at 11.35 am and lay wreath at the graveyard of Late Bishop John Richardson, followed by a visit to Tsunami Memorial and laying of wreath and viewing of gallery. The Home Minister will thereafter visit Malacca Village and inaugurate the new building of Senior Secondary School at Malacca at 12.35 pm. He will also interact with the Captains of Tribal Council and other tribal leaders.

The Home Minister will return to Port Blair from Carnicobar in the evening of Apr 7 itself. At Port Blair, the Union Home Minister is scheduled to visit Ross Island and witness the Light & sound show there. Thereafter, the Home Minister will attend the 'Civic Reception', to be organised by the Port Blair Municipal Council at the ITF ground at 6.35pm.

On April, 8, 2017, the Union Home Minister is scheduled to visit Havelock Island. After returning from Havelock, the Home Minister will meet various social groups at Raj Niwas. After completion of the visit, the Union Home Minister is scheduled to depart for Delhi by the BSF Aircraft in the afternoon of Apr 8, 2017.

### Over 2 cr. LPG connections released to BPL women under PMUY

New Delhi, Apr 5

The government today said, public sector oil marketing companies have released more than two crore LPG connections to the eligible adult woman of the BPL households under Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) till 3rd of this month. In a written reply in Rajya Sabha, Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Shri Dharmendra

Pradhan said so far sizeable number of connections have been released in Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, where the LPG coverage was significantly lower at the time of launch of PMUY. He said average refill sale of customers in the country is 7.7 (14.2 kg) cylinder per annum, including 4 for the beneficiaries of PMUY.

### MP to take up Isles issues with Home Minister

The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has taken up various issues pertaining to the Islanders, with the Govt. of India for redressal. He had submitted letters to the Prime Minister, requesting his intervention for early redressal of those issues. At a press conference held at the MP Bhavan here today, the MP informed the scribes that he will take up those issues for discussion with the Union Home Minister, Shri Rajnath Singh, during his visit to the Islands from April 6 to 8, 2017.

The MP said that matters to be taken up with the



Home Minister include, among others, implementation of the 7th Central Pay Commission's incentives to DRMs, working in different Departments and Institutions in the Islands, grant of compensation as relief to affected farmers, who lost their lands due to tsunami-2004, without surrendering the land and

return of lands to those farmers who have already received compensation after surrendering their lands.

Shri Ray said that there are 2773 DRMs in the APWD, 42 in Health, 50 in Animal Husbandry, 8 in Fisheries, 37 in Agriculture and even in Forest Department, who are to be surrendering the land and

## Virat Kohli named Wisden's Leading Cricketer in the World for 2016, features on cover of 2017 edition

New Delhi, Apr 5  
Indian captain Virat Kohli was today named Wisden's Leading Cricketer in the World for 2016, adding another feather to his already crowded cap. Kohli amassed 1215 Test runs at a stupendous average of 75.93 last year. 10 ODI appearances fetched him 739 runs at 92.37, while he scored 641 T20 International runs at 106.83. Only six batsmen have ever scored more international runs in a calendar year than Kohli but none of them have come close to the Indian captain's average. "Virat Kohli, who features on the cover of the 2017 edition of the Wisden Cricketers' Almanack, is also the Leading Cricketer in the World for 2016, an accolade put in place in 2003 when Ricky Ponting became the first honouree," Wisden announced.

## India fourth in ICC's ODI chart

Dubai, Apr 5  
India held on to the number four position in the latest ICC ODI rankings despite not playing the 50-over format for more than two months. The Virat Kohli-led India have 112 rating points. South Africa lead the chart with 119 rating points followed by Australia (118) and New Zealand (113). India's last ODI engagement was against England in January. The West Indies and Pakistan will aim to consolidate their positions in their bid to qualify directly for the ICC World Cup 2019 when they will feature in a three-match ODI

series starting in Guyana on Friday. The West Indies, the 1975 and 1979 world champions, are presently sitting in ninth position on 84 points, five points behind eighth-ranked 1992 winners Pakistan. Bangladesh, who recently drew their three-match series with Sri Lanka, are seventh on 92 points. The West Indies lead Pakistan 15-13 on a head-to-head at home and have a chance to move ahead of the visiting side. But to make it happen, it will have to win all three matches. If they are able to achieve this, then they will join the green shirts on 87

points and will be ranked eighth as they will be ahead by a fraction of a point. In contrast, if Pakistan, who have won 11 of 19 matches against the West Indies in the West Indies this decade, win all the three matches, then they will join Bangladesh on 92 points and will be ranked ahead of their Asian rival by a fraction of a point. England and the seven other top teams on September 30, 2017 will qualify directly for the World Cup with the remaining four teams getting a second chance through a 10-team Qualifying tournament in 2018.

New Delhi, Apr 5  
A total number of over seven lakh houses have been constructed so far under Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal mission an Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna mission including subsumed projects of Rajiv Awas Yojna for urban poor and slum

dwellers in all Metropolitan cities and Delhi. In a written reply in the Lok Sabha, Minister of State for Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation, Shri Rao Inderjit Singh said, a total of one lakh 24 thousand houses are unoccupied in all metropolitan cities and a total of 75 thousand 430

houses are unoccupied in other small cities. He said, in pursuance of the government's vision of facilitating housing to all by 2022, Centre is implementing PMAY mission to provide assistance to all states and UT in addressing the housing requirement of the slum dwellers and urban poor.

Kuching (Malaysia), Apr 5  
India's top shuttlers PV Sindhu and Saina Nehwal today suffered shocking first-round exits from the Malaysia Open Super Series here. Rio Olympics silver-medallist Sindhu was shown the door by unseeded Chen Yufei of China 18-21 21-19 21-17 in women's singles at the Stadium Perpaduan. It took Chen one hour and eight minutes to get the better of the sixth-seeded Indian, who entered the tournament following her title triumph

in the India Open last Sunday. London Games bronze-winner Saina lost to Japan's Akane Yamaguchi, seeded fourth, 19-21 21-13 21-15 in a match that lasted 56 minutes. However, Ajay Jayaram defeated Chinese Qiao Bin in straight sets 21-11 21-8, needing barely 31 minutes to complete a comfortable win in the men's singles opening round match. The men's doubles combo of Manu Attri and Sumeeth Reddy lost to Chinese Taipei's Liao Kuan Hao and Lu Chia Pin 18-21 21-18 21-17.

benefitted by the implementation of the 7th Central Pay Commission's incentives of granting 1/30 plus pay. The PBMC has already passed a resolution for grant of the incentive to its 292 rightful DRMs, which will be implemented shortly by the Council, he said.

The MP further informed that various other issues of the discussion with the Union Home Minister during his stay in the Islands will include issuance of patta to the excess landholders of 1961 settlers. Only 445 of them have received patta for their lands while 1526 are yet to get the same, he said. Other issues will include settlement of Sri Lankan repatriates, grant of 13th month payment to Fire Brigade personnel, as was granted during the period 1979-2012, regularization of 1978 encroachments and review of the Sekhar Singh's Commission reports.

Shri Ray also informed about the works to be executed shortly in the Islands, the funds for which have already sanctioned by the Government. They include maintenance of National Highway from Austin to Kalara in North Andaman by the NHDC, establishment of a 90X20 sq. mtrs Dockyard and construction of Teylerabad and Sippighat sluice gates under MPLAD fund.
