No reservation in appointments at senior positions: Govt

New Delhi, May 5
 There is no provision for reservation in appointments at senior positions, the government said on Wednesday. Of the total 69 IAS officers working as secretaries in various central government ministries, one belongs to Scheduled Caste and two to Scheduled Tribe, Minister of State for Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions Shri Jitendra Singh said in a written reply in Lok Sabha. "There is no provision for reservation in appointments at senior positions under the central staffing scheme. Secretaries are appointed on the basis of their experiences and suitability as per the established procedures," he said. At present, 18 non-IAS officers are holding the posts of secretaries in various central government departments. Further, a person with expertise in the sector has been appointed as Secretary, Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation on contract basis, the Minister said.

Visit of Chief Secretary to Chowra Island overwhelmed tribal community

Chowra, May 5
 The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar on his maiden visit to Southern Group of Islands visited Chowra Island on May 3 along with the Deputy Commissioner, Nicobars & Superintendent of Police, Nicobars to witness various developmental activities being undertaken for the overall development of Tribal Community at Chowra, one of the remotest Island of Southern Group of Islands. During the visit, warm welcome was bestowed to the Chief Secretary & entourage by the Chairman, Tribal Council, Chowra and Tribal Village captains in their traditional manner where the Assistant Commissioner, Nancowrie Shri Casper James and tribal villagers were also present at large. The Chief Secretary, A & N Islands interacted with the Chairman, Tribal Council, Chowra and all Village Captains of Chowra Island further took stock of



various developmental works being undertaken at the Chowra Island to ascertain the needs and deeds of the tribals. The Chief Secretary while interacting with the tribals gave a patient hearing upon the various issues/demands put-forth by the Tribal village heads. The first and foremost need as emphasised by the Tribal Community of Chowra Island was providing of drinking water to the Island as no source of drinking water is available at Chowra Island. It was informed that the whole Island fully depends upon the rain and the rain water is being stored through water harvest system subsequently being utilised throughout the year. The Deputy Commissioner, Nicobar Ms. Neha Bansal informed that the feasibility study for installation of desalination plant has been entrusted to the NIOT whereby the Institute has already surveyed the area and the work is expected to be completed by end of this year. Further, the tribals have requested the Chief Secretary to provide mobile connectivity to the Island and also requested to setup a V-Sat at GSS, Kuitasui, Chowra to connect the Island with the outside world at par with other Islands. The Chief Secretary assured that the Administration will work on

22 universities spread across nine States are fake: Minister

New Delhi, May 5
 A total of 22 universities spread across nine states including Delhi are fake and are functioning in violation of the University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956. Replying to supplementaries during the Question Hour in the Rajya Sabha today, Human Resource Development Minister Smt. Smriti Irani said the UGC has taken several steps against the fraudulent universities. She said UGC has put up the list of fake institutions on its website. She said, all the self-styled unrecognized and unapproved institutions are cautioned that running of Undergraduate and Post-graduate degree courses and giving misleading advertisements shall attract severe action under the provisions of appropriate laws including the UGC Act and the Indian Penal Code. The Minister said cases have also been filed in various courts by the UGC against fake universities. She said, the UGC has sent letters to state governments to take appropriate action against the fake universities. The HRD Minister also said that she has written to the External Affairs ministry in this regard.

Review meeting for recently conducted Coastal Security exercise held

Chief Secretary briefed about proposed measures for strengthening seaward security

Port Blair, May 5
 A review meeting for recently conducted Coastal Security exercise Taturaksha, was conducted yesterday, during which Shri Anindo Majumdar, Chief Secretary A&N Administration lauded the coordination efforts of various security agencies and other departments towards ensuring seaward security of A&N Islands. During the meeting, the Commander Coast Guard, Inspector General Kuldip Singh Sheoran briefed the Chief Secretary about intricacies of the exercise and proposed measures for further strengthening seaward security in the Islands. The meeting was attended by PCCF Wildlife, IG Police and senior officials from defence, fisheries, PMB and other departments. The 13th version of exercise Taturaksha was conducted by Coast Guard in entire A&N from 05-08



April, during which 17 government agencies including Army, Navy, Air Force, Police, Forest, Fisheries, PMB, DSS, Customs and int agencies participated. During the exercise, real-time situations were generated, wherein commandos acting as terrorists attempted to infiltrate on various Islands through sea route. Such Coastal Security exercises are conducted twice every year in all coastal States to validate the Coastal Security SOPs and level of coordination among all stake holders. This year's exercise saw a massive build-up by all participating agencies. A total of 18 Coast Guard ships, 04 Naval ships, 20 Police boats and 21 forest boats cordoned the entire A&N Islands from seaward side. DSS ship Shompen also participated in the exercise. During the exercise, aerial surveillance was intensified by Coast Guard, Air Force and Naval aircraft. In addition, security was tightened at seaports, landing points, forest check points and other vital areas by Police, CISF and Forest Department. Various fisheries associations, coastal villages and other groups also participated in this year's exercise, a communication said.

Therefore it is proposed to conserve water in Dhanikhari Dam till the onset of monsoon. Accordingly APWD is going to reduce its bulk supply to PBMC by 15% w.e.f 07.05.2016. However, PBMC will continue to maintain the alternate day supply with certain adjustments in timing and quantity in distribution w.e.f 07.05.16. In the wake of this situation, public have been requested to use water judiciously to conserve it. RS members demand Bharat Ratna for Dhyan Chand

New Delhi, May 5
Rajya Sabha members across party lines today demanded that hockey wizard Major Dhyan Chand be conferred with Bharat Ratna, the country's highest civilian honour.

Dhyan Chand had won three Olympic gold medals in hockey for India between 1928 and 1936. "Major Dhyan Chand received awards and accolades across the world including from Adolf Hitler and the British government. But in our country, he has still not been appreciated as he should have been for making India a world power in hockey," Yadav said. He said even Prime Minister Narendra Modi, when he was Chief Minister of Gujarat, had

called for conferring Bharat Ratna on Dhyan Chand. Yadav's concerns were supported by members across party lines and even by Deputy Chairman P J Kurien. "It has the full support of the House," Kurien said. In March this year, Dilip Tirkey (BJD), former Indian hockey player, had raised the issue of discrimination against Indian sports like kabaddi and hockey and reminded that Dhyan Chand has not been given the Bharat Ratna.

Bankruptcy Code passed in Lok Sabha

New Delhi, May 5
The Lok Sabha today passed the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016. The Code seeks to consolidate and amend the laws relating to reorganization and insolvency resolution of corporate persons, partnership firms and individuals in a time bound manner. The bill provides for setting up of an Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India to regulate professionals, agencies and information utilities engaged in resolution of insolvencies of companies. As per the code, in case of insolvency, interest of the workers should be fully protected and they should be given dues for 24 months. The code provides for establishment of National Companies Law Tribunal and Debt Recovery Tribunals as adjudicating

authorities for resolution of insolvency, liquidation and bankruptcy. Replying to the debate, Minister of State for Finance, Shri Jayant Sinha said, the code will give a push to the ease of doing business in the country. He said, the interest the workers has been taken care of while formulating the code. He said, payment of workers dues will be given top priority in case of liquidation of a company. The bill was introduced in

Dr Singh said The India-Pakistan Joint Judicial Committee, consisting of retired judges of superior judiciary from the two countries, visit jails in both countries to ensure humane treatment and expeditious release of prisoners, including fishermen on both sides, who have completed their prison terms.
