Fodder scam: CBI Court sentences Lalu Prasad Yadav to 3.5 years in prison

New Delhi, Jan 6
RJD Chief Shri Lalu Prasad was today sentenced to three-and-a-half years in jail by a CBI special court in a fodder scam case relating to fraudulent withdrawal of money from the Deoghar Treasury 21 years ago. CBI Court Judge Shiv Pal Singh, who had convicted Prasad, along with 10 others on December 23, also imposed a fine of 10 lakh rupees on him for two cases in the scam. A CBI counsel said that he was fined 5 lakh rupees for each case, failing which he would serve another six months in jail. The court had convicted Prasad for offences of cheating, along with criminal conspiracy, under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and the Prevention of Corruption Act. In the case 15 other convicts have also been sentenced by the Judge Shivpal Singh. Jagdish Sharma, Gopinath Das, Sanjay Agarwal, Sunil

CBSE has always strived to ensure that the conduct of Board Examinations and declaration of results should enjoy the complete confidence and trust of the public at large. Therefore, it is important to address some of the critical issues that have a bearing on the process of evaluation. The Board has relied on the schools to depute and relieve regular and experienced teachers for evaluation work. However, it has been observed in the past that the schools are not cooperating with the Board in nominating/deputing and relieving their regular and experienced teachers for Board's Evaluation Process for full duration. The directions of the Board in this regard are not being followed by the school in letter and spirit. In this regard, attention is invited to Rule 13 sub clause 4 of Affiliation Bye-Laws of the Board which stipulates that "the building and

India vs South Africa first test

India mopped up for 209, South Africa 65-2 at stumps

Cape Town, Jan 6

South Africa reached 65 for two in their second innings at stumps after dismissing India for 209 on the second day of the opening cricket Test in Cape Town on Saturday.

Hardik Pandya scored a strokeful 95-ball 93-run innings and added 99 runs alongwith Bhuvneshwar Kumar (25) for the eighth wicket to help India manage to score 209 in reply to South Africa's first innings total of 286.

At the draw of stumps, Hashim Amla (4) was at the crease and giving him company was Kagiso Rabada (2) with the hosts leading by 142 runs.

New Zealand vs Pakistan, 1st ODI: Black Caps beat Champions Trophy winners by 61 runs

Wellington, Jan 6

New Zealand ended Pakistan's run of nine consecutive wins in one-day internationals when they beat the Champions Trophy holders by 61 runs under the Duckworth-Lewis system on Saturday to open the five-match series.

Captain Kane Williamson made 115 to lead New Zealand to 315-7 as they batted first after losing the toss. Pakistan were 166-6 after 30.1 overs when rain brought the match to an early end.

Opener Fakhar Zaman was 82 not out and Faheem Ashraf 17 was not out but Pakistan were well short of the 227 runs it needed to win the match under the Duckworth-Lewis system when rain finally set in. New Zealand swing bowler Tim Southee captured two



wickets in the first over of the Pakistan innings to place the tourists under immediate pressure in reply.

Southee trapped both Azhar Ali (6) and Babar Azam (0) lbw within his opening over, then took a catch from Trent Boult's bowling to dismiss Mohammad Hafeez (1) to leave Pakistan's innings in disarray at 13-3. Fakhar batted superbly to recover the innings, reaching his half-century from 63 balls

and putting on 78 for the sixth wicket with Shadab Khan. But Pakistan never approached the run-rate they needed to win the match whether or not rain intervened.

New Zealand were on top from the start as Williamson, currently the No. 4-ranked batsman in ODI cricket, reached his 10th ODI century from 106 balls to lead his team to a record total at the Basin Reserve.

Brisbane International: Elina Svitolina breezes past Aliaksandra Sasnovich to lift title

Brisbane, Jan 6

Ukraine's Elina Svitolina laid down her marker as a serious contender for the Australian Open when she demolished Belarusian qualifier Aliaksandra Sasnovich 6-2, 6-1 in the Brisbane International final on Saturday.

Svitolina won five titles on the WTA tour last year, more than any other woman.

She ended the year ranked sixth in the world, but will climb two places when the new rankings are released on Monday and will go into the year's first Grand Slam as the fourth seed.

The 23-year-old had a tough path to the decider, having to overcome two top-10



players, Johanna Konta and Karolina Pliskova, along the way.

She was far too strong for Sasnovich, who struggled to cope both with the Ukrainian's serve and her relentless barrage of groundstrokes from the back of the court.

Sasnovich was playing in her first final on the WTA tour and her nerves showed in the early stages as Svitolina broke her early

and raced away to a 3-1 lead.

The Belarusian steadied the ship but she was always under pressure and serving at 2-5, she cracked. Svitolina pounced, breaking her again and wrapping up the set in 31 minutes.

Sasnovich was also playing her eighth match in nine days and her movement around the court appeared slightly slower than in her previous outings.

furniture of affiliated Institutions shall be placed at the disposal of the Board for conducting any examination and spot evaluation free of charge. The Management and the Principal shall cooperate with the Board in the conduct of examinations and evaluation of scripts. If asked by the Board, the school shall provide at least one examiner in each subject offered by the school and more than one, if more than 200 students have been sent for the examination. In case they fail to do so, the Board shall have the right to take appropriate action including initiating action for disaffiliation of the school".

Further, Rule 17.2(a) (xi) of Affiliation Bye-Laws also states that the affiliation of the school may be withdrawn by the Board, in case of any misconduct in connection with the admissions/examinations/any other area.

Therefore, schools affiliated with CBSE are directed to, ensure that all teachers, teaching classes IX to XII, for all subjects, register themselves, on the examination portal and fill the teachers database; relieve all those-teachers for evaluation of answer script who are identified by CBSE for this purpose; ensure that all teachers identified as evaluators of answer script are given no other teaching or school related work during the evaluation days so that they can focus completely on evaluation, thereby raising quality of evaluation; ensure that all teachers undergo requisite training for pre-evaluation mandated by CBSE; it will be the Board's prerogative to identify/select CNS/Head Examiners and Examiners from amongst the data received by the Board.

Non-compliance of the above directions will be seen as a misconduct in connection with examinations and the Board will be compelled to take strong action including penalty and/or further action of disaffiliation under Rule 17.2 (a)(xi) of Affiliation Bye-Laws, a circular said.

Gandhi, Jyoti Jha Tripurari, Tripurari Mohan Prasad and Krishna Kumar Prasad were sentenced 7 year jail. Other convicts Phool Chand, Mahesh Prasad, Bake Julious, Sunil Kumar, Sushil Kumar, Sudhir Kumar, R K Rana, Subir Bhattacharya and Raja Ram were also sentenced to 3.5 years in jail and a fine of Rs 5 lakh each was imposed.

The scam is related to withdrawal of 89 lakh 27 thousand rupees from the Deogarh Treasury between 1990 and 1994 when Prasad was the chief minister of Bihar.

The 69-year-old RJD supremo, in a written plea yesterday, had sought leniency from the CBI court citing illness and old age, according to his counsel Chittaranjan Prasad.

The RJD went into a huddle immediately after the pronouncement of the sentence. RJD sources said that the party would appeal against the verdict.

This is the second fodder scam case in which Prasad has been jailed. He was sent to prison for five years on 30th September 2013.
