LG orders CS/Secretaries to tour N&M Andaman; attend development works/redress public grievances

Port Blair, Oct 6

In response to the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi's call to provide effective governance at the grass root level and provide a responsive and people friendly administration, the Lt Governor, Lt Gen A K Singh (Retd), has ordered the Chief Secretary, along with a team of key Secretaries/Directors and other officials to undertake a tour of North & Middle Andaman District over a period three days from 12 to 14 October 2015. They will review the progress of development works and redressal of public grievances, at DIGLIPUR, MAYABUNDER and RANGAT. They will also undertake inspection of major projects, review progress of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and also hold extensive consultations with the PRIs at the three places. The team will first visit DIGLIPUR on 12th October, MAYABUNDER on 13th October and RANGAT on 14th October 2015.

Secretaries and HoDs of major Departments have been instructed to gear up for this. All field officers of the concerned Departments shall be present to assist the Chief Secretary. Efforts shall be made to settle maximum local issues on the spot while major issues which may require further examination shall be referred to Port Blair. The Deputy Commissioner (N&M Andaman) shall be the nodal officer and a mini Secretariat shall operate at Mayabunder (DC's Office) with linkages to the office of Assistant Commissioners at Rangat and Diglipur. Shri N K Sharma, Secretary (Home, Civil Aviation, RD/PRIs) shall be the nodal Secretary and coordinate this programme. A similar programme will be undertaken at Nicobar District in late October 2015/November 2015.

The newly elected members of the Port Blair Municipal Council (PBMC), led by Smt Sheela Singh, Chairperson PBMC, called on the Lt Governor, Lt Gen A K Singh (Retd), at Raj Niwas today. The Lt Governor congratulated each member of the Council and told them that they had dual role to play in the affairs of the Council. Firstly, a collective responsibility as a

Councillor for the overall development of the city and to the citizens of Port Blair. Secondly, their individual role as representatives of their wards. He urged all members to honour the mandate of people, who voted them to the Council, by working honestly and sincerely to address their legitimate grievances. He also urged them to be honest and forthright in their work so that there is transparency in their



public dealings.

During the meeting, he requested the Chairperson to take stock of the Municipal finances and work out ways and means to augment Municipal revenues so that they are financially better equipped to undertake developmental activities. Besides, he also requested them to work on rationalization of taxes and levies. Special attention needs

to be paid to the six newly formed wards.

The Lt Governor gave a strong message to the new Council that fresh encroachments will not be tolerated and each member should take upon themselves the responsibility to ensure that fresh encroachments do not occur in their respective wards. He also stressed on the crucial role of the Council for making Port Blair a 'Smart City' since

PBMC will be the implementing agency of the smart city project.

Finally, he suggested that a mechanism be put in place where PBMC and the Administration work together for the benefit of the people of the city. For this, he suggested a quarterly review meeting of the Council with the Chief Secretary and, separately, a meeting with the Lt Governor once in six months.

All schools to be mandatorily covered under U-DISE for preparing sound data base

Port Blair, Oct. 6

The District Information System for Education (DISE) is operational in Andaman & Nicobar Islands since 2006-07. This year the data is collected as Unified-District information System for Education (U-DISE) from all Government, private-Aided, Private Un-Aided, Local body, JNVs, Central Govt. School or of any management dealing with school education, with the main objective of preparing a sound database as

it serves as a powerful tool for effective planning of the system of Elementary as well as Secondary Education. In the absence of reliable data, the projection for creation of new education facilities and infrastructural support becomes fraught with undesirable consequences and thereby may result in defective planning.

In view of developing a unified data base of schools from the academic year 2015-16, under U-DISE, data is

being collected from all the schools (having classes from Pre-primary to class-XII) irrespective of type or management. To assess various parameters pertaining to school education in the UT, it is mandatory to cover all the schools under U-DISE. It is also to be ensured that all the schools functional in A&N Islands are covered under U-DISE 2015-16.

Accordingly, any school functional in these Islands but not included in the previous

year i.e. 2014-15 U-DISE data, has been urged to approach to the State Project Office, SSA, Shiksha Sadan, Link Road, Port Blair- 744101 (Ph. No. 237180) with detailed information of their institution.

It is enjoined upon all the school operational in A&N Islands to extend necessary cooperation to the cluster Resource Centers (CRCs) and Block Resource Centers

A&N Islands Scheme for Health Insurance

Six hospitals at Chennai & Kolkata empanelled; DHS to include more multi-specialty hospitals

Port Blair, Oct. 6

The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands had officially announced the Health Scheme namely Andaman & Nicobar Islands Scheme for Health Insurance (ANISHI) on Jan 26, 2015 to provide better treatment for the needy Islanders.

The Health Insurance Scheme provides coverage to those people belonging to BPL category of A&N Islands, pensioner settled in A&N Islands after retirement and their dependent family

members & permanent residents with family income of less than Rs. 3 lakhs per annum.

As per the referral system as specified under the scheme, the patient is to be referred by concerned specialist, thereafter they report with referral slip to the Nodal Cell (ANISHI), Directorate of Health Services alongwith islanders ID/voter card, annual income certificate, ration card and pension payment order as the case may be.

So far, six hospitals have been

empanelled at Chennai & Kolkata under the ANISHI Scheme, namely Medica Super Specialty Hospital, Kolkata- (Multi Specialty Hospital), Peerless Hospitex Hospital and Research Centre Ltd, Kolkata-4 (Multi Specialty Hospital), JIPMER, Pondicherry- (Multispecialty

Hospital), Dr. Agarwal's Eye Hospital Ltd, Chennai- Single Specialty (eye care), MIOT Chennai (Multi Specialty Hospital), Basavatarakan Indo-American, Cancer Hospital & Research Institute, Hyderabad-Single Specialty Hospital (Specially in Cancer Hospital) (Contd. on last page)

Nicobar, had gone for fishing by Hodi, off the coast of Tapoiming Village in the morning hours. One of them informed to the First Captain, at 1.30 am, over mobile phone, that their Hodi has been damaged due to strong wind and waves and has overturned in the sea.

Srinivasan debarred from all board meetings: BCCI

New Delhi, Oct 6
The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) under new president Shashank Manohar on Monday hardened its stand on N Srinivasan, informing the Supreme Court that it has debarred the ex-president from attending any meeting of the cricket board because of his 'conflict of interest'. BCCI's counsel KK Venugopal told a bench of Justices TS Thakur and FMI Kalifulla, "Srinivasan stands disqualified from participating in the working committee meetings or any other meeting of the board as he still has commercial interest in the management of IPL T20 team Chennai Super Kings."

Referring to the SC judgment of January 22, in which Srinivasan was disqualified from contesting the board elections because of a conflict of interest, Venugopal said the claimed transfer of his

Veteran Pakistan all-rounder and former captain Shoaib Malik made a comeback to the national Test squad today after a gap of five years. The Pakistan Cricket Board announced that Malik had been inducted into the Test squad for the series against England as the 16th player. He was not named in the squad of 15 announced last month and he last played a Test in England in August 2010.

Extreme poverty to fall below 10% for first time: World Bank

Washington, Oct 6
A World Bank report said that extreme poverty will this year fall to less than 10 per cent of the global population for the first time, although there is still great concern for millions in Africa. World Bank President Jim Yong Kim said in Washington that these projections show that we are the first generation in human history that can end extreme poverty. According to World Bank projections, about 702 million people, or 9.6 per cent of the world population, will live below the poverty line this year, mostly in Sub-Saharan Africa and Asia. In 2012, that number stood at 902 million, or about 13 per cent of the world population. It stood at 29 per cent in 1999.

According to Kim, the continuing decline in extreme poverty is the result of dynamic economic growth in developing nations and investment in health and education, as well as social safety nets that prevented
