LG visits Pearl Culture Laboratory at North Bay Lauds Dr. Sonkar's achievements & techniques in culturing pearl

'Black Pearl' produced in A&N Islands to be highlighted during IITF

Port Blair, Nov 5

The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, accompanied by the First Lady, A&N Islands, Smti. Prem Mukhi visited the Pearl Culture Laboratory situated at North Bay here this morning.

During the visit to this lab, the Chairman, Pearl Aquaculture Research Foundation, Dr. Ajai Kumar Sonkar briefed the Lt. Governor about pearl culture here in A&N Islands. Through a video presentation, he explained about the process of pearl culture right from rearing of the oysters to pre operative condition, implantation process, extraction of pearl through safe surgical procedure and its regeneration.

He explained about the difference between pearl culture in fresh water and marine water and also about his breakthrough experiment in 'Black Pearl' produced from Black Lipped Oyster, which is found only in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. These oysters have great potential to produce the most valuable black pearls and golden pearls. The Lt. Governor witnessed the live demonstration of pearl forming in oyster and its extraction besides the drilling process and its end product.

The Lt. Governor and the First Lady evinced keen interest in the technology adopted by Dr. Sonkar in pearl culture and oyster



rearing; and congratulated the pearl scientist for his innovative techniques in pearl culture and wished that he continues his research in this field further. He remarked that Dr. Sonkar, through his specialization and dedicated efforts in the field of pearl culture has indeed made the country and these Isles very proud. The Lt. Governor also stated that the A&N Administration shall highlight such achievement during the upcoming IITF 2016 to be held at Pragati Maidan in New Delhi from November 14, 2016 onwards. Accordingly, the Industries Department would facilitate the display, sale and demonstration of Black Pearl Production from A&N Islands at the Andaman & Nicobar Pavilion during IITF. The Lt. Governor also interacted with some of the young tourists at North Bay and enquired about their visit to the Islands. The Secretary Industries, Smti Rashmi Singh, Assistant Director, Industries, Shri Ajit Anand were also present during this visit.

is free of cost. The furnishing of information has become necessary for every MSMEs in order to avail the benefits of Govt. facilities and incentives offered by them.

DG units damaged in fire accident; rotational load shedding to meet shortage of power

Port Blair, Nov. 5

A fire accident occurred in DG Unit No. 3 of 20 MW IPP, Bambooflat today causing damage to the Unit to a great extent besides damaging the two other adjacent units i.e. DG Unit No. 2 & 4 partially. Due to this fire incident no power from Suryachakra Power Plant will be available for a day resulting a shortfall of about 12 MW during evening peak hours and 07-08 MW during off peak hours. The shortage of power will be made up by exercising rotational load

shedding of 1½ hrs round the clock in Port Blair and South Andaman area.

In a press release received here today, the Executive Engineer (HQ) of Electricity Department has informed that in the meantime, the Engineers and Technicians of Suryachakra Power Plant are working on war footing basis and trying hard to bring back DG Set No.2 & 4 in operation as early as possible. The repair of DG Unit No.3 will take a long time as the extent of damage in this unit is more.

India vs England: James Anderson recovers from injury, will join squad soon

Mumbai, Nov 5 England received a major boost on Saturday as captain Alastair Cook declared that top bowler James Anderson had recovered from injury and was set to join the squad in India. The first Test of the five-match series starts in Rajkot, in western Gujarat state, on Wednesday as India seek revenge for a home series loss to England four years ago.

He's ready to come so it's just about trying to get him out to Rajkot as quick as we can," Cook, 31, told reporters in Mumbai. Anderson suffered a fractured shoulder blade last summer and had been dogged by a recurrence of the injury but passed fitness tests back home on Friday while the rest of the England squad were already training in India.

The powerful Anderson will miss the opening Test but could be ready to lead England's attack for the second match, which starts in Andhra Pradesh, on 17 November, said Cook. Anderson suffered a fractured shoulder blade last summer and had been dogged by a recurrence of the injury but passed fitness tests back home on Friday while the rest of the England squad were already training in India.
