## Country's food consumption likely to go up to one trillion dollars by 2025 : President

New Delhi, Nov 5  
President Shri Ram Nath Kovind has said India's food value chain offers huge opportunities for both domestic and foreign investors. Addressing the valedictory session of World Food India event in New Delhi today, Shri Kovind said, country's food consumption is likely to go up from 370 Billion dollars at present to one trillion dollars by 2025. He said, there are huge opportunities in areas such as post-harvest facilities, logistics, cold chains and



manufacturing. President said this sector has a huge business appetite with large potential to generate employment for both women and the large

young population of the country. Expressing concern on food wastage, Shri Kovind said, focus on food processing will not only

reduce the unacceptable level of food wastage but also help doubling farmers' income. He also said, both investment, as well as technological solutions,

are required to reduce food wastage. Speaking on the occasion, Minister of Food Processing Industries Smti Harsimrat Kaur Badal said 50 MoUs worth 11.25 billion dollar were signed during the three day event. She said India will become global food factory when it controls food wastage and increases the yield. She said, zero tolerance to food wastage is a must in the country. 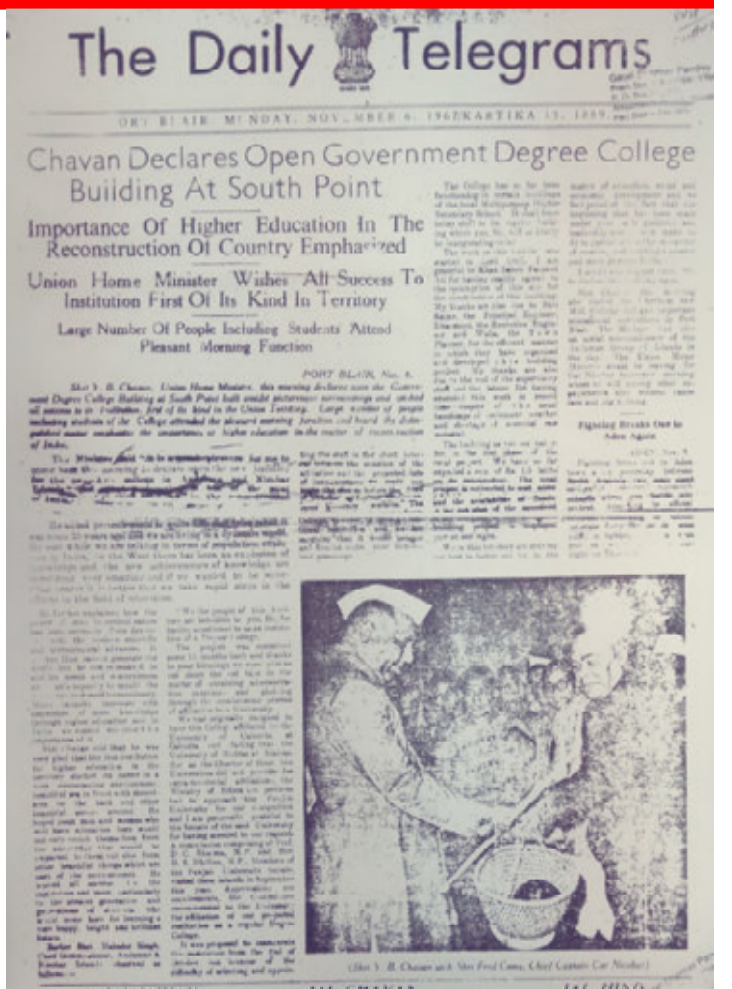

India beat China to win women's hockey Asia Cup



Kakamighara, Nov 5  
India won their biggest title in recent years as they completed a historic win over China in the women's Hockey Asia Cup on Sunday. This was India's second Asia Cup title win after they had beaten Japan in 2004 in New Delhi. Playing the final for the first time since 2009, India managed to hold off China 5-4 in shootout in the final in Kakamighara, Japan. India had defeated defending champions Japan 4-2 in the

semi-final to make the final. The team had also beaten China 4-1 in the group stages. Navjot Kaur gave India the lead in the second quarter through a field goal in the 25th minute before Tiantain Luo equalised in the 47th minute. The match went to shootouts where India scored every goal while China missed one. The score was 1-1 after regular time and 5-4 in the shootout. Exactly an year ago, India had beaten China in the final of Asia

Champions Trophy. India won all their matches in the group stages as they beat Malaysia, Singapore and China. They remained unbeaten in the tournament. The women's team got a new coach six months back and Harendra Singh has breathed new life to the team. India had already qualified for the 2018 Women's World Cup at the start of the tournament and this win will be a great addition to India's CV.

Satbir, Manorama win in Elite category at Cyclothon

Satbir Singh and T Manorama Devi emerged victorious in the Elite Men's and Elite Women's events of the National cycling championship at the Jawaharal Nehru Stadium here today. Rounding out the elite men's podium were Arvind Panwar from RSPB and SSCB's Krishna Naikodi, while Manipur's Sonali Chanu and Kerala's Amritha Ragnathan finished with silver and bronze respectively in the women's elite race. "I would like to congratulate all the medalists at the National Cycling Championship. The 2017 edition had a strong field of the best 180 elite cyclists in the country," said Onkar Singh, Secretary General, Cycling

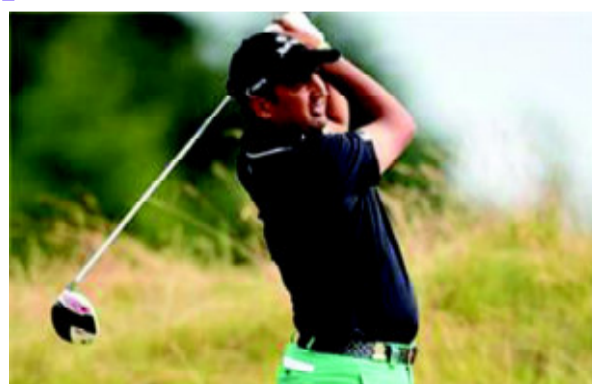

It is second Asian Tour title of the season for Kapur, who fired five birdies against one bogey to stay three strokes clear off a pack of fellow Indians, including Ajeetesh Sandhu (65), Sudhir Sharma (69) and Chirag Kumar (64). Kapur had won the Yeangder Heritage in April and finished second at the Thailand Open this season. He had won his first Asian tour title in 2005 at the Volvo Masters of Asia.

China, Nov 5  
German Julia Goerges tamed American CoCo Vandeweghe 7-5, 6-1 in the final of the WTA Elite Trophy to claim the biggest title of her career on Sunday.

Second seed Vandeweghe got an early break and breezed to a 5-2 lead in the opening set before the German staged a brilliant comeback. The seventh seed, who won the Kremlin Cup in Moscow a fortnight back, broke back while the American was serving for the opening set and went on to win it 7-5.

Vishnu Vardhan, N Sriram Balaji win Shenzhen Challenger title

New Delhi, Nov 5  
Vishnu Vardhan and N Sriram Balaji won their third Challenger title of the 2017 season together when they downed Austin Krajicek and Jackson Withrow in the final of the Shenzhen event in China. The giant-killing Indians upset the fourth-seeded Americans 7-6(3), 7-6(3) in a tight summit clash of the USD 75,000 event. They earned 90 ranking points each and split USD 4650 as prize money. Before this event, Vardhan



and Balaji had triumphed at Chengdu and Fergana as well. Vardhan had also won a title with Toshihide Matsui in Astana. Vardhan, who is ranked 134

in doubles, is likely to achieve his career-best ranking when the new list will be issued on Monday. His previous career-best rank was 123, achieved in August this year.

Sarita, Sonia enter semis of Asian boxing meet

Vietnam, Nov 5  
The seasoned L Sarita Devi (64kg) along with two other pugilists advanced to the semifinals and assured themselves of medals as India enjoyed another fruitful day at the Asian Women's Boxing Championships.

Apart from Sarita, world championships silver-medallist Sonia Lather (57kg) and Lovlina Borgohain (69kg) also entered the semifinals. Sarita, a former world champion eyeing her sixth medal at the Asian meet, defeated Maftunakhon Melieva of Uzbekistan, while Sonia edged past Kazakhstan's Nazym Ichshanova in the quarterfinals. Borgohain defeated Erdenetuya Enkhbaatar of Mongolia by a unanimous decision. Sarita, who returned to the



amateur fold after trying her luck in the professional circuit earlier this year, took full advantage of her opponent's reluctance to attack and connected some lusty right hooks to take the upperhand early in the bout. At the very beginning of the second round, Melieva faced a standing eight count after a flurry of combination punches from the Indian left her dazed. Melieva gave a better account of herself in the final three minutes but Sarita was up for the challenge and displayed some fine ringcraft to dodge the

attacks. Sonia, on the other hand, had to stave off a stiff challenge from Kazakhstan's Nazym Ichshanova in a split verdict to enter the last-four stage, assuring herself of her second medal at the event. She is a former silver-medallist at the continental meet. A very aggressive Sonia had Ichshanova on the backfoot early on, the sheer ferocity of her punches standing out. Although Ichshanova tried her best to match the power, the Indian did just about enough to get a split verdict in her favour.
