PM invites Qatar's business leaders to take advantage of investment opportunities available in India

Qatar, Jun 5 Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi today invited Qatar's business leaders to take advantage of the opportunities available in India by investing in the country. He described India as a "land of opportunity" and promised to address bottlenecks identified by them.



In a roundtable meeting with Qatari business leaders in Doha today, the Prime Minister identified agro processing, railways and solar energy as very promising areas for Qatari investment. Shri Modi described 800 million youth in India as the country's biggest

strength. He added that projects like smart cities, metros and urban waste management are geared towards upgrading quality of life of people. The Prime Minister also praised the

role of Emir of Qatar Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani in promoting India-Qatar business ties.

India has been focusing on improving ties with the Gulf region which is crucial

for its energy security. This is his 4th visit to a Gulf nation after United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia and Iran.

In his remarks during his meeting with business

leaders, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi praised the role of Qatar's Emir in promoting business ties. Inviting them for investment, Shri Modi said, India is a land of opportunities and they should grab it. There is a vast potential for Qatar investment authority to increase its investment in India keeping in view of India's huge investment needs and investment friendly policies.

Even Qatar's sovereign wealth fund and other state owned entities are keenly looking at attractive investment options in infrastructure in India. During last two years there

Environment Minister calls for need to focus on species about to become extinct

Mumbai, June 5 In view of World Environment Day, Union Minister for Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Shri Prakash Javadekar today called for a need to focus on species which are about to become extinct. He was speaking at function organized at the Sanjay Gandhi National Park in Mumbai. He said that the government is determined

to rehabilitate the near extinct species of vultures within the next 10 years and try to reach a respectable figure. Shri Javdekar said that the government is planning to take support from America for technical usage specially in forest areas, PM will sign an MoU with America in this regard. Also the ministry plans to increase urban forest, and save forest land and plant

trees. Shri Javadekar informed that in 200 cities the ministry has planned for forestation. Focusing on the theme for the World Environment Day 2016 which is 'Go Wild for Life': Zero Tolerance For Illegal Wildlife Trade', Shri. Javadekar said, to support common cause to save animals, one should refrain from use of animal products or animal skin.

FM promises more structural & market-oriented reforms

New Delhi, June 5 Finance Minister, Shri Arun Jaitley recently promised more structural and market-oriented reforms as well as stepping up infrastructure spending to accelerate economic growth beyond the current 7.6 per cent. He also promised to reform the tax structure to make it simpler, predictable and stable.

Speaking at 'The Future of Asia' Conference organised by Nikkei Inc in

Tokyo recently, he said India has been the fastest growing major economy in the last two years despite global slowdown.

The Finance Minister added, the country has been able to perform despite adversities in two consecutive bad monsoons and some stress in the Indian private sector.

Shri Jaitley said, a very large number of reforms have taken place over the

Draft Anti-Human Trafficking Bill 2016 released

New Delhi, June 5 Women and Child Development Minister, Smt. Maneka Gandhi presented the draft Anti-Human Trafficking Bill 2016 recently. The bill proposes that usage of narcotic drugs or alcohol, for the purpose of trafficking can be imprisoned up to 7 years with a fine of 1 lakh rupees at least. Similarly, the draft Bill states that whoever administers any chemical substance to a trafficked

woman or a girl child can face a jail term up to 3 years and will have to pay a fine amounting to at least one lakh. The Bill also plans to come down heavily on repeat offenders and those trafficking minors with their existing sentence being doubled to 14 years. Under the Draft Bill, special courts will be set up and special prosecutors will be appointed for speedy trials of offenses under this act.

Centre to establish 10 startups in higher educational institutions to promote young entrepreneurs

New Delhi, June 5 Centre will establish 10 startups in higher educational institutions across the country to promote energy and zeal among young entrepreneurs. It will also support setting up of 35 new livelihood colleges in states to fructify the skill India programme. This was announced by

Human Resources Development Minister Smti Smriti Irani while dedicating initiatives carried out in ten states through Video conferencing from New Delhi under Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan on Friday. She said the government will also set up modern language labs in all states

to promote different languages. On the occasion, the Minister digitally launched New Model Degree Colleges in Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Odisha among other initiatives. The Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan aims at strengthening infrastructure and ensuring

quality education in states. It provides strategic funds for states besides giving impetus to governance, academic and administrative reforms. Under the scheme, 115 Universities and 1183+ Colleges across the country are provided grants for enhancing infrastructure for the first time.

Keep unhealthy habits at bay for a healthy life: Dr. Shahid

"Cancer, if diagnosed at an early stage, followed by correct and timely treatment, can be cured", said Dr. PP. Abdul Shahid, Oncologist, ANIIMS in an interview with 'The Daily Telegrams' here recently.

Born and brought up in Port Blair, Dr. Shahid completed his schoolings from Kendriya Vidhyalaya No.1. He completed MBBS from Thrissur Medical College, Kerala, MD in General Medicine from Aligarh Muslim University, and DM in Medical Oncology from Regional Cancer Centre (RCC), Trivandrum. Earlier, he has also served at RCC as Medical Oncologist before coming back to the Islands.

Sharing his experience of treating cancer patients of varied kinds, Dr. Shahid said "nothing is more satisfactory than sending your patients home fully cured". Dr. Shahid joined GB Pant in January 2015 and during the past one and half year, he has encountered as many as 400 cases of cancer of which around 40% were

patients with head and neck cancer-such as oral cavity, tongue and cheek, which he said, is due to consumption of tobacco and its allied products, both in smoking as well as smokeless form and addiction to alcohol. "Head and neck cancer is one of the most common one here in the Islands and the delay in treatment makes it difficult and morbid for the patients", he said, adding that this can very well be avoided, if one abstains from using tobacco in any form. Other cancers which are commonly encountered are Breast cancer, Lung cancer, Cervical cancer and Cancer of the stomach.

Speaking about blood cancer, Dr. Shahid revealed that Blood cancer is one of the most challenging cancers to treat in oncology. With the basic facility available at GB Pant, Dr. Shahid has managed around 15 to 20 blood related cancer cases from one and half year, some of which he said were acute while some were chronic. Acute leukemia is

Indian judoka Avtar Singh qualifies for Rio Olympic Games

Rio, June 5
South Asian Games gold medalist Indian judoka Avtar Singh has qualified for the Rio Olympic Games under 90kg weight category. According to an official statement of the International Judo Federation, Avtar has qualified for the Olympic under the continental quota. His World Ranking is now 79 with 182 points. Avtar, who hails from Gurdaspur in Punjab, won a gold in South Asian Games held in Shillong in February and a



bronze medal in Asian Junior Judo Championships in 2011. He also won gold medals in Senior National Judo Championships in 2013-14 and 2014-15. In the Asian Judo Championships in April in Uzbekistan, Avtar finished fifth after beating judokas from China and Iran.

Ali's public funeral on Friday in Louisville

Scottsdale, US, June 5
A public funeral procession and memorial service for boxing legend Muhammad Ali will take place in his hometown of Louisville, Kentucky on Friday, a family spokesman said on Saturday. Former US president Bill Clinton, comedian Billy Crystal and sports journalist Bryant Gumbel will offer eulogies for Ali, the three-time world heavyweight champion who died on Friday at age 74 after a long battle with Parkinson's disease. A small family funeral will



precede the public service on Thursday, spokesman Bob Gunnell told reporters in Scottsdale, Arizona. President Barack Obama led tributes from around the world to the iconic fighter, one of the great sports heroes of the 20th century and a colourful civil rights activist. Louisville lowered flags to half-staff in his honour on Saturday.

Spanish pair denies Bryans 17th major title

Paris, June 5
Feliciano Lopez and Marc Lopez won the French Open on Saturday for their first Grand Slam doubles title, denying Bob and Mike Bryan a 17th major trophy. The duo became the first Spanish pair to win at Roland Garros in 26 years with a 6-4, 6-7 (6), 6-3 victory over their American rivals.



The No. 15 seeds played together only once before at a major tournament and had to struggle to get to this final. They saved six match points in their quarterfinal win over 2014 champions Julien Benneteau and Edouard Roger-Vasselin. They also went to three sets before downing defending champions Ivan Dodig and Marcelo Melo in the semifinals. The Bryans, the most successful pairing of all time, were seeking a third title on the red clay following victories in 2003 and 2013.

"The tough thing about us is that if we don't leave with the big trophy it's devastating," Bob Bryan said. "We have high standards, and sometimes that makes it not fun, because we can't get any kind of enjoyment out of a final or semi like maybe

some other players. "You know, that's the burden that we carry. We're feeling that pain right now. We don't take any solace out of leaving with the square plate." Feliciano Lopez sealed the Spaniards' win with an ace and both partners fell on their back in jubilation. "You can't imagine what it means to win a Grand Slam for the first time, against the best players in the sport," Feliciano Lopez said. Their victory also benefited Frenchman Nicolas Mahut, who will top the doubles ranking for the first time next week. The fifth-seeded Bryans

more commonly seen in pediatric age group and if early diagnosis is carried out, followed by proper treatment, the chances of recovery is as high as 90%, if everything goes fine, he said.

Currently around 8 to 10 patients are undergoing treatment for blood related cancer at GB Pant. Some are getting intense chemotherapy while some are on maintenance regime, said Dr. Shahid.

Explaining about cancer, Dr. Shahid said the symptoms depend on the site of the cancer. Some of the common symptoms are recurrent infection, repeated fever, bleeding manifestation in the body, enlargement of glands, gums, lump anywhere in the body. Nonhealing ulcers, blood in sputum, change in voice etc. People should be enlightened about the disease and its preventive measures, he added.

Speaking about the facility for treating cancer patients here at GB Pant Hospital, Dr. Shahid said "very costly medicines are provided free of cost for treating cancer patients here and the support received from the Administration is laudable".

Appreciating the A&N Administration's support toward providing facility for the treatment of cancer patients, Dr. Shahid said, the Administration is providing free treatment for cancer patients, the actual cost of which can go as high as 10 to 15 lakhs in many patients, which is not affordable by many, this deserves appreciation. He also stated that there should be a separate Department of Medical Oncology for treating cancer patients.

When asked how he feels as a doctor while treating cancer patients, Dr. Shahid said, "it is the social responsibility of every doctor to help the society for a better tomorrow, adding that Islanders who have gone out to pursue medicine should at least come back and contribute towards the Islands health facility even if it is for a short while". He stated that the requirement of super specialist doctors in Isles is the demand of the day.

Appealing to the masses, Dr. Shahid urged one and all to abstain from unhealthy habits such as chewing tobacco and other products which are harmful for the body. He said that many Cancers are preventable and should be prevented. Dr. Shahid is available every Tuesday and Friday at GB Pant Hospital M2 OPD and also during emergency.
