Parliament passes Bill increasing number of Apex Court Judges from 33 to 37

New Delhi, Aug. 5

Parliament has passed the Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Amendment Bill, 2026, with the Rajya Sabha returning the legislation to the Lok Sabha after a discussion. The Lok Sabha had passed it on Monday. The bill amends the Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Act, 1956, for increasing the number of Judges of the Apex Court from the present 33 to 37 (excluding the Chief Justice of India). In May this year, Hon'ble President, Smt. Droupadi Murmu had promulgated an ordinance to increase



the number of Supreme Court Judges from 33 to 37.

Replying to debate in the Rajya Sabha, Union Minister of Law and Justice, Shri Arjun Ram

Meghwal said, the Narendra Modi Government is working with the motto of Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas and Sabka Prayas. He said,

El Nino likely to persist till February 2027, monsoon impact depends on multiple climate factors: Union Minister

New Delhi, Aug. 5

Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science & Technology and Earth Sciences, Dr. Jitendra Singh on Wednesday informed the Lok Sabha that El Nino conditions, which developed in May 2026, are likely to persist until February 2027, according to the latest assessment by

the Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS). However, he clarified that the phenomenon alone does not determine the performance of the Indian monsoon, as several other climate systems also influence rainfall.

In a written reply in the Lok Sabha, the Minister

said INCOIS' indigenous Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning (AI/ML)-based El Nino Southern Oscillation (ENSO) prediction system, together with the Global Ocean Data Assimilation System, projects a 70-90 per cent probability of El Niño persisting from June 2026 to February 2027.

Singh explained that while El Nino has historically been associated with weaker Indian Summer Monsoon rainfall over parts of the country, its impact varies depending on the interaction of several climatic factors. These include the Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD), the Madden-Julian Oscillation (MJO) and regional ocean-atmosphere interactions, all of which play a crucial role in shaping the monsoon. He said the eventual impact of El Nino on this year's monsoon will depend on the evolution of ocean-atmosphere conditions, including prevailing wind patterns and the behaviour of the Indian Ocean Dipole. The Government, he added, is closely monitoring the evolving situation through advanced forecasting systems. The Minister noted that the developing El Nino could influence atmospheric circulation over the Arabian Sea and the Bay of Bengal, increasing the likelihood of marine heatwaves due to persistent warming in these regions. Such changes may affect ocean mixing, nutrient availability and marine biological productivity, potentially influencing fish distribution and coastal ecosystems. Variations in wave and swell conditions could also impact navigation, offshore operations and other coastal activities.

Highlighting the Government's preparedness, Dr. Singh said INCOIS has significantly strengthened its Ocean State Forecasting and marine multi-hazard early warning services through high-resolution forecasting models capable of predicting storm surges, high waves, swell surges and ocean currents. He said forecasting capabilities have been enhanced through an expanded ocean observation network comprising ocean gliders, moored buoys, Argo floats, tide gauges and satellite observations, integrated with advanced data assimilation systems.

The Minister said the Government has also improved round-the-clock operational monitoring, impact-based forecasting and multi-platform dissemination of advisories, while conducting stakeholder training programmes, mock exercises and awareness campaigns to enhance disaster preparedness among coastal communities.

Dr. Singh further informed the House that Rs. 145.06 crore has been allocated under the Deep Ocean Mission during the current financial year for mapping marine resources. The programme includes expanded biodiversity surveys of seamounts within India's Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) and the deployment of advanced Autonomous Underwater Vehicles (AUVs) and Remotely Operated Vehicles (ROVs) to explore hydrothermal vents, mineral-rich zones and other marine resources.

He added that INCOIS provides coastal States, including Tamil Nadu, with Ocean State Forecast services offering up to 10-day forecasts for waves, winds, swells, currents and sea surface temperatures. The Centre also issues regular high-wave, swell surge and high-current advisories and has established tide gauge stations, Coastal Wave Rider Buoys and tsunami preparedness programmes in collaboration with state governments to strengthen coastal resilience.

Reiterating the Government's commitment to climate preparedness, Dr. Singh said continued investments in indigenous forecasting technologies, advanced ocean observation systems and scientific decision-support tools are helping improve the accuracy of climate and ocean predictions, enabling timely advisories for Governments, fishermen, coastal communities and other stakeholders. Now, therefore, the Lieutenant Governor (Administrator), Andaman and Nicobar Islands is please to notify the pattern of assistance and guidelines for implementation of the following programmes under Andaman and Nicobar Islands Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance (RAMP) Interventions for Tourism Sector approved vide OM No. L/AFI/RAMP/SIPEC/2022 dt. 26th May, 2026 in the 14th meeting of SIP Evaluation Committee (SIPEC) held on 04/05/2026 under the Chairmanship of AS & DC (MSME) subject to the terms and conditions specified herein.

1. Training, Certification and Exposure programme for Homestay Staff in Andaman & Nicobar Islands for Promotion of Quality and Sustainable Tourism.

2. Promotion of Astro-Tourism in Andaman & Nicobar Islands through MSME Support for Astro-Tourism Equipment Purchase.

1. Short Title :

This scheme shall be called the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Raising and Accelerating MSME Performance Tourism" Interventions, 2026-27.

2. Commencement and Duration :

The scheme programme will be implemented during 2026-27 and shall come into effect from 1st July 2026 and shall be in operation upto 31st March 2027 or till exhaustion of funds, whichever is earlier

3. Definitions :

I. **Astro Tourism** : - Astro-tourism is a unique travel experience that focuses on the night sky, offering opportunities for stargazing, celestial events, and visiting observatories, planetariums, and space research centres. It also connects astronomy with cultural heritage, folklore, and indigenous traditions, making the experience both scientific and cultural.

II. **Dobsonian Telescope** : A Dobsonian telescope is a large-aperture reflecting telescope mounted on a simple, easy-to-use base, commonly used for observing planets, the Moon, star clusters, nebulae, and galaxies.

III. **Greenfield Project** : A Greenfield Project refers to a new project where no previous industrial activity exists, and it is established from scratch on undeveloped land, without any need to demolish or rebuild existing structures.

IV. **Homestay** : A homestay is a form of private house located in the rural/urban area managed by the owner or where the house owner or his / her families are residing in the unit and earmarks 1-6 rooms exclusively for the use of tourists. Homestays provide an authentic experience of local traditions and lifestyles while offering hospitality services like accommodation and meals.

V. **Medium Enterprise**: Investment in Plant and Machinery or Equipment does not exceed INR 125 crore and turnover does not exceed INR 500 Crore as amended under MSMED Act, 2006.

VI. **Micro Enterprise**: Investment in Plant and Machinery or Equipment does not exceed INR 2.5 crore and turnover does not exceed INR 10 crore or as amended by GoI under the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006.

VII. **Service Sector**: The service sector, also known as the tertiary sector, is the third tier in the three-sector economy. Instead of the product production, this sector produces services. Examples of service sector jobs include IT, IT&S, Tourism & Hospitality Services, Transport, Logistics Services, Financial Services, Health Services, Audio Visual Services, Construction related Engineering Services and Environmental Services.

VIII. **Small Enterprise** : Investment in Plant and Machinery or Equipment does not exceed INR 25 crore and turnover does not exceed INR 100 crore or as amended by GoI under the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006.

Intervention 1: Training, Certification and Exposure Programme for Homestay Owners and Staff in Andaman & Nicobar Islands

1. Pattern of Assistance

I. Financial assistance shall be provided for conducting Training and Certification Programmes for Homestay Owners and Staff of registered MSME Homestays in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands covering hospitality operations, guest services, housekeeping, hygiene and sanitation, digital marketing, business management, sustainable tourism and related subjects.

II. Financial assistance shall be provided for organizing Exposure Visits to successful Homestay clusters and community-based tourism destinations in mainland India for selected Homestay Owners and Staff.

III. The expenditure under the intervention shall include costs towards training modules, resource persons, training materials, certification fees, venue expenses, logistics, accommodation, travel, local transportation, exposure visits and other incidental expenses approved by the Competent Authority.

IV. This intervention shall support a minimum of 50 MSME Homestay units.

2. Criteria for Selection of Beneficiaries

i. Homestays operating in Andaman and Nicobar Islands registered with the Department of Tourism, Andaman & Nicobar Administration or Ministry of Tourism.

ii. Homestays possessing valid Udyam Registration as an MSME.

iii. Homestays having completed a minimum of two years of continuous operation as on the date of application.

iv. Homestays operational and actively receiving guests during the operative period of the intervention.

v. Owners, Proprietors, Partners, Directors and staff associated with eligible Homestay units.

vi. Staff members having a minimum of two years of continuous engagement with the Homestay.

vii. Participants possessing minimum Class X qualification from a recognized Board or Institution.

viii. Preference shall be accorded to :

- Homestays operating in tourism-priority destinations;
- Women-owned Homestays;
- Homestays demonstrating consistent tourism operations and service standards; and
- Homestays located in remote and rural tourism destinations.

ix. Selection for Exposure Visits shall be based on successful completion of the Training and Certification Programme and demonstrated commitment towards adoption of quality and sustainable tourism practices.

x. Selection of beneficiaries shall be made by the UT RAMP Programme Committee (UTRPC) comprising :

i. Secretary (Tourism) – Chairman

ii. Director (Tourism) – Member

iii. Director (Industries) – Member

iv. Joint Director (Tourism) – Member Secretary

v. Sr. Accounts Officer (IP&T) – Member

The Terms of Reference of the Committee shall be :

a) Scrutiny of applications and selection of eligible beneficiaries.

b) Recommendation of participants for training, certification and exposure visits.

c) Monitoring implementation of the intervention and Grievance redressal.

d) Any other matter connected with implementation of the programme.

3. Conditions for Assistance

I. The Homestay shall possess valid registration with the Department of Tourism and valid Udyam Registration.

II. The Homestay shall be operational within the Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

III. Training programmes shall be conducted through recognized hospitality institutes, tourism training institutions, Government institutions or agencies approved by the Department of Tourism.

IV. Beneficiaries shall attend a minimum of 80% of the prescribed training programme for eligibility to receive certification.

V. Certification shall be issued only upon successful completion of the prescribed training programme.

VI. Beneficiaries selected for Exposure Visits shall submit a report on learnings and best practices adopted from the programme.

VII. Only one Beneficiary from one Homestay will be selected

VIII. Beneficiary Homestays shall actively participate in all training, certification and exposure activities organized under the intervention.

IX. Beneficiary Homestays shall cooperate with the Department of Tourism in monitoring, evaluation and impact assessment of the intervention.

X. Any false declaration, suppression of facts or submission of incorrect information shall result in cancellation of assistance and recovery of expenditure incurred by the Administration.

4. Procedure for Selection of Beneficiaries

i. Inviting applications through Press Release / Notification by the Department of Tourism.

ii. Submission of applications in the prescribed format alongwith supporting documents.

iii. Scrutiny of applications and selection of eligible Homestays and participants by the UT RAMP Programme Committee (UTRPC).

iv. Nomination of selected participants for Training and Certification Programmes.

v. Selection of eligible participants for Exposure Visits based on successful completion of training and certification requirements.

vi. Maintenance of attendance records, certification records and exposure visit reports for monitoring and evaluation purposes.

Intervention 2 : implementation of programme "Promotion of Astro-Tourism in Andaman & Nicobar Islands through MSME Support for Astro-Tourism Equipment Purchase"

1. Pattern of Assistance

I. Financial assistance shall be provided in the form of a Capital Subsidy for procurement of professional-grade astronomical telescopes example

- 12" Dobsonian Telescope
- 10" Dobsonian Telescope
- 6" Dobsonian Telescope (The subsidy shall be restricted to the above equipment or combinations thereof, subject to prescribed specifications or higher specifications).

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II. This intervention will support at least 30 MSMEs

2. Basis of Calculation of Subsidy

The Subsidy shall be calculated on the cost of eligible equipment (excluding GST) as specified under Clauses 3 and 7, including installation charges wherever applicable (limited to 10% of the equipment cost), and shall exclude expenditure towards land, building construction, personal or non-commercial purchases, imported equipment without valid legal documentation, working capital, and any services, including astro-tourism-related services.

3. Ceiling Limits

The scheme shall provide a maximum subsidy of ₹2,00,000 per MSME unit to 30 beneficiaries, with the number of beneficiaries liable to increase subject to actual claim amounts and availability of funds.

4. Criteria for selection of beneficiaries :

I. MSMEs registered under Udyam Registration Portal

II. Tourism-linked MSMEs, startups, tour operators, eco-tourism enterprises, homestays, hotels, resorts, and service providers intending to undertake astro-tourism activities.

III. Individual MSME proposing to offer Stargazing experiences, Astronomy interpretation sessions, Guided celestial observation programmes, Night-sky tourism activities and Astronomy-based educational tourism experiences.

IV. Units located and operating within the Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

V. The Applicant MSME should be the resident of Andaman & Nicobar Islands and should possess a domicile certificate, Local certificate or Islander Identity Card of Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

VI. The subsidy shall be admissible for procurement of only one professional grade telescope for each selected beneficiaries. In case applications received from an individual and his or her spouse only one eligible application will be considered.

VII. The subsidy shall not be admissible for expenditure incurred towards land acquisition, building construction, personal or non-commercial purchases, imported equipment lacking valid legal documentation, working capital requirements, or any services, including astro-tourism-related services .

VIII. The subsidy shall not be admissible for procurement of second-hand or refurbished equipment, observatory structures and domes, public viewing setups, support equipment for cameras such as mounts and filters, personal hobby purchases or astro-tourism support services.

IX. The applicant should not have availed assistance for similar purpose from any govt. schemes in the past five years.

X. The subsidy shall be provided as a one-time post-purchase capital subsidy towards procurement of approved professional-grade astronomical equipment suitable for commercial astro tourism operations.

XI. The subsidy shall be released to the beneficiary through e-Payment in his/her bank account under Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT). In the event of availing of loan for procurement of telescope, subsidy amount shall be routed through the Financing Bank.

XII. Equipment shall not be sold, leased, transferred, pledged, or diverted for non-tourism purposes during the lock-in period of 5 years.

XIII. The beneficiary shall furnish to the Director (Tourism), A & N Administration the information regarding operation and services for each financial year within 60 days of the close of the financial year. It shall also furnish information on such other matters that the U.T. Administration may require from time to time like Tourist footfall.

XIV. The selection of beneficiaries and recommendation of admissible subsidy as per the criterion for selection shall be done by the UT RAMP Programme Committee (UTRPC) comprising of the following members:

i. Secretary (Tourism) – Chairman

ii. Director (Tourism) – Member

iii. Director (Industries) – Member

iv. Joint Director (Tourism) – Member Secretary

v. Sr. Accounts Officer (IP&T) – Member

The terms of reference of the committee shall be : -

a. Scrutiny of All applications and selection of eligible beneficiaries as per selection criteria of the programme.

b. Recommendation of admissible subsidy as per guidelines of the programme

c. Monitoring implementation of the intervention.

d. Any other matter connected with the implementation of the programme.

XV. Applications will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis, subject to the availability of funds. While preference shall be accorded to ST/Women MSME, priority will 'be determined primarily by the order of receipt of complete applications with all required documents from eligible MSMEs.

5. Procedure for release of subsidy

i. Inviting applications through Press Release by Department of Tourism

ii. Submission of application in prescribed format along with DPR in Online / Offline.

iii. Scrutiny of applications and selection of beneficiaries by the UT RAMP Programme Committee (UTRPC) constituted for the purpose.

iv. The beneficiary is required to furnish the Geo-tagged photographs of the equipment and facility along with the following details for release of subsidy:

- Udyam Registration Certificate (Proof check: Copy of Udyam Registration)
- PAN & Aadhaar Number (Proof check: Copy of PAN & Aadhaar Card)
- Land/ Building ownership details (in Name of Applicant - Person / Enterprise)
- Bank account details (Proof check: Cancelled cheque)
- Purchase of Equipment (Proof check: Copy of Vendor invoice Authorized of Authorized equipment seller)
- Vendor receipt of Authorized equipment seller with Equipment Identification Number (EIN) (Proof check: Copy of Vendor invoice Authorized of Authorized equipment seller or any other document and physical verification at site)
- Installation certificate with Equipment Identification Number (EIN)
- (Proof check: Copy of Vendor invoice Authorized of Authorized equipment seller or any other document and physical verification at site)
- Geo-tagged photographs of the equipment and facility
- GST filings (if applicable)
- Self-Declaration for not being a Defaulting person/ enterprise
- Incomplete or erroneous applications will be summarily rejected.

v. On receipt of applications from the beneficiaries the final inspection and trial run of the facility shall be carried out by the assessment committee

- Director (Tourism) – Chairman
- Joint Director (Tourism) – Member
- Representative from Industries Department – Member
- Manager / Assistant Manager, Tourism Department – Member
- Sr. Investigator – Member Secretary

vi. The terms of reference of the committee shall be : -

a. Committee shall inspect the newly purchased and installed professional grade telescope

b. Submission of Final Inspection Report to the Director of Tourism.

c. The committee shall meet as and when required by the Department of Tourism. No TA / DA shall be paid by the Department.

d. Any other remarks by the committee on the procurement of professional grade telescope.

6. Recall of Subsidy

The subsidy amount shall be liable for recovery, along with compound interest at the rate of 8% per annum and any applicable penalties, if at any stage it is found that the beneficiary has obtained assistance through false, incorrect, or misleading information, or has sold, transferred, disposed of, diverted, or misutilized the subsidized equipment during the prescribed lock-in period of five years, rendered the unit non-operational without valid justification, used the equipment for non-approved purposes, or violated any provision of the scheme; in such cases, the beneficiary shall also be liable for legal action, permanent debarment from availing any future incentives or assistance from the U.T. Administration.

7. Power of Interpretations

The Andaman & Nicobar Administration reserves the right to modify these guidelines, reject or cancel any application without assigning any reason, and reallocate funds among approved interventions or beneficiaries based on performance, fund utilization, and administrative considerations.

8. Arbitration

In the event of any ambiguity, dispute, or discrepancy in the implementation of the scheme or beneficiary selection, the decision of the UT RAMP Programme Committee (UTRPC) shall be final, subject to the overarching policy directives, clarifications, and grievance frameworks issued by the Ministry of MSME, Government of India for the RAMP scheme." or by the SRPC (State RAMP Programme Committee) or as decided by the competent authority.

9. Saving :The Lieutenant Governor, A & N Islands reserves the right to revise / change / cancel / suspend / amendment / relax of any clauses mentioned in this Guidelines.
