Shri M Venkaiah Naidu elected as 13th Vice President of India



PM congratulates Shri M Venkaiah Naidu

New Delhi, Aug 5

The Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has congratulated Shri M Venkaiah Naidu on being elected the 13th Vice President of India.

The Prime Minister said, "Congratulations to Shri M Venkaiah Naidu Garu on being elected India's Vice President. My best wishes for a fruitful & motivating tenure.

My mind is filled with memories of working with Shri M Venkaiah Naidu Garu, in the Party & Government. Will cherish this aspect of our association. I am confident Shri M Venkaiah Naidu will serve the nation as a diligent & dedicated Vice President, committed to the goal of nation building."

New Delhi, Aug 5
Former Union Minister Shri M Venkaiah Naidu will be the new Vice President of India as he defeated Shri Gopal Krishna Gandhi by 272 votes. Voting to elect the 13th Vice President was conducted today with 98.21 per cent polling recorded.

There was a straight fight between NDA's candidate Shri M Venkaiah Naidu and Opposition nominee Shri Gopal Krishna Gandhi. Briefing media in New Delhi, Returning Officer Shri Shemsher K Sharif said Shri Naidu received 516 votes against Shri Gopal Krishna Gandhi's 244 votes.

771 votes out of 785 votes were cast in the elections. 14 MPs did not cast their votes. The newly elected Vice President will take oath on the 11th of August. Shri Naidu has served as the Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs and Information and

Broadcasting in the present government. Shri Naidu was born on 1st July, 1949 in Chavatapalem, a remote village in the Nellore district of Andhra Pradesh. Right from his college days, he was deeply interested in the welfare of the common man, particularly the farmers and

the down trodden sections of the society. This led to his active involvement in the political and social activities from a young age. During his three decades in public life, Shri Naidu has held several positions, including President of BJP. The opposition nominee (Contd. on last page)

He was the President of Youth Wing of Janata Party from 1977 to 1980.

Member of Andhra Pradesh

Legislative Assembly for two consecutive terms from 1978 to 1985.

He became the General Secretary of the Party in Andhra Pradesh in 1985.

In 1988, he was appointed as the President of the State Party.

Shri Naidu was thrice elected to Rajya Sabha from Karnataka and served a period from 1998 to 2014.

Shri Naidu served as a Minister of Rural Development from 2000 to 2002.

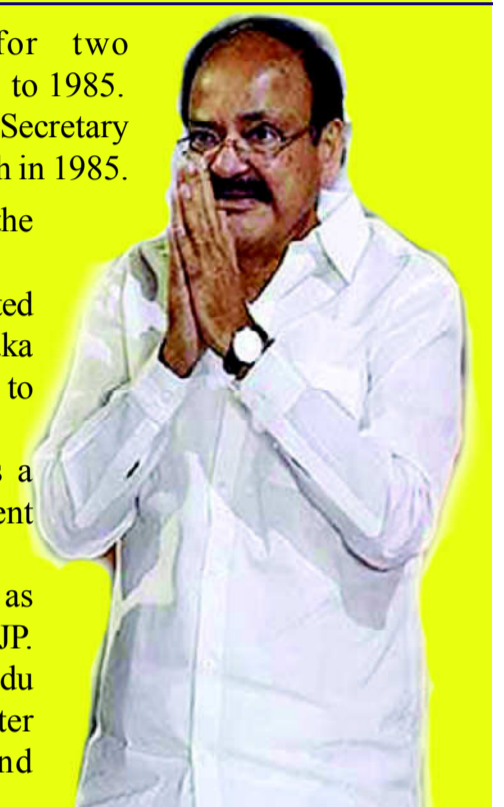
In 2002 he was appointed as the National Party President, BJP.

Government proposes to establish an additional 14 new AIIMS under various phases of Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana in different parts of the country, Lok Sabha was informed today. Replying to supplementaries on AIIMS and related healthcare system in India, Union Health Minister Shri JP

Nadda said government is working on enhancing the capacity of national capital's medical institutes, which receive a large number of patients from across the country. He said an additional 1,563 new beds will be added in the existing capacity of AIIMS at Delhi and 73 existing medical institutions are being upgraded by setting up of

super specialty blocks, trauma centres in the country. Under the national programme for prevention and control of cancer, diabetes, cardio-vascular diseases and strokes, the Health Minister said, Center to support the establishment of 20 State Cancer Institutes and 50 (Contd. on last page)

Government announces new exchange traded fund, Bharat-22

New Delhi, Aug 5
Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley yesterday announced a new Exchange Traded Fund (ETF) named BHARAT 22 which consists of 22 scrips including ONGC, IOC, SBI and Axis Bank. ICICI Prudential AMC will be the ETF Manager and Asia Index Private Limited will be the Index Provider.

The index will be rebalanced annually. ETF functions like a mutual fund scheme and is bought by investors as units. Talking to reporters in New Delhi, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said, Bharat-22 will have a diversified portfolio of six sectors, including energy, FMCG, finance, basic material and industrial and

utilities. He said, ETF investment is less risky and provides liquid assets which are (Contd. on last page)

yesterday, Minister of State for Finance Shri Santosh Kumar Gangwar said that over two hundred officials have been appointed to monitor the impact of GST at district level. He said the feedback received is reviewed by a Central Monitoring Committee

headed by the Cabinet Secretary. In another reply, the Minister said, cost of construction of flats, houses and complexes is expected to come down on account of seamless flow of input tax credits of goods and services.

Sri Lanka trail by 230 runs with 8 wickets in hand after India enforce follow-on in Colombo test on day three



Colombo, Aug 5
In the second Cricket Test against India at Colombo, forced to follow on, Sri Lanka finished Day Three today trailing by 230 runs with eight second innings wickets in hand, Earlier, the hosts conceded their highest-ever first innings lead of 439 runs in Test cricket when they were bowled out for a paltry 183 in the first innings. They had resumed the day at

their overnight 50 for 2. For India, Ravichandran Ashwin picked up his 26th five-wicket haul in Test cricket with a tally of five for 69. Kusal Mendis and opener Karunaratne fought back in the second innings displaying their best batting performance. The two put on 191 runs for the second wicket. In the process, Mendis got his third Test century and was out for

110. At stumps, Karunaratne on 92, and Malinda Pushpakumara on 2 were at the crease. India had made a mammoth 622 for 9 declared in their first innings. India lead the three-match series 1-0 after winning the first Test in Galle by 304 runs. The scores so far:- India - 622 for 9 declared. Sri Lanka - 183 and 209 for 2.

traded real time and is a transparent mode of investment. The government had raised about eight thousand 500 crore rupees through the three tranches of CPSE Exchange Traded Fund last fiscal. In his Budget Speech, Shri Jaitley had promised to use ETF as a vehicle for further disinvestment of shares. The target for central public sector enterprises disinvestment in 2017-18 was set at 72,500 crore rupees. During the current Financial Year, the government has realised approx 9,300 crore rupees through nine disinvestment transactions so far.
