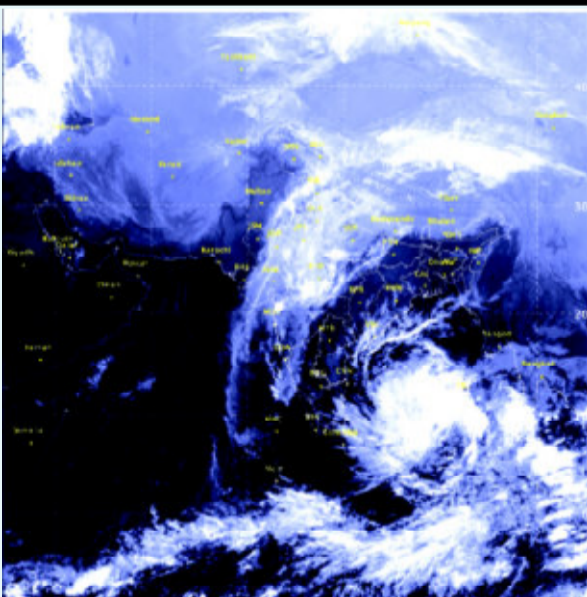

Rates for all advertisements released by A&N Administration revised

Port Blair, Dec 05

The Andaman and Nicobar Administration has revised the rates for all advertisements. As per the new Notification, the classification of media done by DAVP will be followed by A&N Administration, for all purposes of Advertisement while publishing the same outside the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. For the Advertisement in the A&N

Islands, classification will be done based on the same parameters like circulation, but values applicable for their activities inside the A&N Islands will be considered. The rate structure notified by the Directorate of Advertising and Visual Publicity from time to time will be 'Base Rate' of the rate structure for the Andaman and Nicobar

Administration. Similarly, for any media doing publicity in Andaman, an additional incentive of 40% will be provided over 'Base Rate' and for publicity done outside Andaman and Nicobar Islands, maximum of 'Base Rate' only will be provided. It will be notified by the Administration annually and all notified rates to be in integer after rounding off the value (Contd. on last page)

Delhi test: India in commanding position as SL totter at 31/3

New Delhi, Dec 5
India hurtled towards their ninth successive series victory as they left Sri Lanka precariously placed at 31 for three and staring at another humiliation in the third and final Test here on Tuesday. The visiting Lankans were set an improbable victory target of 410 to level the three-match series. It will be a miracle if Sri Lanka manage to make it. The 16 overs that they batted during the final 85 minutes of the fourth day's play was with an aim to survive rather than play positive cricket. If the scoreboard is anything to go by, the play boomeranged on the visitors, who were again seen wearing anti-pollution masks, the second time in the game. The pitch has not deteriorated much but it is the straighter deliveries from the spinners that is causing maximum damage.



Mohammed Shami (1/8 in 3 overs), who was unwell after a three-over burst, bowled a hostile spell and accounted for Sadeera Samarawickrama (5). A barrage of short deliveries unnerved the opener, who was hit on the temple while fielding in India's first innings. Shami played on his psyche with well-disguised bouncers into his

New Delhi, Dec 5
India pacer Jasprit Bumrah has received his maiden Test call-up, while Parthiv Patel has been selected as the back-up wicketkeeper for the three-match Test series in South Africa. The MSK Prasad-led selection panel has persisted with the Test regulars for the 17-member squad, which includes seven batsmen, two wicketkeepers, along with the all-round option of Hardik Pandya. The right-arm pacer comes into the side on the back of some impressive showing in limited-overs cricket for India. He has impressed in the longer format at the domestic level too, having picked 89 wickets in 26 first-class games. "If you see Bumrah's performance in the last 18 months, it's been wonderful. He's been sensational, bowling outstandingly well in both one-

days and T20s. Considering his performance in Ranji Trophy last season, he bowled brilliantly that whole season. It's a unanimous choice, there were no doubts in picking Bumrah because he definitely adds variety to our pace attack. And considering the nature of wickets there (in South Africa), it will definitely suit his bowling," chairman of the selection committee, MSK Prasad said at a press conference in New Delhi.
