India, Israel sign seven pacts across sectors, to cooperate in fight against terrorism

Tel Aviv, July 5
India and Israel today signed seven agreements across sectors including two MoUs in the field of water management and three MoUs on space co-operation, one on Science and Technology and one on Agriculture. Later, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and Israeli Prime Minister Mr Benjamin Netanyahu addressed a joint press meet. Shri Modi said India and Israel have agreed to do much more together to protect strategic interests of both the countries. He said, our goal is to build a relationship that reflects our shared priorities and draws on enduring bonds between our peoples. Shri



Modi said he and Mr. Netanyahu discussed the situation in West Asia and the wider region. The Prime Minister also expressed India's hope that peace, dialogue and restraint will

prevail. Speaking during the joint Press Meet, Israeli Prime Minister said this is a deeply moving moment as the two countries are making history. He said we are being challenged by

forces of terror and we have agreed to cooperate in this area. Mr. Netanyahu also said ours is a partnership to seek good, defend good and achieve good.

Stakeholders meet on development of tuna fisheries at Kochi

Port Blair, Jul 5

The ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute, Port Blair, A&N Islands, on the behest of Andaman and Nicobar Administration is organizing a Stakeholders Meet for Development of Tuna Fisheries in Andaman and Nicobar Islands on July 8th, 2017 at ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Technology, Kochi.

The meeting will be attended by the Chief Secretary, A&N

Administration, Secretary (Fy), A&N Administration, Directors and Scientists from ICAR-CIARI, ICAR-CIFT and ICAR-CMFRI and Officials from Department of Fisheries and Department of Industries, A&N Administration and Regional Director, Fisheries Survey of India, Port Blair base and other stakeholders.

The A&N Administration has taken a step to develop the infrastructure for tuna fishing and

processing to give a boost to the tuna fishing industry in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. This meeting is intended to provide a platform to express the aspiration of the industrialists and entrepreneurs and to provide a congenial environment for the interested parties to invest in enterprises pertaining to enhancing tuna fishing in A&N Islands and its associated value addition industries.

The waters surrounding

A&N Islands are endowed with rich marine fishery resources with an estimate of 1.48 lakh tonnes of exploitable resources. As per the estimates by Fisheries Survey of India, the oceanic waters around Andaman and Nicobar Islands are rich fishing grounds for tuna and tuna like fishes, for which the projected exploitable potential is around 65,000 tonnes. The current level of exploitation is less than 1,000 tonnes per annum, a communication said.

Setting up of 'Atal Tinkering Laboratories'; schools asked to file online nominations by July 15

Port Blair, July 5

The Govt. of India has decided to set up the 2nd round of ATL (Atal Tinkering Laboratory) under AIM (Atal Innovation Mission) through the NITI Aayog to cultivate one million children in India as 'Neoteric Innovators' with the objective to foster curiosity, creativity and imagination in young minds. ATL is a work space where young minds can give shape to their ideas through 'hands on do-it-yourself mode' and learn innovation skills. Young children will get a



chance to work with tools and equipment to understand the concepts of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math).

An amount of Rs. 10 Lakhs will be provided for establishing each ATL and Rs. 2 Lakhs will be

'GST CORNER'

Public advised to be vigilant against price rise

With the roll-out of Goods & Service Tax since 1st July 2017, there appear to be certain confusions in the mind of the common man as well as among the members of the business community. It is apprehended that there would be rise in prices of essential commodities. However, such apprehension is baseless because at every stage of sale of goods traders registered under GST are entitled to avail Input Tax Credit i.e. the amount of tax already paid by him on the goods at the time of purchase shall be adjusted against the tax payable on supply of the goods. Since under GST tax is calculated only on 'value addition' i.e. just the amount of value added at every stage of business, there cannot be any situation where tax is calculated on taxes already paid. Therefore, there is no possible reason for sharp rise in price. People are, therefore, requested to be vigilant about pricing of essential commodities in their neighbourhood and keep watch on instances of profiteering, and report to the Administration. GST has anti-profiteering clauses to address such situations. It is also emphasised that from 1st July 2017 onwards, tax must be paid on supply of goods and service at the prescribed rates of GST, though it is understandable that in the initial days under the new tax regime there may be some lack of preparedness as regards Invoicing/ Billing. The traders who are unable to switch over to the new Billing system till date may use the existing form of Invoice for the time being and charge tax at GST rate, and try and switch over to new prescribed Billing system immediately on receiving GSTIN. For Maximum Retail Price (MRP) items, the item has to be sold at a maximum of MRP rate, No extra charge above the MRP can be put. National Heritage City Development and Augmentation Yojana

National Heritage City Development and Augmentation Yojana (HRIDAY) was launched on 21 January 2015 with the aim of bringing together urban planning, economic growth and heritage conservation in an inclusive manner to preserve the heritage character of each Heritage City.

The Scheme shall support development of core heritage infrastructure projects including revitalization of linked urban infrastructure for heritage assets such as monuments, Ghats, temples etc. along with reviving certain intangible assets. These initiatives shall include development of sanitation facilities, roads, public transportation & parking, citizen services, information kiosks etc.

With a duration of 4 years (completing in November 2018) and a total outlay of Rs 500 crore, the Scheme is set to be implemented in 12 identified Cities namely, Ajmer, Amaravati, Amritsar, Badami, Dwarka, Gaya, Kanchipuram, Mathura, Puri, Varanasi, Velankanni and Warangal

1. Planning, development and implementation of heritage-sensitive infrastructure
2. Service Delivery and infrastructure provisioning in the core areas of the historic city
3. Preserve and revitalise heritage wherein tourists can connect directly with city's unique character

4. Develop and document a heritage asset inventory of cities - natural, cultural, living and built heritage as a basis for urban planning, growth, service provision and delivery

Pankaj Advani-led Indian team beat Pakistan to clinch Asian Snooker C'ship

Bishskak, Jul 5

India's leading cueist Pankaj Advani teamed up with Laxman Rawat to demolish Pakistan in the final of the Asian Team Snooker Championship in Bishskak, Kyrgyzstan today. Advani pieced together a brilliant break of 83 to seal the first tie of the best-of-five final. India's fate was determined by Advani's partner Rawat's form and he did not disappoint. He rose to the occasion with a clinical 73 break to win the frame. To complete a whitewash, the Indian pair maintained their superlative performance in the doubles tie.



Advani held his nerve and completed the task of clearing the frame along with Rawat and winning the final 3-0. Advani remained the only player not to lose a single

individual match in the team event. This title brings up Advani's second Asian title this season and 8th overall while it was a first major first international title for Rawat.

Sania Mirza to begin her campaign in Wimbledon Championships

New Delhi, Jul 5

In Tennis, Sania Mirza will today begin her campaign of the Wimbledon Championships, the third Grand Slam of the season, in London. Sania and her Belgian team-mate Kirsten Flipkens are seeded 13th in Women's Doubles and will take on the unseeded Japanese-Chinese team of Naomi Osaka and Shuai



Zhang in the opening round. In the Singles, world number one and local favourite Andy Murray, Rafael Nadal, second seed Simona

Halep, Johanna Konta, Venus Williams and Marin Cilic are among those who will be seen in action in the second round.

FIFA U-17 World Cup: Draw will be held on July 7 in Mumbai

Mumbai, July 5

Delhi will host all league matches involving India in the FIFA U-17 World Cup.

In a press release, FIFA, the game's governing body, said: "Following a request from the All India Football Federation (AIFF) to hold India's group matches in New Delhi, and the fruitful discussions between the Local Organising Committee (LOC) and the local government, FIFA has agreed to amend the match schedule." Group A, featuring the home team (automatically seeded as A1), will be based in New Delhi and teams of Group B will be based in Navi Mumbai. Matches for the knockout stage remain as planned before, FIFA announced.



The draw for the FIFA U-17 World Cup India 2017 will take place on July 7 in Mumbai. The line-up: Iran, Iraq, Japan, Korea DPR (AFC); New Caledonia, New Zealand (OFC); Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Paraguay (CONMEBOL); Costa Rica,

Honduras, Mexico, USA (CONCACAF); England, France, Germany, Spain, Turkey (UEFA); Mali, Niger, Ghana, and Guinea (CAF).

Shiv Kapur, enjoying good results of late, added another feather to his cap by earning a ticket to his third British Open after winning the Qualifying event.
